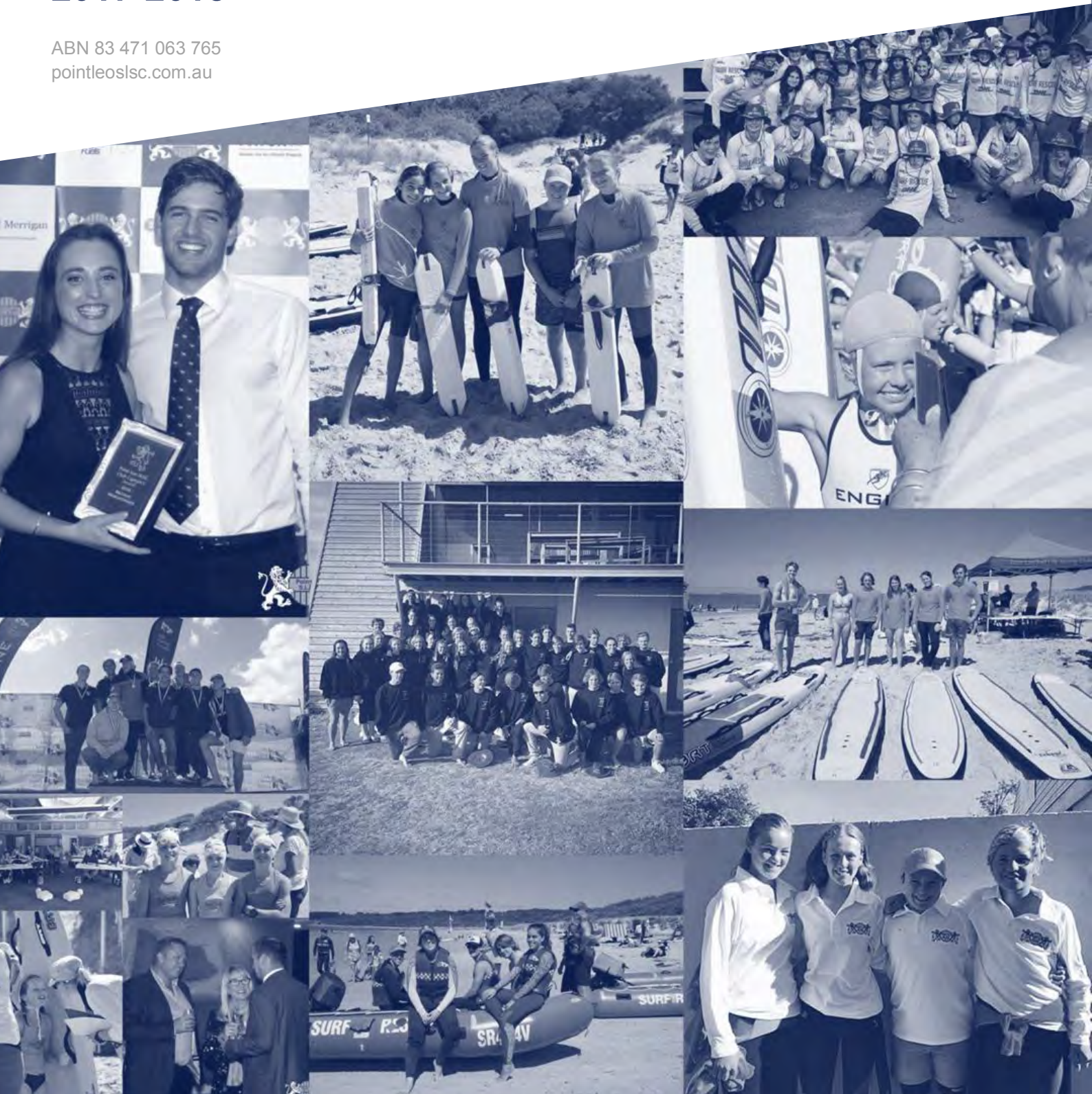

President's Report

I remember this time last year reflecting with awe on the many and varied contributions made to the Club throughout the season. Again in 2017/2018 we have seen so many of our wonderful members contributing their time and skills across all facets of the Club. These efforts resulted in amazing achievements that were deservedly well celebrated at the Club Presentation Night in May.

It has also been an exciting year for some new major initiatives. In particular, we were privileged to have the team from LifeChanger, including the inspirational Trevor Hendy and Scott Watters, visit the Club and impart some of their wisdom and life lessons to some of the Club's young people. The end of season has seen the new beach boardwalk completed and, most excitingly, the redevelopment of the Clubhouse is underway – more details on that later. First some other highlights and much deserved thanks.

Presentation Night recognitions

As I mentioned at the Presentation Night, thanks to all our dedicated patrolling members, we have this year been recognised by Lifesaving Victoria as being in the top 5 clubs in the state for patrol numbers. Particular thanks to the Patrol Captains and Vice Captains, not to mention the contributions from the recently formed WoodChucks Patrol led by Nick Woods and Chuck Warner with their rare combination of surf skills and humour!

Congratulations to Adam Lipszyc and Andy Nott who, in their first year as Club Captain and Vice-Captain respectively, have done a fantastic job in coordinating patrols and a range of other Club activities. The Presentation Night, organised largely by Adam and Andy ably assisted by Sam Richardson and Rhys Cole, was a fantastic night, slightly more stylish than previous years and a fun and well attended occasion at Club sponsor - the Flinders Hotel. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive and the bar has been set high for next year's event.

Congratulations and sincere thanks were afforded to Brittany Morgenthaler and all members involved in undertaking what must be a record number of training and skills maintenance activities this season. The skills gained by our members are vital to provide us with the ability to safely patrol Point Leo beach and are also of great potential benefit away from the beach. Examples of utilising lifesaving skills were highlighted on the night when Michael Treadwell, Luke Treadwell, and Andy Nott were awarded Outstanding Achievement awards for rescues of three people in two separate incidents. There can be no greater testament to the value of our Club than the rescue of five people from harm, and the saving of a life as was the case in these two major rescues.

Nippers Program

A huge well done to all involved in participating in and facilitating our Nippers program – it is a wonderful thing to see over 450 young people gain skills, build confidence and make friends over the summer months. It's also fantastic to see some of these young people take these skills through to further fun and fitness as part of the competition program. The Nippers program can only run with the active participation of all families - so thank you to you all. Richard Hoskins has continued to provide great leadership as Nippers Co-ordinator this season and I endorse his comments in his report with particular thanks to Sarah-Jo Mason who ran the program in Richard's absence part way through the season. Thanks also to uber-contributors Nick Clarke, Jason Romari, Justin Wheelahan, Chuck Warner and Jessica Lightfoot who collectively have headed coaching, competition management, BBQ, IRB duties and Club merchandise sales. To all the Age Managers, Assistant Age Managers and Activity Leaders, please know that your efforts are greatly valued by the Club and by our nippers.

Surf Sports, Victorian Surf Sports Academy and LifeChanger

It has been great to see so many members participating in training and competition for surf sports with many excellent results seeing the team go from strength to strength. Iris Cassell has again done a wonderful job in managing the Competition Team and keeping everyone on track in what must be one of the most challenging and complex sports to administer.

Jon Ford provides inspirational dedication and leadership as Head Coach and was this year awarded the President's Award in recognition of this and the many other things that Jon contributes to, including organising and performing at the ever sensational Muso Night and also providing valuable Building Sub-Committee input. This year has seen Jon also lead the way with two initiatives that extend the Club's reach. Firstly, he initiated the VSSA (Victorian Surf Sports Academy), a venture aimed at bringing together competitors across all Victorian clubs to provide an inclusive training platform with access to top coaches in a non-partisan environment. Also, Jon has led a team in initiating a relationship with the LifeChanger organisation whose vision is to: *Awaken the hero that lives within all Australian Youth*. This has seen Point Leo join with Mornington LSC in a pilot program in Victoria. I have been very impressed and inspired by the positive feedback. I applaud both of these initiatives and congratulate Jon on his leadership and drive. We all look forward to the positive outcomes they can generate for the benefit of our Club members and the broader community.

Our new boardwalk

As I mentioned above, and as many of you may have already seen, we now have a beach access boardwalk. This was a community project led by Disabled Surfing Australia with financial support from the Club and the Point Leo Foreshore. This will be a great asset for the whole community and will also provide the Club with an elevated location for beach observation.

Upgraded Club facilities – some generous donations

In 2016, at the celebration of the 60th anniversary of the Club, then President Tamara Brawn announced the launch of the Future Project – established to investigate the best way for the Club facilities to be redeveloped to cater for members for the next 20+ years. It is so exciting to see the first phase of building renovation works underway and it will be fantastic to have brand new change rooms and amenities directly accessible from outside, and a new and improved kitchen too. Luke Treadwell has been leading the project for the Club and has done an amazing job working with our builders, the Lloyd Group. Huge thanks must also go to the Balnarring and District Community Bank Branch of the Bendigo Bank who have agreed to fund the new kitchen with a generous \$47,000 donation.

Thanks so much to those Club members who have generously made cash donations to the Future Project. This has made it possible for the first phase to meet our aspirations. The redevelopment is an expensive project and we now need to look seriously to renewed fundraising endeavours in order to afford to complete the redevelopment. The Committee is giving consideration to how we can appropriately acknowledge all donations.

The ultimate vision for the Clubhouse will see it become a space that can cater for our membership of over 1,000 people, including the training, accommodation, storage and social spaces that we need now, as well as provide opportunities for broader community use which will see the building play a role as a community hub for Point Leo and the region.

Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 30 April 2018

Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

General information

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an Association incorporated under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2018 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management.

Financial reporting framework

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The Committee of Management has determined that Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. (the Association) is not a reporting entity.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*, the recognition and measurement requirements specified by Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures'.

New and amended standards adopted by the association

The association has adopted all the amendments to Australian Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board, which are relevant to and effective for the association's financial statements for the annual period beginning 1 May 2017.

None of these amendments have had a significant impact on the association.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Property, Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(d) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period and are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(f) Revenue and other income

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(h) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(i) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(j) Impairment of assets

At each reporting date, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(k) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

(l) Comparative information

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

(m) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if t-he revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

(n) Events after the reporting date

On June 12th 2018, Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. has undertaken the refurbishment of the change room and kitchen. To the date of this report, an amount of \$327,495-41 has been spent on the refurbishment with a further \$123,436-50 budgeted to be spent. The refurbishment will be funded by club funds held in operational and term deposit accounts (\$315,631-91), donations from members and grants received from the State Government (\$83,600-) and the Balnarring and Community Branch of the Bendigo Bank (\$51,700).

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS REPORT

To the Committee Members of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the year ended 30 April 2018

Opinion

We have audited the special purpose financial statements of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the entity), which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30 April 2018, the Statement of Profit or Loss and other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Members' Funds and Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the entity as at 30 April 2018, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (AASB's) to the extent described in Note 1 and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

Basis for opinion

Without modifying our audit opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 in the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. to meet the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* under the requirements of special purpose financial reporting. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report.

We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the independence requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other Information

The Members of the Committee are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Annual Report for the year ended 30 April 2018, other than the financial report and our Auditors Report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In preparing the financial statements, the Members of the Committee are responsible for assessing the Entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Members of the Committee either intends to liquidate the Entity or cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Entity's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Once again, our team of medical doctors were vitally important to our ability to host major events at the Club. Thank you to Dr Kate Stern who

continues to do great work coordinating the team of doctors at these events.

To those who improved their First Aid skills this season, whether it was during SRC or Bronze Camp, a Senior First Aid certificate, Spinal Management, or in completing Advanced Resuscitation Techniques – thank you! There are many opportunities in the off season to up-skill, so keep an eye out for upcoming opportunities both at Point Leo and at other Clubs. In the coming years a number of important changes will be made to First Aid protocol Australia wide, so be sure to keep your skills current!

Skills you learn and apply at Point Leo not only make you more valuable to your patrol, but also to employers and when out in the wider community. I would encourage every member to strive to improve their First Aid capabilities each year.

Surf Sports

Head Coach's Report



This season was highly successful at many levels including:

- Improving our Senior State titles results to 5th and within striking distance of 2nd
- High participation at Aussies with three finalists
- Nippers coming 8th at States with increased participation rates
- A greatly improved training culture from Nippers through to the highest level senior athletes
- Emergence of a broader focus for the Surf Sports section including the establishment of the Victorian Surf Sports Academy and the commencement of the LifeChanger program

Our Senior States and Aussies results were reflective of greater depth and a higher level of athlete capability. This resulted from a significant redevelopment of our senior training sessions including a shorter and less aggressive taper for States, and a greater focus on fitness development and maintenance throughout the season. Many of our athletes have matured and took on a high performance training program of 10-15 sessions per week. The mentoring program involving local and interstate mentors also had a significant impact.

A pleasing aspect of our 2017/2018 season was the improved water results from Nippers at States. Thanks to Nick Clarke for showing great commitment to developing the Nippers in the Surf

Sports training sessions. The Nippers seemed to also benefit greatly from the Thursday night iron/transition sessions where they joined in with the seniors. The collaborative and supportive approach demonstrated in these sessions was great to be a part of.

Several senior athletes participated in the Victorian Surf Sports Academy (VSSA) in 2017/2018. This program is dedicated to helping surf sports athletes from any club in Victoria to be their best self in life and surf sports competition. All of the VSSA athletes have a goal of attaining high level Aussies success.

Looking towards season 2018/2019 and beyond there are amazing things happening including:

- A number of our athletes aiming to represent Australia in kayaking over the next 6 years. The Club, in combination with VSSA, has developed a high-performance kayak program for surf sports athletes that has already commenced training. This program supported by coaches from Point Leo, Mentone, Half Moon Bay and Alexandra Headlands is based on the Avoca Kayak Club that has produced elite surf and kayak paddlers such as Lachie Tame and Riley Fitzsimmons.
- Strong representation by Point Leo SLSC at the Coolangatta Gold. Our dedicated program has been written by Zayne Hammil (Surfers Paradise Head Coach) and will

involve high performance swim squads on the Peninsula and in Melbourne.

- Further evolution of our surf sports training program with new athletes coming to the Club and some exciting new additions to the Seniors through Nippers. This year the U17 group looks to be particularly strong, as well as our ever-growing high calibre group in Open.

I'd like to finish with a comment on the LifeChanger Program that has been piloted at Point Leo SLSC this year. Trevor Hendy and the LifeChanger group have had a huge impact on the coaches, parents, athletes and support people in the Surf Sports Program. This program has

involved 6 sessions with Trevor and other mentors aiming to help young people become their best selves. The result has been a strengthening culture and connection of all those involved in the Surf Sports Program. Over 2018/2019 we hope to extend the LifeChanger program to club members outside of surf sports and into the Peninsula community.

We are always encouraging greater participation in surf sports as a beginner, aspiring athlete, master, coach, mentor or support person. Notable swim athletes this season included Masters Frank Christian, Ian Knight and Haydn Tierney, as well as our Open swimmers Kate Brooks, Pat Hough, Spencer Blain-Bartle and Josh Doherty.

A special mention goes to Kate Brooks, the recipient of our Swim Competitor of the Year award. Kate has been a member of the Club for many years now and has shown her talent this season. Kate is also a member of the leading Nunawading Swimming Club and has been a finalist at numerous Australian Swimming Championships. This year she has made a swift

transition to surf and was successful in obtaining a bronze medal in Surf Race and gold in the Surf Belt Race at the State Titles. She partnered Bella Ford all the way to the final of the Open Women's Board Rescue at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships in Scarborough.

There were several competitors who achieved some impressive results by making the final in their respective individual events, including Caitlin Robinson and Cameron Austin, but despite missing out on a medal many of these athletes were compensated by winning a medal or two in beach relay events.

While it was exciting watching the Point Leo Beach team's success, there was no athlete that excelled more than Mietta Russell, she was simply spectacular. Mietta is not only a current Australian Track and Field Champion, she also proved she can run faster than any other sprinter on sand in Victoria. Mietta won 3 gold medals in individual events and 2 gold medals in team events at the Victorian Championships and for her outstanding achievements over the season she was awarded the Beach Competitor of the Year award at the recent Club Presentation Night. Well done Mietta, you truly deserve the accolades.

The four team members of the Open Mixed relay were awarded the Team of the Year trophy at this year's Presentation Night. Victorian Championship results are listed in full in the Senior State Championship Results section of the Annual Report.

Surf Sports Recognition

Open Male Athlete of the Year - Lachlan Robinson

Bella was successful at the Victorian State Titles this year gaining a silver medal in the Open Women's Single Ski Race. She has performed consistently well at this Open level, and regularly championed the team to get involved and leading by example. She also achieved a bronze medal at the Champion Lifesaver event held at Mordialloc LSC. Aussies was also successful for Bella who, with her partner Kate Brooks, made it to the final in Open Women's Board Rescue.

Junior Male Athlete of the Year - Nick Ford

Nick has developed his ski paddling to a new level resulting in him winning a silver medal at the State Titles in Apollo Bay this year. He is also a great team member formulating a strong bond with his teammates and always at the forefront of encouraging involvement in all aspects of training and competition. He has had a successful season winning gold in the U19 double ski and gold in board rescue for the second consecutive year. He obtained a silver medal in the U19 Champion Lifesaver event.

Junior Female Athlete of the Year - Isabella Austin

Isabella has had resonating success all through the year. A strong and powerful athlete, her work ethic is one to be commended. Isabella was selected to represent Victoria in the 2018 Interstates team events held in Adelaide in January this year. She had outstanding results at the State Titles earning four individual medals, was instrumental in gaining six team medals as well as a bronze in the U17 Champion Lifesaver event. At the Aussies Isabella made it through to the final in the U17 single ski race as well as the quarter final of the U17 Ironwomen event. Isabella is an athlete to watch out for as if she keeps up this level of competition she will have a very bright future in the sport.

Team of the Year - Open Mixed Beach Relay

This was an exciting event, creating club history and bringing together four unsuspecting yet talented athletes to win the inaugural title of this new event of the beach and track. Board and Ski Competitor of the Year - Matthew Graves

Matt Graves decided this year to target the Ironman event setting upon a heavy training program of 15 sessions a week. Matt worked hard to overcome a shoulder injury and to develop his other skills which resulted in him placing 5th in the Open Ironman event at the State Titles. Matt's strength has always been his ski paddling, and this showed through when he made the Open Aussies double ski final with Lachlan Robinson.

Junior Surf Life Saving Program



Once again the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP) was blessed this season with excellent conditions over the intensive program during the summer holidays. With calm and relatively warm waters our Nippers developed their confidence and abilities on land and in the ocean, including surf education.

These skills are the foundations of Life Saving. They help our children be healthy and safe and start teaching them skills to help others. Nippers also provides opportunities for members to make friends, have fun and challenge themselves in carnivals against the State's best. Coordinating such enthusiastic, happy Nippers and energetic, engaged parents and volunteers is an absolute privilege.

For our most enthusiastic Nippers, training started in September 2017 and continued through to March 2018. This year a group of Nippers and their parents visited the Gold Coast in September 2017 to develop their skills in true surf conditions. They also had the amazing opportunity to train with seniors and be coached and mentored by Trevor Hendy, Ali Day, Jett Kenny, Harriet Brown and Jamo Porter.

What an experience and inspiration to our Nippers (and their parents) to learn from such legends of the sport. The Gold Coast Camp was an enormous success, providing Nippers with an early opportunity to learn new skills, make or renew friendships and build training loads. This year our competition team attended carnivals at Cosy Corner, Chelsea, Mordialloc, South

Melbourne and Lorne. We also sent a strong team of more than 90 Nippers to the Junior State Lifesaving Championships in Warrnambool where they had heaps of fun while testing themselves against the State's best. Congratulations to all Nippers who participated and gave their very best individually or as part of a team. There were many fantastic achievements by our Nippers and the way they conducted themselves on the beach. A real highlight was the Club participating formally in the March Past event for the first time in many years and placing 5th. My thanks once again to Nick Clarke for his enthusiasm and energy running competition training for Nippers under our Junior Surf Sports Program banner all season. And also to Jason Romari for his tireless efforts as Competition Team Manager.

To those parents who haven't yet volunteered, please don't be shy next year. We need you to volunteer to help in any way you can!

This season our Nippers made new friends and learned about keeping safe in the water, and importantly, had FUN in a safe and inclusive environment! To all our Nippers – keep up the swimming over winter and we look forward to seeing you on the beach next season.

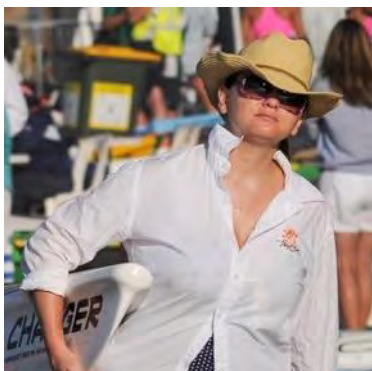

Honorary Life Members



At the 2017 Annual General Meeting of the Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Simone Munro was unanimously voted in as the newest Honorary Life Member of the Club.

Simone joined Point Leo SLSC as a 12-year-old in 1994. Since gaining her Surf Rescue Certificate in 1996 and then her Bronze Medallion in 1997 she has completed a total of 442.5 patrol hours until taking maternity leave from active duty in 2013.

During her active membership period she also gained the following awards: Radio Certificate, Advanced Resuscitation, IRB Crew, Senior First Aid, Spinal Management, Training Officer (Bronze, ART) and Assessor (Bronze, ART).

From the early days it was clear that Simone was a future leader for the Club and the broader Lifesaving movement. She pursued development opportunities with vigour, successfully completing the National Leadership Development Camp, the SLSA Training Conference and was a 2008/9 recipient of the Lifesaving Victoria Building Leaders Scholarship. During this period she was the Club delegate to Lifesaving Victoria on Lifesaving Operations and was a member of LSV Executive for Youth and Leadership (now called Membership and Leadership Development Council).

Simone became an active Committee member at an early age taking on a range of roles including Vice President, Mine Editor, Cadet Coordinator, Chief Instructor and Club Captain. After starting her family, she came back onto the Committee as Social Secretary.

She also excelled as a competitor and coach in R & R. This was honoured by her induction into the Point Leo SLSC Hall of Fame for five national medals (three of them Gold) and 23 medals at Senior State titles as a competitor. She has also coached three teams to medals.

Her close relationship with the Tierney family, and as a role model for young members in the club, made her an excellent addition to the Gary Tierney Foundation Board in 2013.

For over 23 years Simone has provided the Club and the Lifesaving movement with outstanding service. Her passion for providing opportunities to young people and growing R & R is evident in everything that she does. She is an excellent example of the type of members that the Club strives to develop and truly reflects the qualities and commitment of the Honorary Life Members.

Gary Tierney Foundation

Achievements – the Past 12 Months

Over the year, the Foundation has had success with its core activities and has been excited to adopt some new approaches. We have continued to offer the Foundation Fellowship and have also been proud to provide special purpose grants to worthy recipients. As our funding situation has been sound and stable, we have been thrilled to be also able to offer additional financial support for specific activities undertaken by young lifesavers in the Club.

In the past 12 months annual Fellowship grants totalling \$4,000 were made (covering existing Fellows plus our 2018 Fellow). Funding assistance of \$2800 was provided to 14 Point Leo active members aged under 25, competing in the National Titles in Scarborough, WA, and \$1000 in total was provided to ten of the Club's Coolangatta Gold competitors to assist with entry fees and expenses. These payments to club members are in line with the Gary Tierney Foundation's Governance Charter.

During the past year the Advisory Board of the Foundation has adopted a low-key approach to fundraising. Consistent with our long-term strategy, there were no fundraising events held during the past 12 months with income being sourced from donations and investment income. This approach is intended to allow the Club to focus on fundraising for the major clubhouse facility redevelopment.

The Foundation's initial capital base target of \$200,000 was attained in the previous financial year, and in reviewing the situation the Board is confident that the financial position is sufficient to finance the foreseeable future grant and bursary outgoings. The situation will remain under review.

Financials

At the 30th April 2018 the Foundation's fund balance stood at \$228,130, an increase of \$7,679 over the balance as at 30th April 2017. Over the 12-month period income to the Foundation consisted of \$8,450 from donations and \$7,029 investment earnings (mostly bank interest). Details of the outgoings of \$7,800 being payments to club members are included in the previous paragraph.

A review of the Foundation's investment strategy was carried out during the year. A longer-term investment outlook is now considered appropriate and a diversified investment strategy has been adopted, with an asset allocation of 1/3 of capital in balanced investments (including equities); and 2/3 in Term Deposits (with a small working capital cash at bank). The decision has been made to hold the medium to long term investments through a balanced managed fund. An initial investment of \$20,000 was made early in the year in the Surf Life Saving Foundation (SLSF) Rescue Fund, a charitable managed investment scheme. In October 2017 an additional \$50,000 was invested in the SLSF Rescue Fund.



Gary Tierney Foundation 2018 Fellow – Lachlan Robinson

The 2018 Fellow is Lachlan Robinson. Lachlan joined Point Leo SLSC as a Nipper in 2005 and as a Nipper he showed his love of competition and his ability to compete successfully on the beach and in the water. In those years Point Leo Nippers were a strong force at carnivals and at the State Titles, and Lachlan played a significant role in those successes.

In his last two years as a Nipper Lachie developed his leadership skills as an Activity Leader with the Nippers assisting club coaches in beach activities and disciplines and being appointed Nipper Vice-captain. Following on from gaining his Bronze Medallion in 2015, and joining senior ranks, Lachie continued his leadership role in the Club by helping at Bronze camps and assisting with coaching at senior training sessions, and in general terms becoming a strong member of the club's competitive group.

It is as a club competitor that Lachie has really made his mark. Specifically, in board, ski and team events he has been outstanding not only at local beach carnivals, but also at State and National levels. Last season he was part of the Club's senior male Taplin Relay Team that won Gold at the States at Port Fairy – an historic first for Point Leo SLSC. Lachie's willingness to train

hard in the gym and in the water is well known around the Club and he has set himself long term goals that will not only will improve his status as a competitor but will continue to develop the team culture of the club's competitive group.

The Fellowship Award Presentation was made this year at the Club's extremely well attended Annual Muso Night held on 20th January 2018. Haydn Tierney made the presentation on behalf of the Tierney family and the Foundation.

The Future

The Foundation Advisory Board has confirmed that its primary purpose is:

- Prudential management of the Fund Corpus; and if necessary growing that Corpus. Includes investment strategy and allocation
- Making grants and other funding awards
- Otherwise supporting Fellows

The Foundation does not seek to be a substitute for the organisation of Club Social events and development programs/initiatives for members which are matters for the full Club Committee. It is available to support those activities. The Foundation's focus will be on Fellowship Grants; other assistance grants to younger members; and support for other proposals that the Foundation Board considers meet its objectives.

An emerging area of interest is the possibility of funding a Point Leo Leadership Development program directed at young active club members. A draft proposal is currently under consideration and will hopefully commence later in 2018. The

Foundation will continue to provide grants or funding as Fellowship Grants or as Single Purpose Grants, all with the objective of encouraging younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in Surf Lifesaving. And later this year, in response to strong interest, it is planned to reintroduce the Point Leo Family Walk, a season opener for club members and family and friends.

Gary Tierney Foundation Governance

The Gary Tierney Foundation is managed by an Advisory Board. At the 30th April 2018, the Board consisted of Tom Mollenkopf (Chairperson), John Horwood, Ian Knight, Richard Batchelor, Haydn Tierney, Isabella Ford and Kelvin Anderson. The Foundation's Patron is Louise Tierney.

During the year there were three retirements from the Advisory Board: Andrew Mansour, Simone Munro and Lachlan Pearse. The Club Committee, acting on the recommendation of the Advisory Board, appointed Isabella Ford and Kelvin Anderson to the Board. Since 30th April 2018 Richard Batchelor has advised his intention to also leave the Advisory Board. Tamara Brawn has recently been appointed to Richard's vacant seat. Both Andrew and Richard played significant roles in establishing the legal and financial direction of the Gary Tierney Foundation, and Simone and Lachlan have added their insights as more recent patrolling and competing members of the Club. We extend sincere thanks to each of them for their contributions. Over the past 12 months the Advisory Board has met formally face-to-face on three occasions and also convened electronically on a number of other occasions.

The Foundation's finances are audited annually as part of the Club's statutory audit. A separate bank account is maintained to ensure that donations to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with the Foundation's Governance Charter.

Gear & Equipment

As a club of more than 1,000 members, Point Leo SLSC is obliged to maintain a vast inventory of equipment in order to meet the club's patrol, training and competition needs. Maintenance of this equipment and purchasing of new equipment follows a familiar rhythm each year. Patrol, rescue and first aid equipment are assessed over the winter months in advance of the LSV Gear Inspection in October. Damaged equipment is repaired, obsolete equipment is discarded and replacement equipment sourced. Considerable effort is required to satisfy SLSA prescribed equipment guidelines for us to successfully pass Gear Inspection and be well prepared for a season of patrols.



Board camps are usually held during the September holidays where cadet boards and nipper boards are required. Up to 30 cadet boards are needed for this camp and preparation for these camps require many hours of repairing previously damaged boards during the winter months. Each year new boards are purchased to increase our stock of boards, but a considerable amount of time is spent on reviving older boards to provide for an expanding training program.

Repair and maintenance of these boards further intensifies once nippers and seniors summer training commences. Nick Clarke undertakes the majority of board repairs and repairs over 50 boards in a season. This is an enormous task and Nick's generosity is greatly appreciated.

There were several significant new equipment purchases over the season. Two new defibrillators were purchased to replace our old ones. Grant money was spent on a variety of items including rescue boards, bumbags and whistles. As usual a number of new nipper boards were purchased and quickly put to good use over summer.

As a volunteer organisation we rely extensively on the generosity of members to provide their time and resources. The Legends patrol was very active over summer and conducted several mini-working bees where equipment and clubhouse maintenance were undertaken. Thank you to this dedicated band of volunteers for the multitude of tasks completed. Increasingly we require off-site storage for some of our larger equipment during the winter months. A big thank you to Ashton and Amanda Woolley for allowing us use of their shed to store the nipper trailer and old ATV. We are still in need of some off-site storage space and would like to hear from any members who may be able to assist.

Thanks to Andrew Gibson, Nick Woods and Morgan Jones for the many hours spent preparing equipment for Gear Inspection and then the continued maintenance throughout the season. Thanks to all the coaches and activity leaders who continue to push the message of expected board and ski care.

Clubhouse & Facilities

There are two big clubhouse stories from this season:

Boardwalk

The Club was a major contributor, along with the Foreshore Committee and Disabled Surfing, to the construction of an All-Abilities Boardwalk from the Clubhouse to the beach. As well as providing access for people with physical restrictions, it gives an alternative access to separate vehicles and pedestrians during events, and a fantastic viewing platform for patrols. It is a fantastic addition to the Point Leo precinct.

Amenities Renewal

Work has finally started on our renovation of toilets, change-rooms and kitchen. This is the second phase of a complete conversion from an old-style Lifesaving Club to a modern Community Hub.

There were four Working Bees this season. Two were by the Legends Patrol and others were to remove the kitchen, gym and clothing shop prior to the major renovation.

LSV conducted a facilities review of all clubhouses, identifying major flaws and serious safety concerns. Funding was provided to repair those items identified at Point Leo and the work will progress in tandem with renovation works.

Extensive repairs were done on the gear shed roof to try and get a couple more years out of it.

Once again the Woods family did the Summer Caretaker role, keeping buildings and guests in order over the holidays. Rob and Deb Howell returned for the Winter, providing cleaning and security services.

A major project was to remove racks from one of our containers, fit them to a contractor's container and load all the competition craft for WA Aussies. This was done in half a day by a team of competitors, who later reversed the process when all the gear arrived back from Perth.

Point Leo SLSC Bobbas

The past 12 months has been very similar to previous years for the Bobbas. We have had three members lunches at the Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club and also the Bobbas and Partners lunch at the clubhouse at Point Leo. All were well attended, although numbers were a little down at the Partners lunch, which was held earlier than previous years, because of the clubhouse renovations commencing after Easter.

There were two significant highlights. The Bobbas constitution is dated May 1968 and was prepared following the first official meeting of The Bobbanarrings, as the Bobbas were initially titled. Office bearers were named in this document with the first President being Peter Braithwaite. It didn't take the brains trust long to work out that May 2018 is the 50th Anniversary of the Bobbas and we marked that milestone at the Bobbas and Partners lunch. Peter Braithwaite spoke about the early Bobbas days particularly noting the social functions, the children's Xmas parties at Point Leo and the support that the Bobbas gave the Club where and whenever possible, particularly at carnivals held at Point Leo.

Peter also presented the Club with a plaque detailing the names of a number of the early active members of Point Leo SLSC, many are still members of the Bobbas. It is planned to display the plaque, prepared by Alf Treadwell, in the entrance to the renovated clubhouse.

Back in mid-2017 Don 'Cammie' Campbell decided to commission a Balnarring artist Margaret Rees to prepare a painting that reflected the early days at Point Leo SLSC. Margaret has

done a wonderful job, particularly as she was bombarded with any number of suggestions for the painting content. The painting titled "The Point Leo Pioneering Heritage" was handed over to Cammie at the Bobbas and Partners lunch, and he in turn presented it to the Bobbas.

When appropriate Cammie, on behalf of the Bobbas, will donate the painting to the Club and it will be hung in the clubhouse permanently. Cammie is quite happy to state the painting project became an obsession with him and it is a terrific gesture by him that does reflect his love for Point Leo SLSC and his memories of those early days at Point Leo. Thank you, Don Campbell and well done, Margaret Rees.

The Bobbas were well represented at Aussies Masters carnival held recently at Scarborough, WA. Regulars, Ian Knight and Frank Christian performed well again, with Frank picking up a Bronze in the 60-64 years Surf Race. Apprentice Bobba, Haydn Tierney, son of the late Gary, won Bronze in 3 events in the 35-39 age group, whilst Tamara Brawn won Gold in the over 160 Boat Race rowing for Lorne. Club coach Jon Ford also made finals in team events with Knightie and Frank.

The Bobbas are well aware of the fact that a number of the original members are getting on in years, and whilst not one of them will admit it, they are not going to be around forever. A plan to expand membership is a subject that will be discussed and finalised over the next few months and once formulated will be implemented forthwith.

Obituary

Geoffrey Walter Waters

Life Member and Hall of Famer Geoff (Blab) Waters passed away on 1st August 2017. Geoff gained his Bronze Medallion with Point Leo SLSC and was a club stalwart until he transferred to Ocean Grove SLSC in 1998. Geoff had many administrative roles at Point Leo. He was Club President from 1980 to 1982, Club Captain on three occasions over a nine-year period and Chief Instructor from 1979 to 1981.

However, it was in the competition area that Geoff excelled, initially as a competitor then as a coach. In 1965 Geoff won Gold at the States as a member of a very successful beach relay team and in 1964 was a member of the Junior R & R team that won Gold in the States and finished a close second at the Aussies in big seas at Collaroy, NSW.

Geoff then concentrated on coaching R & R, and in doing so he recruited a number of top swimmers to the club and played a significant mentoring role in settling them into the club. As a coach Geoff won Gold in 1968-69 with a Junior R & R team, with the U16 5 Man R & R in 1997-98 and with the Open Women's R & R 2010-11. On several occasions there were Silver and Bronze medals with R & R teams at the Aussies.

Following Geoff's passing there were a number of tributes from his old club mates and probably one from Rob Woodhouse summed up everyone's thoughts – "Blab was larger than life in every way and played a big role in getting dozens of swimmers to Leo in the 1980s including our family".

Geoff was awarded Honorary Life Membership with Point Leo SLSC in 1977 and was inducted into the club's Hall of Fame in 2005.

Following his departure from Leo in 1998 he coached R & R in a number of Victorian clubs and almost single handedly was responsible for a resurgence of R & R in this state. He was a member of several LSV and SLSA committees and was awarded Life Membership of LSV in 2012.

To honour his services to surf lifesaving Geoff was posthumously inducted into the SLSA Hall of Fame and he received an OAM in the June 2018 Queens Birthday Awards.

The Club's thoughts are with Geoff's wife Sue, his son Steven and his daughter Lisa.

President's Awards

Three President's Awards are presented annually, one Junior, one Senior and the Dick Catterick Award. They are the highest annual awards that the Club can bestow on one of its members. The trophies are awarded on the basis of the acceptance of the duties of a member and the provision of leadership in the Club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct and demeanour.

President's Award (Junior) – Andrew Nott

This award recognises a Junior member (U15 – U19) who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more Club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct and demeanour.

Andy was elected Club Vice Captain this year and his leadership and maturity belie his youth. Andy has continued to make a major contribution to key Club activities including patrols, training and social activities. Andy received an Outstanding Achievement Award at the 2018 Presentation Night for undertaking a major rescue on Westernport Bay. This was away from Point Leo beach and well outside any patrolled area. He was able to rescue a child that had become trapped under an upturned boat and to transport the unconscious child and his father to shore where he provided lifesaving resuscitation. Congratulations to Andy for his achievements and for providing inspirational leadership, particularly to our young members.

President's Award (Senior) – Jon Ford

This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more Club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct.

Jon Ford provides inspirational dedication and leadership as Head Coach and was this year awarded the Senior President's Award in recognition of this and his many other contributions: organising and performing at the ever sensational Muso Night; providing valuable Building Sub-Committee input; initiating the Victorian Surf Sports Academy, a venture aimed at bringing together competitors across all Victorian Clubs to provide an inclusive training platform with access to top coaches in a non-partisan environment; and initiating a relationship with the LifeChanger organisation.

Dick Catterick Award – (Best Club Member) – Nicholas Woods

This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding all-round contribution during the season. Presented in memory of the late Dick Catterick who was the Clubhouse caretaker/supervisor in the 1970s and 1980s.

This season saw Nick Woods recognised as the most outstanding Club member.
