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President's Report

The 2012/2013 season has come to a successful close for the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club. The Club continues to grow and prosper in all facets of its operations and is one of the powerhouse Surf Life Saving Clubs in Victoria. I am fortunate enough to travel and observe clubs in other States from time to time and can say with great pride that Point Leo SLSC is one of the best managed and best performing clubs in Australia. This is due to the Club's members who take an active part in ensuring we provide the best level of care and attention to all aspects of the club such as developing members, patrolling our beach, competing in various surf events and being a great corporate citizen within the general and Life Saving Victoria communities.

Point Leo had extremely successful Regional, State and National carnival campaigns in all age categories (Juniors, Seniors, Masters) and our patrol function concluded with a successful season and no major incidents or traumas. 'Off the water' the Club-related functions and events were numerous and successful and they certainly contributed to the ongoing growth and respect the club currently enjoys.

In perusing last year's President's Report to members, I stated the Club had a number of challenges to address in order to progress. These 'challenges' were:

- The Club required more and broader Patrol qualifications among its membership base
- The Club required more Officials in order to manage our requirements at the various carnivals our members compete in
- The Club also required more IRB drivers for Patrols, Water Safety and Carnivals

It is pleasing to note that all three identified areas presented as a challenge to us last season have been actioned – although we still need more qualified Officials. This is a great testament to the many members who have been involved over the course of the season in addressing these issues. It would be fair to say we need to continue work in these areas on an annual basis and not just when our qualifications and numbers become low.

Of course, as old challenges are made redundant, new ones appear. In the shorter term, the Club needs to extensively ramp up its attitudes to general Patrol functions and attendance; we need to assist the Gary Tierney Foundation to reach its required capital amount and need to consider the overall approach to our Clubhouse and infrastructure requirements for the next 20 – 25 years.

The actual list of events, functions and community service the club has provided this season is again enormous and much detail about these will appear in the relevant sections elsewhere in this Annual Report. However, I would like to list some of these as a guide and reminder of the broad and vast great work the Club does for the community, its youth and broader membership:-

- Successful conclusion to our number one priority, the Patrol season
- Annual Bronze Camp (36 members attended this year)
- Annual Requalification
- Point Leo Swim Classic (including our first ever 5 kilometre swim)
- Inductee for the third year of the Gary Tierney Foundation - Rose Anderson
- Hosted a full Regional Carnival and full Open Carnival (and we won the Open Carnival!)
- Had solid representation at every Carnival (Junior, Seniors and Masters) in Victoria this season
- Successfully managed the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (Nippers) of some 460 Nippers
- Had 139 Nippers attend the Junior State Titles at Lorne
- Had 47 Senior competitors attend the Senior State Titles at Anglesea
- Had 5 Masters competitors attend Masters State Titles at Lorne
- Had 9 Seniors and 3 Masters attend the National Titles at North Kirra, Queensland
- Won 2 National Silver medals with Frank Christian's great Rescue Tube race swim and Haydn Tierney's fantastic Ironman race at the Aussie Masters
- Won a National Bronze medal with our male Masters 130+ years Surf Team consisting of Haydn Tierney, Frank Christian and Jon Ford
- Held numerous spit roast nights, a muso night and Nipper functions that saw hundreds of members, supporters and families have fun and engage with the broader club
- Held a magnificent annual Awards Night!
- Held a number of fundraising events including the highly successful tin shakes!
- Continued to secure a number of major sponsors to assist and support the club financially
- Held a number of Bobbas (Legends) lunches during the year

- Continued to invest in infrastructure improvements for the club and its environs
- Worked closely with the Point Leo Foreshore Committee and broader community to provide a safe environment for all visitors to the Point Leo area
- Election of Point Leo Life Member Tom Mollenkopf to the role of President, Life Saving Victoria

On a broader note, I am also pleased to report that the club remains in a sound position across all parameters it is measured against. The club is extremely stable from a financial perspective with its overall membership numbers at season's end at 993 – yes; just seven members shy of the magical 1000 mark! The club has a solid and hardworking Committee that continues to put in hundreds of hours of work behind the scenes. In my third year as President I would like to thank all of this year's Committee for their efforts, contributions and ability to 'get the job done'. I would also like to acknowledge the particular efforts of the Club Executive members Kim Williams, Andrew Gibson and Jack Garner – a great job everyone! I would like to thank some of our volunteer ex-officio posts for their time and effort as well - namely Jody Tulloch (Grievance Officer), Catherine McCraith (Member Protection Officer) and Aaron Precht (Bar Manager).

Moving forward, it is necessary that the roles within our Committee continue to be spread between a broad base of the membership and I encourage any member who is eligible for a Committee role to consider taking on such a role. One of the future aspects of the Club is the likelihood that in the years to come we will need to employ paid positions to manage the day to day affairs of the Club and that our role and footprint within the Point Leo community will expand greatly – a strong, robust and active Committee will be required to manage these coming challenges.

The club remains in a solid financial position, carries no debt and continues to maintain excellent relationships with its major partners such as Life Saving Victoria, the Point Leo Foreshore Committee and all of our various suppliers.

As President I have the difficult task of selecting worthy recipients of the Senior and Junior President's Awards and the Dick Catterick Award (Best Club Member). This year we had some stand out contributors within the club:

- Senior President's Award: Lachlan (Lochie) Pearce
- Junior President's Award: Zachary Richter
- Dick Catterick Award: Kim Williams

These three members all manage and complete various Club tasks throughout the entire season. They are great contributors and I thank them sincerely for their dedication and achievements over the past season.

Looking ahead, I again encourage every member to consider what they can achieve for themselves and the Club in the coming years. The Club requires more Active members and also requires those Active members to obtain more SLSC qualifications. The basic requirements around fulfilling our Patrol functions are becoming increasingly more complex over time and we need to ensure every Patrol has a full suite of qualifications to ensure we provide the highest possible care and safety for ourselves and the public.

In terms of our Patrol obligations, the Club under the leadership this year of Club Captain Jack Garner and Vice-Captain Morgan Jones, made significant advances in our patrolling capability, however there appear to be some issues around the requirements for all members on all Patrols to attend or arrange a substitute. This basic lifesaving mantra needs to be adhered to at all times and next season I would expect every member who is rostered on to patrol will complete the full Patrol themselves or ensure their pre-arranged substitute does. No exceptions.

The 2012/2013 season has now concluded and it was a great year for the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club. The next season and seasons to follow will only see Point Leo continue to grow in size, stature and respect within the Surf Life Saving and broader communities, but remember, we can only do it with the support and assistance of every member working hard towards common goals.

I would also like to extend special thanks to all our Club sponsors – the club is blessed to have a broad group of excellent sponsors who assist the Club to provide its core function. I encourage every member to take note of our various sponsors (also note the sponsor's wall at the entrance to the Clubhouse) and support them whenever possible.

I also thank everyone who contributed, assisted and helped out during the season. Whether it was emptying a bin, sweeping a floor, making a written submission to LSV for a grant, driving equipment to carnivals, putting up a tent, organizing a dinner for 120 guests, driving members to patrol etc. - a MASSIVE THANK YOU! One of the great aspects about this Club is the multitude of members who are prepared to give their time and effort. There are so many of you it is impossible to list here. This is the lifeblood of a voluntary organisation and without you we would not exist!

Lastly, this is my third and final year as President of this wonderful and amazing Club. I move on with a personal sadness and hope that down the track, time will permit me to re-visit the role (if the Club would have me!). I have enjoyed the role immensely and have worked with many dedicated, hardworking members in all areas of the Club who have supported me along the way. To all of you, I say a big thank you. Next year is my 41st year as a member of Point Leo and I have loved every minute of my involvement. To the incoming President and Committee - all the very best!

Please enjoy the 'off season'. I look forward to seeing everyone on the beach at Leo in 2013/2014.



NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 2013

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these accounts.

a) General

These financial statements are prepared for distribution to the members and for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply the Accounting Standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements, except for those Standards specified in Schedule 1 of the Associations Incorporation (Prescribed Particulars) Regulations.

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention and a going concern assumption. They do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The accounting reports have been prepared on the basis of recognizing in dollar value only assets and liabilities generally described as cash based.

b) Principal Activity

The Club's sole activity is to provide life saving services and facilities for the community and its members. The Club did not carry out any trading activities during the financial year other than those incidental to the above activity.

c) Income Tax

No amount was required to be provided for income tax.

d) Property, Buildings and Amenities

Buildings and items of plant and equipment are recorded in the balance sheet at cost. The value of such items is brought to account as depreciation over the expected life of each asset.

Club Captain's Report

The 2012/2013 season has proved very successful across the full spectrum of club activities. We have seen improvements from our patrols, leaps forward in our competition team (from both the younger competitors and our more "mature" competitors), another hugely successful season for our Nippers and an extensive series of skills maintenance sessions and award camps. All of these factors have helped to create a thriving Point Leo summer that we can all be proud to be a part of. There are of course a number of key people to thank for all their hard work in facilitating such a season.

First and foremost Morgan Jones must be congratulated on his first year as Vice Club Captain and the fantastic job that he has done. For the most part organising and ensuring that the patrols run smoothly is an entirely thankless task, and Morgan has approached it with a great amount of vitality and enthusiasm. The most basic function of our Surf Life Saving Club is to keep the beach safe and this has once again been ensured by Morgan's hard work, the hard work of our Patrol Captains (Morgan Jones, Lachlan Pearse, Jackson Curtis, Alex Besson and Cal Pearse), as well as the huge number of committed patrolling members who came, rain, hail or shine, to patrol our beach. This year also welcomed our highest score in many years in the Patrol Competition - a yardstick for us to measure our patrol performance against the whole of the State. These are very positive signs for the club and the improving standards of our patrols.

Rose Anderson, our new Chief Instructor, has also done an incredible job this year. We have had well run skills maintenance sessions, a number of very successful Bronze camps, an SRC camp (thanks to Dianne Summers for running this) and 'Super Camp'. This huge program speaks volumes of the hard work and dedication that Rose has put into this season. The heavy increase in paper work that LSV requires of us was done tirelessly by Rose and her organisation and forward thinking helped to increase the number of Award holders for Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, Spinal Management and Basic Beach Management. We have been desperately short of the last three of these for some time and the Super Camp that ran in January helped to increase our Award numbers and was essential in ensuring the Award requirements for our patrols were met for the season.

The Nippers program was once again a great success with Pea Saunders and Andrew Welsh, alongside a huge array of Nipper parents, organisers and helpers, doing a large amount of work around coordinating and facilitating one of Victoria's largest Nipper programs. - 2 rolled ankles
- 1 patient who fainted
- 1 other

A special mention also goes to those First Aiders who looked after a person accidentally shot through the arm with a spear gun.

Well done to everyone who performed a first aid this year and just a reminder to everyone to please make the effort to keep the first aid room tidy and hygienic for next season.

IRB Report

Season 2012/2013 has continued on from last year supported principally by the back-bone of the section being Blane Paton, Gary Utri, Chris Gray, Andrew Gibson and David (Jack) Russell. This season Chuck Warner jumped on board and assisted tirelessly. To these gentlemen I extend thanks as without them our competition team and nippers would not be able to compete nor would any club based water programs be run. We, as a Club, need to continue to support the IRB section and train more members to offset the burden shouldered by the members named above. It was thanks to these few that we were able to successfully fulfil

our water safety requirements at both the state and national level. Special thanks to Andrew Gibson for volunteering at Aussies to meet this requirement.

We ran a single IRB course this year which was well attended and saw Club members achieve both the IRB Crewperson and Driver awards (although the paperwork has yet to be finalised). I thank all who volunteered their time to assist and participate. The IRB candidates supported the Nipper program as part of their training, accumulating the required hours, with some exceeding the requirement showing great commitment to the club.

Again our motors performed flawlessly. We received two new engines late in the season as part of our rotation program, one of which was utilised in the Nipper program and the other is being prepped for use for this coming season. We have two additional engines on order which will be received prior to the coming season. These new arrivals bring the average age of our engines to 2 years which is a vast improvement on a couple of years ago when the average age was 10 years.

We were lucky enough to receive funds through the VESEP program which essentially paid for a new Thundercat 377. This hull has just arrived and will be brought online in the coming season. Blane has worked hard to organise a sponsorship through ALH which will pay for a new Water Safety hull. ALH's name will be placed on the 377 in recognition of their support.

IRBs are a key piece of equipment used in every facet of lifesaving from everyday patrolling, competition, award training, water safety at club, state and national level and finally search and rescue. This,

together with the ever increasing focus on Workplace Health and Safety, saw the Committee allocate the IRB section \$5000 to upgrade the IRB cage, trolleys and racks to make it safer for members to prepare and store equipment. This upgrade was well overdue and will make our IRB facility safer, more effective, easier to maintain and something members can be proud of. The implementation of these changes could not have taken place without the tireless work of a few people: Andrew Gibson for putting the cage together; Haydn Tierney for assisting in the supply of reels and the new compressor; Gary Utri for the new work bench.

The Club held its first training session for IRB competition, supported by Nathan Cester, Cal Pearse and Jackson Curtis. It is still early days, but I believe this will assist us maintain our IRB capability and maybe even assist Point Leo SLSC in achieving the status of Club of the Year.

I will be stepping aside this coming season as IRB Captain. I would like to thank the Committee for their unbelievable support in the development of the IRB section over the last 2 years. I hope in the future they will continue their support in the development of this essential arm of lifesaving.

Team Manager's Report

The Competition season for the Seniors this year included seven carnivals followed by the State Championships at Anglesea in March 2013. Point Leo attended all of the carnivals and fielded a team of 47 competitors at the State Championships. A team of nine Senior competitors travelled to North Kirra on the Gold Coast to compete in the Aussies in early April.

This season the team used the 10 seater bus (purchased in 2012) to transport athletes to the west coast. Although it was very early morning starts we had excellent and consistent attendance at all carnivals and I would like to thank the bus drivers Chris Gray, Mark Lethlean and Chris Munro.

The new trailer designed by Andrew Gibson and Andrew Welsh and built during the 2012 winter has been a marvellous asset for the team. It accommodates skis, boards, reels and tents and tows reliably and safely. Thank you to the Dads who towed the trailer during the season - Steve Ashton, John Hough, Bruce Mourney, Jon Ford, Cam Grant and Mark Lethlean. A big thank you must go to Andrew Gibson and Andrew Welsh for designing and coordinating construction of this invaluable piece of equipment: it is very practical and user friendly. The Red Hill and Flinders Lions Clubs generously subsidised the cost of building the trailer.

Athletes this year have had many coaching sessions on offer in all disciplines. Jon Ford, Lachlan Pearce, Chris Munro, Matt Bunting-Frame and Clayton McDonald have done a wonderful job in motivating and preparing our athletes for competition. We are very lucky at Point Leo to have such a dedicated team of coaches and their hard work is paying off. Several Point Leo athletes were selected for State teams. Members selected for the Victorian State Development Squad were Callum Welsh and Caitlin Robinson (both Under 13) and Samantha Howe (Under 15). Adam Howgate (Under 17) was selected for the Victorian State Team.

All of the individuals identified as State level athletes have tremendous ability. They are great ambassadors for the Club and fantastic role models for our younger members. Everyone at the Club is very proud of their achievements.

It is compulsory for all Clubs to supply officials at carnivals – Point Leo is fortunate enough to have a dedicated group of officials who represent our Club. The Senior competitors understand and appreciate the important role of officials and would like to thank Tracey Cester, Tamara Brawn, Simone Williams, Di Summers, Annette Precht, Andrew Gibson and trainee officials Graham Howgate and Henry Kelsall. IRB crews are also a compulsory requirement and this year I would like to thank Mick Treadwell, Jackson Curtis, Andrew Gibson and Marc Aliotti for their support.

The Point Leo team was extremely competitive at the State Championships. For the first time in many years Point Leo fielded U17 ski teams in both male and female, we have a competitive group of U19 males, a competition team of 20 females, enough male competitors for three open Taplin Relay teams (pictured below) and the two double skis are in great demand with women's, men's and mixed team paddlers. The Club bagged a total of 21 Gold, 27 Silver and 22 Bronze medals.



For the first time in many years Point Leo was not represented by a Surf Boat or R & R team. Hence the Aussies contingent was smaller than previous years. I could not attend the Aussies and I would like to thank Andrew Welsh who stepped in as Team Manager. All athletes performed well, a strong U17 female team qualified for the finals in Taplin Relay and Board Relay and several individuals reached semi-finals. The team enjoyed wonderful weather and manageable surf conditions and are looking forward to Scarborough WA next year. Competing interstate is always a logistical nightmare but this was simplified when Jon Ford kindly offered to tow the trailer to North Kirra – many thanks to Jon.

My role as Team Manager involves fundraising and this season two successful intersection tin shakes raised over \$10,000. The money is distributed to the Board and Ski section, the Competition Team and the Club for general use. The efforts of the volunteers who attended is acknowledged and greatly appreciated.

As Team Manager I was also involved in the development and implementation of the team selection policy. The selection panel (coaches and section leaders) was very happy with the outcome this season and the policy is constantly under review.

In closing I would like to thank everyone at Point Leo for their support during the season and in particular Jon Ford, Lachlan Pearce, Andrew Gibson and Kim Williams. We have a team of individuals who are working hard to keep the Senior team members engaged, fit and active in Surf Life Saving. It's a great Club and it's a great team of people. I am looking forward to summer on the beach 2014.

- Bella Ford and Abby Lethlean (right) comfortably winning U17 Board Rescue
- The Junior board paddlers doing a fantastic job in solid 2-3 foot surf at Junior States in Lorne... great effort!

Whilst the focus of Point Leo Nippers is participation, all Nippers enrolled in the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP) are also given the opportunity to compete for Point Leo at Junior Carnivals. Juniors interested in competition are encouraged to become part of the Point Leo Competition Team, irrespective of their abilities. This season in excess of 150 Point Leo Nippers registered and competed, making our Junior competition team the largest in the State.

There are many potential reasons for such a large competition group, including:

- Inclusive and supportive nature of the JSLP program.
- Exceptional encouragement and support from a large group of dedicated Age Managers.
- Excellent professional coaching provided by experienced club members.
- Tireless support from a committed and engaged Nipper parent group.

Every Junior wishing to compete in water events at carnivals must meet the Junior Proficiency Requirement (S-badge). Accordingly, the first few Nipper sessions are always chaotic as there is limited time for their proficiency to be assessed and details processed before our first carnival. In addition, LSV instituted changes to the on-line carnival entry process this season resulting in an even briefer window of opportunity in which Juniors could obtain their S-badge before the first carnival at Cosy Corner.

In response to this, a proficiency assessment session was held at Point Leo in early December before the JSLP program commenced. This enabled a large number of juniors to obtain their S-badge before the season commenced. This was a great success as it eased the workload once the JSLP commenced. Thanks to David Buntine and Pea Saunders for organizing this and thanks to the large contingent of Water Safety personnel who ensured the safety of our Juniors. The collation and data entry workload associated with S-badges is enormous and the work done by Pea, Kim Williams and Iris Cassell in diligently completing this must be acknowledged.

Carnival Review

In total, Point Leo Nippers had the opportunity to compete in 4 carnivals including the Regional Qualifying Carnival and the State Championships at Lorne. In addition, under 13s and 14s were able to compete at the Point Leo Senior Carnival in early February.

Traditionally our first carnival is at Cosy Corner on the first Friday in January. This year, due to forecast extreme weather conditions, the carnival was postponed to the following day where milder weather was expected. Each season the number of Point Leo competitors at this carnival increases. Five years ago our Cosy Corner team only numbered 30 competitors. This year, a team of approximately 130 Nippers competed strongly in excellent conditions.

The next carnival on the program was held at Mount Martha. This carnival was well supported by Bayside and Peninsula clubs but was poorly represented by clubs from the West Coast. Our competition team attended in great numbers and performed well with outstanding individual and team results across all age groups.

The Senior Carnival held at Point Leo in February included a competition program for under 13s and 14s. A very strong team of Point Leo juniors competed in excellent conditions and enjoyed the experience and excitement associated with a senior carnival. This was an important carnival for our juniors to attend as it gave them an opportunity to mingle with the Senior Competition team and inspire them to continue competition beyond the Junior program.

Point Leo hosted the Regional Qualifying Carnival in mid-February. As the host club, a large number of club volunteers was required to help organise and run the carnival. This carnival ran seamlessly and it was a

credit to the many club members who assisted on the day. Over 130 Point Leo Nippers competed in excellent conditions. Terrific results were achieved with all Nippers relishing the opportunity to compete in team events and qualify teams for States. Most age groups qualified two or more teams for each event.

A team of approximately 130 enthusiastic Point Leo competitors descended on Lorne for the State Titles in mid-March. Unlike the previous year, the weather forecast was for mild temperatures and moderate swell. As per the program, individual events were conducted on the Saturday in excellent conditions. A number of outstanding individual results were recorded with Point Leo competitors medaling in all age groups. On Sunday, our competition team competed magnificently in larger, more challenging swell conditions. Our teams competed bravely and skillfully with many teams medaling. At carnivals end, our point score was sufficient to secure Second Place overall at the State Titles. Congratulations to all our Competition Team members on achieving such a fantastic result.

Congratulations must also be passed onto Claudia Whitfort (right) who was named Life Saving Victoria Under 14 Girls Beach Champion. This award is based on an individual's performance over the entire season and is given to the most outstanding beach competitor. Well done Claudia on winning such a prestigious award.



Future Challenges

The increased number of Nippers competing for Point Leo presents many challenges that need to be addressed. A major issue is our requirement to provide sufficient Water Safety personnel and equipment to cover our Carnival obligations. The contribution that parents and club members make to fulfill these obligations is invaluable and their efforts deserve special recognition. However, we need more Nipper parents who have their Bronze to train as IRB crew or drivers as we have a critical shortage of suitably qualified parents.

A feature of the 2012/2013 Junior Carnival Program was the high ratio of carnivals held at open beaches (especially West Coast beaches). It is expected that this trend will continue as water quality issues at bay beaches make the scheduling of carnivals at these venues a risky proposition. The challenge for us is to equip our competitors with the right level of skill and knowledge to compete confidently in open beach conditions. The continued evolution and expansion of the coaching program and the development of specialized coaches will dramatically improve the confidence and competence of all Nippers in surf conditions.

Acknowledgements

The involvement and support of Nipper parents is crucial to the success of Point Leo Nippers. The commitment of the IRB crews throughout training and competition needs to be acknowledged particularly the efforts of Blane Paton, Chris Gray and Chuck Warner.

Particular mention should be made of the outstanding work done by Gavin Taylor in managing the competition team in a thoroughly professional manner. His organisational skills and attention to detail ensured the smooth running of the competition program. The support provided by Pea Saunders, Iris Cassell and Dianne Summers should also be acknowledged. Finally a big thank-you to all the parents and club members who assisted with the myriad jobs associated with completing another successful season.

Cadets

The Cadet section of the Point Leo SLSC is continuing to develop a plan that encourages retention of members through the teenage years. Gear Steward

As a Club of nearly 1,000 members, Point Leo SLSC needs to maintain a vast inventory of equipment in order to meet the Club's Patrol, training and competition needs.

Patrol Equipment

Patrol and First Aid equipment must pass an annual LSV Gear Inspection and be maintained in good order to enable us to fulfil our Patrol obligations and serve the wider community. Random Patrol inspections are carried out throughout the season where Patrol equipment is re-inspected. Accordingly a significant percentage of the Club's budget is spent replacing, updating and repairing Patrol equipment.

Training

Each season over 400 Nippers make use of our Nipper craft as part of the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program. The Nipper board levy has enabled us to continually update and replace these boards as required. Considerable effort is required to keep these craft in good condition and damage to Club boards has been greatly reduced through an ongoing board-care education process. A small stock of Cadet boards is also maintained that are used by both Nippers and Seniors during training.

Competition

This season, the Club took delivery of a new Board and Ski trailer (pictured right). This was built to our specifications and manufactured locally by Advanced Trailers in Hastings. The galvanising of this trailer was kindly donated by Kingfield Galvanising and we would like to thank Steve Laussen (a Nipper parent) for organising this. This trailer experienced enormous use over summer (including being taken to Aussies) and has proved to be a fantastic asset to the Club. In addition, the 'old' Board and Ski trailer has been completely refurbished and is to be used by the Ski section over winter. The refurbishment of this trailer was performed free of charge by Eddie Batur Industrial Painting in Hastings. Thanks to Eddie for his generous contribution.



The Club also purchased two new 3x3 tents that were used by both Junior and Senior competition teams. These tents were a great success as they were easy to transport on and off the beach and simple to use.

The Junior board trailer is no longer suitable to meet our Nipper competition needs. We are in the process of designing and securing quotes to purchase a new trailer. This will be a significant purchase as the trailer will

be a lockable enclosed trailer that will be able to carry up to 60 Nipper boards plus sundry competition equipment. A major sponsor is required to help with this purchase.

Masters

Jack picked up his regular Gold in the 45+ Tube Race and Andrew won Gold in the 60+ Tube Race and the Surf Race.

Australian Masters Championships

Our team of three Masters at Aussies was even smaller than for Vics, but possibly stronger, with Frank Christian and Haydn Tierney joining Jon Ford.

Conditions at North Kirra were challenging, with a dumping bar and powerful sweep from the South.

Day 1: This was a real belter for Leo. Frank Christian won Silver in his Rescue Tube race and Haydn Tierney won Silver in his Ironman race. Haydn also placed fourth in the final of his surf race and Frank was sixth in the final of his surf race. Jon Ford and Frank made the final of their Board Rescue, placing sixth. Jon Ford also made the Ironman final.

Day 2: Frank, Jon and Haydn teamed up to win their semi-final of the Surf Teams and then collect Bronze in the final. This was a really exciting race, with Haydn and Frank out of the water in the first five, then great tension until Jon's orange cap emerged and the Officials spent 'forever' tallying the points.

At our Awards Night, President Ian Knight commented: "making a National final is a huge achievement – winning a medal is sensational...." This year Leo achieved seven finals and five medals, from a team of only three competitors.

Point Leo Swim Classic

Our Swim Classic, held annually on Boxing Day, is the club's biggest fundraiser held on the beach at Point Leo. It is also a great club day, an event that involves all club members and the success of the day does depend on the input of all of us at Point Leo.



Traditionally the day has featured the 1200m Flinders Hotel Point Leo Swim Classic as the prime event supported by the 400m Nipper and Novice Swims and the 4km Honeysuckle Beach Run. Another feature had been the John Marshall Memorial Surf Race, an event that had attracted the cream of Victoria's surf swimmers.

This year we were very lucky to have our event included in the Cousins Tours and Travel Great Victorian Swim Series (GVSS); our event being the first of seven events held around Victoria. As part of the GVSS and supported by Swimming Victoria (SV), it was agreed to introduce a new event, a 5km open water swim, fittingly named the Balnarring and District Community Bank 5km Challenge. Also it was decided to remove the John Marshall Memorial Surf Race from the program of events and, following discussions with LSV, the Open Male and Female Surf Races held at future Point Leo surf carnivals have been renamed the John Marshall Memorial Surf Races.

In the past, the success or not of the Swim Classic day has partly depended on the weather and the beach conditions at Point Leo. We have had some shockers – who will forget the 1998 swim when the weather that caused so much strife to the Sydney-Hobart Yacht Race also gave us some grief at Point Leo and also in 2011 when the notorious Leo southerly hit on Boxing Day. But the events did proceed.



This year we had excellent weather and the whole day proceeded accordingly. The 5km Challenge opened proceedings with almost 50 swimmers starting and the event went smoothly with Sam Sheppard (current National 5km Open Swim Champion) taking the honours. All swimmers who started finished the race within the 2 hour cut off time and one swimmer actually did butterfly all the way (right) – without a wetsuit! She did take a little while to recover and warm up however.

Swimming Victoria officials who were in attendance at Point Leo on the day were very complimentary about the way the 5km swim was conducted and are very keen to have the event on the SV calendar in the future.



The rest of the day went exceptionally well and overall there were a number of highlights:

- A record number of entries in each event (around 450!)
- the Golden Breed t-shirts were beautifully designed and proved to be very popular
- the net income from the day was double that of the previous year and probably the best ever
- all events started on time and the whole day was wrapped up by around 3pm

A number of club members have to be thanked for the success of the whole day, in particular the chairman of the organising committee, Lachlan Pearce and the event referee, Andrew Gibson. Both of these guys worked very hard and were well supported by members of the organising committee and the event section leaders. Too many names to mention here but they know who they are and their support on the day was very much appreciated by all involved with Point Leo SLSC.



The involvement of our active members in carrying out water safety (above) and patrolling duties on the day is critical to the day's success and many thanks to all involved in those arduous tasks. Without them the event would not happen and unfortunately their efforts are sometimes overlooked. Not this time!

Gary Tierney Foundation

The Gary Tierney Foundation's aim is to provide financial support to enable younger members of the Club to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving. Grants recognize and assist individuals who demonstrate the best of lifesaving – integrity, leadership and loyalty – and who have the potential to make an ongoing contribution to the Club.

The Foundation was established in 2010 following Gary's untimely death. It seeks to perpetuate his memory and also continue the very important nurturing and supportive role that he undertook with young lifesavers.

In the three years since it was formed, the Foundation has now firmly established itself, recognising and assisting a fine cohort of Point Leo members and building its financial base to ensure a sustainable future.

Each year the Foundation awards a Grant to one or more members who demonstrate the best of lifesaving – integrity, leadership and loyalty – and who have the potential to make an ongoing contribution to the Club. Grants are generally payable over three years and are intended to benefit young members who may be constrained in fulfilling their potential by reason of their financial circumstances or who will otherwise benefit from financial assistance.

Fundraising

With the generous support of Club members (past and present), the Club Committee and the Tierney family, the Foundation is now secure and well on the way to achieving its target of \$200,000. This is the capital amount considered necessary for the Foundation to ensure that it can be self-sustaining for decades to come. As at June 2013, the Foundation's Balance stood at almost \$150,000, an increase of \$30,000 over the year.

During the course of the year there were a number of fundraising activities, including at Bobbas lunches. Last year's grand cocktail party, hosted by Louise Tierney at her home in Eureka Towers at Southbank, was considered too hard an act to follow and the Advisory Board decided to hold over the next cocktail function until later in 2013. This will be held at the offices of the international law firm, K & L Gates, in the Rialto Building (courtesy of Andrew Mansour) and will be a very special and fun event.

Foundation Grant Recipient 2013: Rose Anderson

Rose Anderson is the fourth recipient of a Foundation Grant and the only recipient in 2013. She was formally acknowledged at the Foundation Award Presentation on 5 January 2013 attended by Louise Tierney and sons Mark and Haydn.

The award was made by Haydn Tierney who noted that Rose, who is currently Club Chief Instructor, a position that encompasses the training and mentoring of our younger members in the critical aspects of lifesaving, had been a member of Leo since joining as a Nipper in 1994. Rose has had great success as a competitor, winning numerous pennants in local carnivals and medallions at State Titles and capping it all off with a Gold Medal as a member of the 2011 Australian Open Women's 5 Person R & R.

Rose is not only a fierce and esteemed competitor and role model, she is considered incredibly loyal to her friends and to Point Leo SLSC. And, of course, a highlight of her competitive years was the fact that it was Gary Tierney who coached her and the other "Poodles" to a Silver Medal at the Nationals in 2006.

In accepting the Award, Rose said "Thank you so much. This is a great honour. Not only to be recognised for my contributions to the club but also to be awarded with such a prestigious award, in honour of such an influential person in both my Surf Life Saving career and life."

Financial Statements and Governance

The Gary Tierney Foundation Fund is a sub-fund of the general Gift Fund of the Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Incorporated. The Club has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office as a deductible gift recipient in respect of its general Gift Fund. The Foundation was established to support and raise funds for the Club consistent with its purposes but so as to provide for a designated Gary Tierney Foundation Fund Grant.

As a sub-fund, the Foundation's finances are audited as part of the Club's Statutory Audit. A separate account is maintained to ensure that all amounts donated to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with the approved purposes as specified in the Foundation's Governance Charter. The Foundation's Charter and Grant Policy were approved by the Club Committee in December 2010.



With us we had Bob Hooper and John Olsen (Point Lonsdale), Peter Moore (Torquay) and Gary Johnson (Anglesea), all guys who are still active in the ocean swim series but who also were top surf swimmers back in the early days. Also in attendance that day was Jeff Byrne an early day Leo member now living in WA who held State Junior titles and represented SLSV (as it then was) at a National carnival in 1961-62.

John Olsen won the John Marshall Memorial Surf Race in 1958 and again in 1960 and his recollections of being awarded the winning trophy by UK actress Sabrina, with the obligatory congratulatory kiss, were worth hearing. In the State Senior surf race in 1961-62 Bob Hooper won Gold with Peter Moore winning Bronze. As you can imagine there were a few stories doing the rounds at that particular luncheon.

Also during the year the annual Golf Day was organised by Brian Horwood and held at Flinders Golf Club. Although fundraising isn't a focus at these functions, the Bobbas were able to donate to the club around \$1000 for the Gary Tierney Foundation and \$200 for the competitors BBQ at the Nationals at North Kirra. A number of Bobbas assisted Steve, Dick and Max at Nipper BBQs and also helped out at the tin shakes in Mornington.

Honorary Life Members

President's Trophies


Three President's Trophies are presented annually, one Junior, one Senior and the Dick Catterick Award (in honour of our clubhouse caretaker from the 70s and 80s). They are the highest annual awards that the Club can bestow on one of its members. The trophies are awarded on the basis of the acceptance of the duties of a member and the provision of leadership in the Club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct and demeanour.

President's Award (Senior) – Lachlan Pearse

This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more Club and Lifesaving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct.

It is with great pleasure I announce the winner of the President's Award for season 2012/2013 is Lachlan (Lochie) Pearse. Lochie is an outstanding Club member who has a major and significant involvement in numerous areas of the Club, along with a committed involvement to the broader Life Saving movement as well. During the current season and for many past seasons Lochie has taken up leadership and management roles in a large variety of areas that have served Point Leo SLSC with distinction. Surf Sports Awards

The Athlete of the Year Awards recognise the athletes who demonstrated sporting excellence in competition as well as contributed to the areas of sport within lifesaving. The award criteria include: significant performances from Life Saving sanctioned events only, representative teams, major competitions, and outstanding achievement during the current season.

Male Athlete of the Year – Haydn Tierney

The Athlete of the Year award for Open men was based on the results from competitors in Open or Masters. This year Haydn Tierney ventured up to the Gold Coast to try his hand at Aussies and came back with 2 medals; silver for 30-34 Ironman and bronze for 130+ Surf Teams. Any medal at Aussies is a massive achievement particularly in an event as challenging as ironman. Haydn has managed to juggle the demands of a young family with his training schedule and still came out with some fantastic results. This is in no small part due to his amazing fitness base born from many years of hard training.



Female Athlete of the Year – Natalie Dimitrakas



This year there was not a large number of Open women's competitors but Nat, to her great credit, competed up two age groups in the Open races in addition to her U17 racing commitments. She achieved some fantastic results at States including Bronze in the Open Women's Belt Race and a Silver in the Open Women's Rescue Tube Rescue. Most notable was the Open Women's Surf race which Nat finished 5th in, even though this was immediately after the U17 Women's Surf race 2nd. With competitors like Nat competing up in Open and getting these great results the future of the Point Leo senior team looks very bright!

Junior Male Athlete of the Year – Zachary Richter

Zac put in a brutal training regime in January/February and the results really paid off at States. Overall Zac won eight medals including Gold in the Open Surf Teams, U19 Surf Teams and U19 Belt Race; Silver in the U19 Ski Race and U19 Board Relay; and Bronze in the Open Belt Race, U19 Ironman and U19 Surf Race. Zac had been heard at a December carnival saying "I'm not a ski paddler" so it was thrilling for all involved to see him place 2nd in the U19 Individual Ski! Although the results are not considered for the Junior Athlete of the Year Award, it is worth stating that Zac competed up in a number of Open events, thereby greatly assisting the club in gaining points. In addition to Zac's great efforts at States, he also made the journey up to Aussies (on a limited preparation due to illness) and competed bravely against some hot competition and a persistent chest infection.



Junior Female Athlete of the Year – Abby Lethlean



Abby has been a consistent high performer since her nipper days and this year she continued to deliver at both States and Aussies. At States her highlights included Gold in the U17 Surf Teams and U17 Board Rescue; Silver in the U17 Tube Race, U17 Ski Relay and Open Rescue Tube Rescue; and Bronze in the U17 Taplin Relay. However her resilience and racing experience really shone through at Aussies. She worked with other competitors to reach the final of the U17 Women's Taplin Relay and individually made the semi-finals of U17 Women's Iron and Tube. These results were in spite of a limited preparation with a few weeks in Greece shortly before Aussies! Abby's results reflected her fantastic attitude to training, particularly in the pool.

Service and Vigilance Awards

The two awards for outstanding contribution to patrol at Point Leo SLSC are Junior Patroller of the Year and Senior Patroller of the Year. The two awards this year went to very deserving members Trystan Precht and Jason Johansson.

Trystan was awarded Junior Patroller of the Year and has shown a strong dedication to patrols over a number of seasons, spending over 200 hours on patrol since 2009, with 76 hours in this season alone! Whilst this is impressive, it is not nearly as impressive as Trystan's commitment to helping all aspects of patrol from everything to setting up and packing up to actively seeking out things that needed doing on patrol and engaging other members on patrol.

Jason was awarded Senior Patroller of the Year having returned to Point Leo this season after spending time all over Australia with competitive lifesaving and Ironman competitions. Those lucky enough to have patrolled with Jason would know the impact he had on patrols, providing the most extensive knowledge of life saving and patrols of anybody in the club. Jason was very keen to share this knowledge and his skills with all members, SRC or Bronze, and also some of the great experiences he has had. I wish Jason all the very best as he continues around Australia, and look forward to welcoming him back to his original (and favourite!) club again soon.

Life Saving Victoria Awards of Excellence

The Life Saving Victoria Awards of Excellence were held on Saturday 13th July. This year several Point Leo SLSC members won their respective categories. Below are the citations from the evening for each of our winners.

Volunteer Assessor of the Year – Bree Ambry

This award recognises the assessor who has made a significant contribution to the assessment and training of club lifesavers. Bree has helped to facilitate and coordinate a cohesive district approach to training and assessment in the Mornington/Flinders district, and has donated a huge amount of time at club, district and state level. Bree conducts herself in a professional, organised and personable manner and her hard work has translated into a unified regional training and assessment team, as well as large increases in the number of members undertaking assessments at both Point Leo and the wider region.

Education Instructor of the Year - Michelle Royal-Hebblewhite

This award recognises the contribution of an individual who has demonstrated outstanding leadership, passion and commitment for LSV's water safety Education programs. As an LSV Education Instructor since 2009 and a current member of Point Leo SLSC, Michelle demonstrates a high level of teamwork, energy and professionalism when delivering LSV's Beach Programs, Open Water Learning Experience and Meet a Lifeguard programs to a variety of ages and groups, including multicultural communities. Last year Michelle was appointed lead writer of LSV's new Sink or Swim education program. She showed true commitment to the program, also delivering classroom sessions in 39 schools across Victoria. Michelle ensured every session would make a difference to students' current water safety understanding as well as a long term difference to their future practices. The success of Sink or Swim in its pilot year is a credit to the commitment shown by Michelle.

Administration Club of the Year

This award encourages and recognises outstanding achievements in LSV club administration. (Clubs with a salaried administrator are not eligible for this award.) Point Leo SLSC has fulfilled all requirements of Group A, B and C of the Administration Grant on time, returned copies of First Aid and Incident reports on time and ensured they were represented at the Lifesaving Conference. In addition to this, Point Leo SLSC consistently demonstrates excellence in membership processing and management and is always willing to assist other clubs with improving their membership renewal processes.

Life Membership – Andrew Barnes

LSV Life Membership is awarded for state-based service to Life Saving Victoria. In 2012/2013, Andrew Barnes joins those who have rendered distinguished voluntary service to Life Saving Victoria that is both sustained and a conspicuous contribution. Andrew is a proud and active member of the Point Leo SLSC, which he joined in December 1975. He is a Life Member of Point Leo, has held the roles of Chief Instructor and President and has been a dedicated and successful competitor. He has also made a dedicated contribution at a state level since 1993, including Member of the Board of Examiners, State Council Delegate

Chair and member of the Honours and Awards committee. As an Honours and Awards committee member he is a passionate activist in the pursuit for volunteer service recognition, which he has taken to a national level by joining the SLSA Honours and Awards Committee. Andrew also participated in the development of the LSV Volunteer Recognition manual. Andrew we take this opportunity to recognise and thank you for your contribution of in-depth knowledge of nomination processes and your dedication to the pursuit of service recognition for all your fellow lifesavers, by awarding you Life Membership of Life Saving Victoria.

Beach Lifeguard of the Year – Lachlan Pearce

This award recognises the professional lifeguard who has demonstrated an outstanding contribution to the delivery and development of the LSV Beach Lifeguard Services. Lachlan epitomises professionalism in the modern age of lifeguarding through his personal conduct, leadership, commitment to public safety and positive attitude. In the 2012/2013 season Lachlan was promoted to the position of Senior Lifeguard for Gunnamatta. He showed insight beyond his years and led by example to empower and mentor younger guards. Lachlan has promoted the notion of proactive lifeguarding, lowering the rescue statistics at Gunnamatta by nearly half, as well as doubling the number of preventative actions in peak times.
