It is a credit to our club members that we continued to communicate, collaborate and support each other in this very strange and difficult time.

Simon Merrigan

After four years of service to our club as President, Simon Merrigan decided to hand the reins over at the end of 2020. On behalf of all members, thank you Simon for your contribution. During Simon's tenure, he set a tone of collaboration that has encouraged and enabled many great projects. Over Simon's time, Point Leo SLSC has formed and strengthened a partnership with the Balnarring and District Branch of the Bendigo Bank, working together on projects that benefit the community. With regards to our core function of protecting our beach-going community, there has also been a consistent improvement in our patrol scores on audit and increased patrol sizes with full awards across the whole season. On a personal level, Simon is part of the dedicated team on the clubhouse and facilities planning project and he has liaised with local, State and Federal government resulting in what may be our biggest single fundraising amount for the building and facility upgrades. Simon will continue contributing to

our club on the committee as Vice President Funding and Sponsorship and as a member of the Future Project Sub-committee.

COVID-19

The season kicked off with lifesaving training and this was a challenge in the height of COVID-19 restrictions. Brittany Morgenthaler as Chief Instructor did an amazing job leading an incredible team of volunteers to deliver SRC, Bronze, other courses and Skills Maintenance sessions in very restrictive conditions. Patrols, once again, ran incredibly smoothly over the season so congratulations and thanks to our Club Captain, Adam Lipszyc, and Vice Club Captain, Andy Nott. Many thanks also to all the Patrol Captains and their teams in keeping our beach safe and presenting such a welcoming and settled environment.

Throughout the season we had some days with record numbers on the beach resulting in

some hectic days which kept our patrols very busy with the added challenge of adhering to COVID-19 plans. Patrol members of all ages performed with maturity and professionalism across the summer, and it was particularly pleasing to see good attendance at patrols. Keeping each other and the public safe at Point Leo beach is our main purpose, and we fulfilled our duties here.

Special mention to Bridget Barnes for organising another successful Pink Patrol to celebrate female involvement in Lifesaving. There were some fabulous speakers and loads of pink stuff!



Well done also to Adam Lipszyc for organising the first Pride Patrol in Victoria demonstrating our club's commitment to openness, respect and inclusion for people's diversity. Adam demonstrated so much leadership, passion and innovation in this space.

Club Captain's Report

Many of us will be happy to turn the page on the 2020-2021 season just gone and look to the future. Yet we have much to reflect upon and even more to celebrate over the past few chaotic months. Patrols, believe it or not, continued throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. This took significant coordination, flexibility and effort from all involved. I want to thank all our patrolling members for their efforts. A special mention to the Patrol Captains who took the greatest burden upon their shoulders. They dealt with changes including restricted numbers, restricted clubhouse access, consistent weekend patrols and lots of PPE. A special mention also to the Pandemic Team that coordinated club activity throughout the season and to the broader committee for their efforts in supporting patrols throughout.

Brittany Morgenthaler has achieved what many were unable to do this season, in that she spearheaded multiple camps over the summer months. The workflow and re-arrangements experienced by patrols was child's-play compared with the strict and constantly changing modifications imposed upon the training section. Maximum capacities and limited clubhouse access meant that the training teams had to adapt like never before. I am astounded that we have had so many candidates achieve awards. On a similar vein, a big shout out to Andrew Gibson and Chuck Warner for their efforts in ensuring the IRB course could continue throughout the season. These awards are the bedrock upon which patrols rely – without them, the patrol structure simply falls apart. A hearty congratulations to the entire training team for their wonderful efforts.

Congratulations to our incredible sports sections. While many of us, myself included, let restrictions be an excuse to not exercise, the competition teams trained as best they could, again dealing with significant imposed limitations. The dedication of course paid off with resounding results right across the spectrum: from our Boaties to our Masters, there was a level of success that the Club hasn't ever

experienced before – literally, there were awards won and feats accomplished that are not recorded in the Club's history! We congratulate all our competitors for their efforts and spirit, we commend our coaches, trainers and managers for their exemplary work in a very tough season and we recognise all those whose contributions make competition possible, including our IRB crews, our officials, our drivers of trailers and so on.

The Club Committee was, as always, diligently working right across the entire year. While significant efforts were redirected due to COVID-19, resulting in the formation of the Pandemic Team, there has been significant progress with respect to future planning and grants received. The Future Project Sub-committee has been tirelessly working in the background to garner further financial support, and local government support, to proceed with the later stages of our build. The Grants Department (ie Mick Treadwell) has been very busy, applying – with great success – for a number of grants that have allowed the Club to remain in the black despite very challenging economic times.

I want to make special note of two Patrol projects of great importance. The Pink Patrol was delivered successfully, after several tricky reschedules. The Pink Patrol serves to recognise the incredible efforts of our female members and aims to inspire many more female members to participate in all the different aspects of lifesaving the Club has to offer. We are blessed to have so many unique and wonderful female role models, many of whom have supported me personally with their advice and mentorship.

Additionally, the Club hosted its first ever Pride Patrol. As far as I can tell, it may well be the first Pride Patrol in LSV history! It aims to recognise and celebrate the diversity of our members, while acknowledging the hurdles that have been and remain in situ for the LGBTQIA+ community. I am so proud of those who helped coordinate and deliver these events – they serve to publicly

broadcast our inclusive nature to the public – so thank you to all involved and watch this space!

Gear & Equipment

COVID-19-safe compliance impacted all aspects of the 2020-2021 season and particularly the safe maintenance and provision of equipment for lifesaving activities. Every area of our operation had to be re-thought and modified accordingly. To keep the public and our members safe, PPE and suitable medical waste management practices had to be instituted for all patrols.

Disinfection of equipment had to be maintained and strict protocols observed. Training and award activities that would normally take place indoors were conducted outdoors under tents and socially distanced. In some instances where equipment had to be shared (such as training manikins) additional equipment had to be purchased.

The Nipper program had to be re-imagined so that sharing of equipment was minimised or eliminated and each Nipper group was safely isolated from each other. We had a wonderful crew of parent volunteers led by Andrew Ford who setup and packed up all the Nipper equipment for every session and made sure COVID-19 guidelines were observed.

The Club spent money on new equipment where required, but also increased our efforts to secure grants to help defray costs. We secured a significant grant to completely cover the servicing and maintenance of our ATV, IRB motors and club trailers. We also recently (May 2021) took delivery of a new Can-Am ATV (below) that was 50% funded through a specific grant program, and we are awaiting the imminent arrival of a new Kawasaki Mule ATV that is fully

funded through a donation from BlueScope Westernport and a government grant.

Other successful grants have allowed us to purchase tents, rescue boards, manikins, rescue tubes, lifejackets and a new oxygen kit.

Congratulations and thanks to Mick Treadwell who is a one-man grant-seeking machine, for the endless hours of work required to apply for these grants.



Finally, the ongoing maintenance and organisation of this equipment is a massive task. Particular thanks must go to Andrew Gibson (our VP Facilities), Nick Clark and Chuck Warner for their constant help in repairing and organising our equipment. Once again thanks to Travis Cargill for allowing us to store the Nipper trailer off-site.

Chief Instructor's Report

What a season it has been for the Club and the community. Due to COVID-19 impacting our training we had several courses running

throughout the season. It was an enormous task to ensure every member's awards were updated through Skills Maintenance. We

worked very hard to ensure these courses and Skills Maintenance would be able to run as well as be successful for all members and the community.

The training started in late October 2020 and continued through to late April 2021. Over the season we held:

- Five SRC courses (12 per course)
- Three Bronze Medallion courses (12 per course)
- Two First Aid courses
- IRB Crew and Driver course
- Adult Bronze course (run by Andrew Gibson and Jane Starr)

As well as our new awards we conducted 29 Skills Maintenance sessions throughout the season.

Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) Camp

This season's SRC camp was very different from the past. Due to COVID-19 we were unable to have participants sleepover. The participants were divided into five different groups that each completed the course over three days starting in late October and finishing in January. A massive thank you to all parents for their assistance, as well as all members who helped with the courses.

The 2020-2021 Bronze course was also very different from what we knew as Bronze camp, being split into three different groups. Participants had to go home each day and return the following morning, with groups being

Team Manager's Report

After a year without events, Life Saving Sport was presented very differently this year. We were forever perched ready for the starter's gun that sometimes just did not go off. Training and carnivals were held to ransom by COVID-19 restrictions and beach quality issues. Many plans were made and discarded as clubs and affiliates worked to find how lifesaving sport could look over the 2020-2021 season. Our pool lifesaving events were cancelled as the season progressed. We are grateful for the work completed by our own Point Leo COVID-19 Pandemic Team and coaches and the LSV and State Government bodies that worked tirelessly together to ensure that we were finally able to attend sporting events.

Turning up to events was a new experience with QR coding, COVID Marshals, caps on entry numbers and restrictions on levels of spectators. This is now a real and present regulator within our sport. We attended events at Mordialloc (restricted to beach events at the last minute), Lorne, Ocean Grove, and Jan Juc (restricted to Water events at the last minute). Altona (beach carnival) was supported by youth athletes and was a double up for the Masters to complete this component of their championships.

Despite these necessary adjustments we had some great experiences including making Point Leo history with our Masters team taking out the 2021 Victorian Masters Championships title. A wise man said that '80% of success is just showing up' and Point Leo Masters did just that! The Championship event was held over two separate days of separate disciplines. Including our boat team (Point Leo Platos below) we won 32 Gold, 31 Silver and 25 Bronze medals with points gained from a majority of top 6 placings to take out the title with an outstanding 503 points.

Congratulations to all of the members who took part in the preparation, the race days, the eleventh hour recruits, to create such an incredible result. Thanks again to the team of officials and frontline supporters that joined our

village. Congratulations to Andrew Gibson, Jon Ford and team for creating powerful synergy and everyone who contributed to a sense of belonging in this group. There is now a strong foundation set for the future of Masters competition under the orange cap.

Our Open State Championships was held at Lorne and this event was a wonderful weekend. We fielded a team of 40+ athletes ranging from Youth, Senior and Masters (Boats). Our Boats were cancelled due to severe surf conditions and were forced to reconvene at a later date to complete their events. We had some amazing highlights in the beach area with our Youth members taking out several Gold medals in the Beach Relays and Sprint events. Our Open competitors fared well with Gold in the 2k run, the Open Surf Race, U19 Single Ski and our Open Female Taplin Relay Team. Hannah Cester won the Under 15 Champion Lifesaver event to go on and represent Victoria in the same event at the National Titles. Our boaties 'The Pachyderms' scored a Bronze medal and 'Platos' (below) scored valuable club points at their rescheduled event. We finished in 10th place with 129 points.



We had a small but enthusiastic team attend the Australian Titles at the Sunshine Coast in Queensland. There were approximately 6000 people in attendance across the two weeks of the event. Hannah Cester represented Victoria in the Champion Lifesaver event and placed ninth. During the following days, The Platos surfboat crew and Jon Ford attended the Masters National Championships at Alexandra Headlands. Despite some hard racing and amazing starts the wave gods were not in our alley and the Platos were out of the running after 3 races. Jon Ford, coming off the back of the State Masters win, was out pursuing a personal goal. Jon was successful in placing 5th overall in the 55-59 Ironman event for a great finish to the summer season for him. Truly an amazing effort.

Our Open competitors had it tough from the outset with fierce competition racing alongside the elite of the elite of Iron men and women. Highlights included Isabella Austin making it through to the Quarter finals of the U19 Single Ski and U19 Board Race, Henry (Harry) Atkins and Myles Irwin making it through a round in Open Ski and Josh Doherty making it through a round of Open Board Race.

Our Support Team of the Head Coach and his team of coaches, IRB crews, water safety and our incredible Officials are important members of the team who build the foundations for the team behind the scenes.

Head Coach's Report

The 2020-2021 season for the Club and Surf Sports was like no other. To be successful in Surf Sports, particularly at a national level, requires a strong and consistent training base, finely honed skills and race practice against the best in the country. Due to COVID-19 our Point Leo athletes missed almost 2 years of interstate competition and were not able to train from February – December 2020. In addition, several of our athletes such as Matt Graves, Hannah Scott and Lachlan Robinson had season ending surgery. Despite these obstacles the Surf Sports squad regrouped quickly once restrictions lifted

to train strongly from December 2020 to April 2021, get some great results at the Victorian State Titles and put together a small but committed squad that attended the Aussies at the Sunshine Coast. Comradery was a big part of negotiating a tricky season. It was also very encouraging to see a large number of U14/15 athletes train with Amber Skehan and Di Summers on board and attend the States. This augurs well for the future of the Senior squad.

Special mention to the 50 odd Masters athletes who responded to the call to train over January

This culminated in 45 Masters competing at the water and beach events and us being overall points winners for the first time in the Club's history! The lessons learnt from 2020-2021 are already being reflected upon resulting in planning for a bigger and better 2021-2022 season. The Masters are continuing to train on Sundays (9am swim) and Wednesdays (6.30am paddle) and for impromptu downwind paddles. The Masters and Seniors are planning several individual and team entries in the iconic Coolangatta Gold this October 2021. A major team management and coaching restructure will see unparalleled opportunity for our youth section to grow.

Surf Boat Report

It's been a promising season for the Boat section. Whilst we continue to develop our crews, we are also establishing the foundations for the future of surf boat rowing at the Club.

We are extremely proud to have secured sponsorship for a new surfboat this season. The new boat was delivered late in May. Masters Report

The Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Masters team had an exceptional season in 2021. For the first time in over thirty years of competing, the Club won the overall State Masters Championship.

The competition this year was held over two separate days: at Lorne for Water events and Altona for Beach. This very successful format is likely to be repeated in 2022 allowing greater participation from athletes in all chosen events and easier access for the Beachies. The Club dominated both carnivals with a team of 45 athletes attending over the two days. It was amazing to see so many new athletes, regardless of capabilities, having a go; most coming home with a medal or two. The Point Leo Club spirit was on full display with great camaraderie and many laughs. Our final point score of 503 more than doubled the second placed club.

There were some great individual performances at States with Head Coach Jon Ford the absolute standout of the Carnival, coming home with his 6th consecutive Victorian Ironman title, five Gold medals, 3 Silver and one Bronze. Other standouts included Jane Starr (4 Gold, 2 Silver), Nathan Millar (4 Gold, 2 Silver, 2 Bronze), Dana Sawyer, Dave Russell and Michelle Ford (3 Gold + minor medals).

Jon Ford (right) went on to be the Club's only individual athlete at the Australian Masters Championships. He made the final of the Ironman and finished in fifth place, achieving a long-standing personal goal. We are all very proud of Jon's performance.

Whilst the Club has always had a few athletes who dominate their age group, this season we fielded a large team with a good spread of abilities, really bolstering our points tally. This was largely due to great recruiting of Nipper parents in the lead up to the season and regular Masters training sessions three times weekly during the summer holidays. These sessions are now continuing on a Wednesday morning (Martha Cove at 6am), Saturdays (downwind paddling session) and Sundays (mobile ocean swim at 9am). There is already a planned Masters Coolangatta Gold team heading to Queensland in October and a number of Masters already committed to the 2022 Aussies in Perth.

Special thanks from the Club's Masters team go to Iris Cassell who after many years as our Team Manager is stepping down. Iris has had a long-term goal to win State Masters and she achieved this in 2021! She will continue to be a presence on the beach but her leadership and support of our Masters athletes will be greatly missed.

She was a consistent top 3 performer at Victorian carnivals and came away with 10 medals at the Victorian State Titles, including Gold in Open Taplin Relay and Bronze medals in Open Ski, Open Board, Open Double Ski, Open Board Relay, Open Ski Relay, and Open Iron (deciding not to prioritise this over U19 Iron). Bella narrowly missed the Aussie finals in Open Mixed Double Ski, Open Double Ski, U19 Board and U19 Ski and was our best competitor at this event. Congratulations Bella for being the recipient of the Open Female Athlete of the Year Award.

Masters Athlete of the Year - Jon Ford

Jon has competed in Masters events over many years and each year he has had some great takeaways and ponderings from his competitive racing. This season was an exceptional one. Jon actively engaged the largest Point Leo Masters team to compete at the LSV State Masters Championships. He dedicated a program of training specifically to create a 'can do' attitude amongst the Masters team who thrived from the outset and progressively grew in numbers. The Taplin Relay is a premium event of 3 disciplines - Board, Swim and Ski. Thank you to this team for their support, commitment and seemingly endless hours of meetings and planning. They strived to ensure our Nipper program did operate this season, wanted to focus on positively delivering a COVID Safe program, operating within the extensive COVID Government restrictions and new LSV requirements.

Nippers did look different, but the usual friendly Nipper faces made it all worthwhile. We concentrated on what we **could** do this season and our objectives for Nippers were focussed on participation, connection, fun and wellbeing, skill development and maintaining the quality of our program.

The Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club was one of the biggest programs in Victoria to operate in the 2020-2021 season under COVID-19 restrictions. Thanks to the tireless efforts of Kim Williams as Registrar, we were able to open our Nipper program to 404 Nippers this season with the Cubs and Lions participating on separate days for the first time.

They then entered the beach via the new path created on the Eastern side of the clubhouse. Many thanks to Andrew Gibson for co-ordinating this with the Foreshore.



The four beach areas were fenced with bunting for family spectators, with our AGM and AAGM in their unit-coloured vests. Nippers didn't move around the beach to their normal rotations, instead they remained in their beach area with activity leaders swapping between water and

beach activities. COVID-19 restrictions meant Nipper sessions were concentrated into smaller groups with less movement. There was a great appreciation of all the AGMs and AAGMs and Activity Leaders who took on board the strict COVID-19 Government restrictions and assisted in these roles, some for the first time. Thank you all for taking on these roles and adapting to our new way of operating for the season.

Particular thanks to the following people who spent countless hours preparing for the very different Nipper season which required a heightened level of planning and coordination. Andrew Welsh who spearheaded our gear and equipment preparation, management and allocation to ensure we were COVID safe at all times. Andrew Ford for coordinating the beach set up crews, Sarah Somogyi who co-ordinated the many volunteer online rosters and Alex McManamey who prepared the spreadsheets and information for AGMs and Dee Longwill for her ongoing superb administration skills in uploading all the Nipper information to the LSV system.

Thanks also to our beach setup and pack-up crews, COVID-19 Marshals, First Aid Officers and various admin support volunteers. Without you the JSLP wouldn't run.

The newest addition to the JSLP session volunteers were the unit COVID-19 Officers donning their blue vests. The COVID-19 Officers ensured all protocols were followed. Never have our flags and boards been so clean! The scene on the beach was not the normal hustle and bustle of a large group of 250 Nippers. Instead, it was a calmer affair with only 80 Nippers on the beach at one time for only one hour rather than the normal two hours. Surf Education had to be embedded into the sessions as for the first time there was no access to the clubhouse.

While carnivals were challenging and limited this season, the Sunday Sessions for Nippers were a great opportunity to build skills, for those who were interested, and an enhanced pathway to competition. Thank you to Daniel Kogler who co-ordinated the Nipper Sunday Sessions.

While the 2020-2021 season was different, I think that all enjoyed the unexpected opportunities it presented for families. Nippers highlighted the importance of the social connections to other members and the importance of developing children's surf skills, confidence and awareness.

It was a great privilege to be the JSLP Co-ordinator for the 2020-2021 season and to follow in my mother's footsteps. It is amazing to think that the program has more than doubled in size since the 1990's when she was co-ordinator. A great demonstration of what an important program it is and what a special part it plays in the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club.

Junior Surf Sports Program (JSSP)

Water Safety

A big thank you to Chuck Warner for coordinating the IRB team each session and our Water Safety Co-ordinators this year, Michael Westaway (Lions) and Adam Kyriacou (Cubs) who ensured our Nippers were kept safe in the water. Thank you to all our Senior members and

Nipper parents who were water safety captains for each water area. A huge thank you also to all our youth members who helped with water safety. Our Nipper program simply cannot operate without our safety requirements being met and to see our Cadets and Active Juniors come back and help years after they have graduated is just fantastic. This was one of the first opportunities for these young people to socialise after months of lockdown. Due to the restrictions of the Nipper program, water safety was needed for 3 x 1 hour blocks with half an hour in between. The last hour of water safety everyone needed to dig deep. Thanks to the quick thinking of Sarah-Jo and the assistance of some Bobbas, water safety managed to sustain themselves with the only BBQ of the 2020-2021 season.

Thanks also to our many IRB drivers and crews who spend hours in the boat on Nipper days, but also spend hours setting up the cans and doing all that is required to get the IRBs into and out of the water each session.

Junior Competition

The 2020-2021 Junior Competition season was certainly one like no other. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19, LSV Nipper Competition was restricted to the U12/13 age groups only, with just two local carnivals – Mordialloc (beach events only, due to water quality) and Ocean Grove, with the State Championships in March 2021 held in Warrnambool.

Our younger age groups competed in a carnival at Lorne hosted by Surf Sports Development (a private business). It was a fabulous opportunity for the youngsters to either have a go in a competition scenario, or for our seasoned competitors to race.

All our competing Nippers are to be commended this season. They rallied from the disappointment of minimal carnival activity, to embody the Point Leo spirit in the three carnivals

on offer. The Mordialloc carnival was a beach event only so our water-loving Nippers replaced their goggles with flags and batons and gave it their all. The Ocean Grove carnival was a fabulous day, with all our U12/13 competitors enjoying the surf and finally being back in the water racing.

We took 38 U12/13 Nippers to Warrnambool to compete in a COVID-19 restricted Junior State Lifesaving Championships. There were some outstanding performances at the State Championships, all of which are noted later in this report, but special mentions include:

- Point Leo came second overall in the Junior State Lifesaving Championships to Ocean Grove SLSC
- The March Past Team, led by Jan Williams and Dianne and John Silver, were outstanding, and brought home a Bronze medal
- Charlie Farrell won the LSV U13 Champion Athlete – Boys Water Award 2021
- Point Leo won three out of the four individual board race medals, and the U13 girls board relay in heavy, unpredictable surf; a testament to the hard work they put in during the season in the JSSP, under the tutelage of Nick Clarke
- The three young seniors, Madison Clark, Nat Clarke and Jasper Romari, excelled all weekend, in supporting the team, volunteering to do unscheduled water safety to keep the carnival going, and exemplified the culture and environment of our club

Of course, Nippers cannot compete without a team of volunteers and a coach. Thank-you to Nick Clarke, who managed to motivate, inspire and encourage our Nippers. The results speak for themselves. To the AGMs who kept me on track and corralled their Nippers and the army of volunteers that completed water safety, IRB driving/crewing, officiating, pack/set up, trailer driving and cheering – thank-you. There are too many to name – you all know who you are.

To all the Nippers who worked hard throughout the season and persevered through all of the challenges that COVID-19 threw at you – congratulations. You should all be extremely proud of yourselves. I was proud to represent

Youth

This season saw a resurgence of the club youth program. We took a different approach and thanks to a group of enthusiastic parents, the “Lion’s Den” was born. We called the annual seasonal (December/January) Youth Program the Lion’s Den, so the Club has a program with a welcoming and nurturing appeal. The program offers a special place for this age group where they feel valued and wanted that is different from Nippers and, most importantly, reflects the Club’s overall wholistic approach to youth wellbeing.

- Do fun things and keep in touch with lifesaving friends
- Keep up lifesaving skills and fitness
- Learn new lifesaving skills and discover new experiences
- Understand how other parts of the Club operate
- Be inspired to stay involved in surf lifesaving over the longer term

The centrepiece of the Lion’s Den was the Swim Camp. It included several essential dimensions of the overall Youth Program and incorporated the fundamental skill required to be a great surf lifesaver – swimming. It was a special and

This year we were pleased to appoint three new Life Members to the Point Leo SLSC:

Marc Aliotti joined the Club in 2001 and was a committee member for eight years, including three as President (2007-2009). He has held multiple lifesaving awards including the always-

required IRB Driver and Crew to ensure we can cover patrol, water safety and Nipper program commitments.

During his 19 years of service Marc has averaged 22 hours patrol each season, which is above the club and competition requirements. At the time of his appointment to Life Membership, Marc had won 20 Masters State Championship medals, 13 of which were Gold, but was more importantly valued by the team for his enthusiastic club spirit in supporting all athletes to achieve their best.

Marc is a highly valued all-round club member who actively supports club events and fundraising.

Louise Tierney joined the Club in 1973 as a member of the Women's Auxiliary that ran fundraising and social events and supported the

running of the Point Leo carnivals each season. This work included the behind-the-scenes work required when “Leo was Alive in 1985” as host of the Australian Championships. Louise was also a lead member of the small sub-committee who planned and coordinated the 50th Anniversary celebrations.

Louise has always supported her family’s interest in surf sports and the development of young people, which is most evident in her work to launch the Gary Tierney Foundation in 2010 to support active members to achieve their goals in lifesaving training, sport, patrols and community development. Louise has served on the Foundation board since its launch.

Louise continues to show her passion for all things orange as an annual member of the support crew at State and Aussie Titles and is easy to spot at Nippers sharing the love for Leo with the next generation.

Dr John Silver gained his Bronze Medallion in 1959. In his early years, while studying medicine he was one of the most popular and charismatic members of the Club and a fine athlete, representing the Club in the Beach Sprint, Flags,

Beach Relay and March Past events at surf carnivals, recording numerous wins.

John served on the Club committee as First Aid Officer for 5 years between 1962 and 1967, and then became Club Honorary Medical Officer in 1968, until at least 1975 (when our records unfortunately become a little sketchy. If anyone has annual reports or Mines from this period the Club would appreciate a copy).

In 2005 John contributed to the writing and preparation of the Club’s 50-year history and has been an active Bobba since their formation. More recently John has revised his passion for the March Past by re-starting the Nipper March Past Competition Team by sourcing equipment and uniforms and running training at the Club. These efforts resulted in a Silver medal at the 2020 Junior State Championships.

John’s contribution over many years promotes the values of Point Leo and it is timely to acknowledge his work and we welcome him as an Honorary Life Member.

Gary Tierney Foundation

The Past Twelve Months

The Foundation has been pleased to again support many young Club members over the past year. The Advisory Board was excited to offer three Gary Tierney Foundation Fellowships, continue its financial support to recent Fellows, and to make financial contributions to the younger team members attending Aussies in Queensland.

Outgoings on grants and subsidies exceeded income by \$1,895 due to a combination of factors, including the decision to award three Fellowship Grants to worthy recipients. This small loss is not of concern to the Advisory Board, having regard to the long-term position of the Fund and the overall strength of the Balance Sheet. At year end, the Fund balance was just

under \$250,000, ahead of its initial target corpus of \$200,000.

The Foundation has continued its conservative approach to fundraising with income being sourced only from donations and interest received from cash investments. The bulk of its funds are invested in term deposits, whilst historically, 1/3 of the fund was invested in a balanced investment account with the Surf Life Saving Foundation (SLSF). While not recognised as income for the purposes of the financial summary, the Foundation’s balance sheet has benefited from unrealized gains in the SLSF Rescue Fund investment of some \$16,000 for the year.

Gary Tierney Foundation 2021 Fellows

The 2021 Fellowships were awarded to three young Club members: Caitlin Robinson, Ella Laussen and Isabella Austin. Each of the candidates for the Fellowship Award this year was outstanding and the Advisory Board had a difficult task in selecting the 2021 Fellows. It really is a reflection of the quality of our younger Lifesavers, and after much consideration it was decided to award three Fellowships for the year.

Caitlin, Isabella and Ella (below) all joined the Club as Nippers and all have continued in various roles as they progressed through more senior activities.



Caitlin Robinson emerged as a particularly good swimmer in both ocean and pool competition and has been involved in leadership roles in the swim section. Caitlin has helped organize swim programs, establishing a senior swim squad and is planning the return of the Point Leo swim camp.

Ella Laussen, after gaining her Bronze, decided that she would complete as many Lifesaving awards as possible and her short-term goals have already been achieved. Ella took a leadership role in staging the Club's first Pink Patrol in 2020, is a Patrol Captain and hopes to be involved in the LSV Building Leaders Scholarship program.

Isabella Austin has been a wonderful competitor and has achieved many podium finishes in all levels of surf competition through to regularly competing at State Championships. Bella is highly regarded in LSV circles because of her attitude and determination when competing and because of this has many strong connections in other LSV Clubs.

Caitlin, Isabella and Ella have always been prepared to be involved in helping with Nipper activities such as water safety, board camps and activity leader roles. All three have been happy to help at tin rattles, muso nights and bronze camps when needed. Certainly, each of them has demonstrated the best of lifesaving and they have the potential to make an ongoing positive contribution to Point Leo SLSC and lifesaving overall.

Financials

As at 30 April 2021 the Gary Tierney Foundation Fund balance stands at \$249,446 an increase of \$14,191 over the prior year. Income for the year was \$7,269 from donations and bank interest. Outgoings amounting to \$9,164 comprised \$7,200 in Fellowship Grants, \$1,900 in subsidies to younger club competitors attending the SLSC National Championships in Queensland, and sundries of \$64.

The Foundation's long-term investment of \$70,000 in the Surf Life Saving Rescue Fund was valued at \$90,477 at 30 April 2021, an increase of \$16,086 since 2020. The upturn

occurred because of the improvement in global financial markets following the impacts on investments in the previous year due to the Pandemic situation. The Advisory Board will be watching this investment closely. The balance of funds invested of \$158,989 is with the Bendigo Bank in cash and term deposits at prevailing market rates of interest.

The Future

The Advisory Board will continue to provide financial support to allow younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving. The Foundation will provide grants or funding as Fellowship Grants or as Single Purpose Grants.

Point Leo Swim Classic

In 2020, due to COVID-19 complexities, we held a virtual Swim Classic and Honeysuckle Run instead of the usual event at Point Leo beach on Boxing Day. It was great to keep the tradition going despite being a little different and we focussed on what we could achieve when participation at public events was restricted.

Many thanks to Kim Williams for helping manage the virtual event and Haydn Tierney for organising another awesome Swim Classic T-Shirt from Golden Breed.

Point Leo SLSC Bobbas

Over the past twelve months the activities of the Bobbas have been a little restricted because of the COVID-19 situation. The Bobbas, formed as a group back in 1968 as a vehicle for past members of the Club to keep in touch with each other, would normally get together four times annually – three times for lunch at the Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club and once at the annual Bobbas and Partners luncheon held at the clubhouse at Point Leo.

Gary Tierney Foundation Governance

The Gary Tierney Foundation is managed by an Advisory Board. During the year, the Board consisted of Tom Mollenkopf (Chairperson), John Horwood, Haydn Tierney, Bella Ford, Kelvin Anderson, Tamara Brawn and Luke Treadwell. The Foundation's Patron is Louise Tierney.

The Foundation's finances are audited annually as part of the Club's statutory audit and it maintains a separate bank account to ensure that donations to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with and as specified by the Foundation's Governance Charter.

Future Project

Many of us will not have had much of a chance to visit the Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Clubhouse over the past 12 months. Forget about international travel, some of us couldn't even go to the beach! While we have suffered a fair bit of lockdown, the Future Project Sub-committee has not been asleep.

Members will recall the substantial redevelopment concept plans that were first presented at the 2017 AGM. These exciting plans envisaged a staged process that would see the renovation and extension of the Point Leo clubhouse with a view to providing a safe, effective and enjoyable place to serve the Club's growth and emerging needs, and those of our community.

With the generous support of the State Government, Lifesaving Victoria, and the Balnarring and District Community Bank Branch of the Bendigo Bank, and several kind donations from amongst the membership, in 2018 we undertook Stage 1 of the works: a

major refit of the toilets, change rooms and downstairs kitchen.

Since then, the club has been thankful to have funding support from the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council for the preparation of a master plan (by Cox Architects) and has been successful in gaining some critical grants including from the Federal Government and Lifesaving Victoria for the Stage 2 works. This funding will allow us to tackle a major issue: removing the shipping containers that we currently use for storing competition and lifesaving gear and building an attractive and environmentally sympathetic storage space.



Stage 2 will also deliver better access on the east side of the facility providing direct access from the carpark to the changerooms and new storage space, as well as to new external showers, communal and barbeque areas. Plans are currently being discussed with relevant agencies (including Mornington Peninsula Shire Council and in the near future the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning), but we are optimistic of in-principle approval. We can then share plans and move to detailed design.

In early April 2021 we started an expression of interest process seeking a commercial builder

who could work with us on this project – and we hope to have a builder on board for the Stage 2 works later in 2021. While our focus is on finalising Stage 2 and delivering it, we also have an eye to Stage 3 and beyond. The Future Facility plan provides an exciting master concept. We will be simultaneously testing and validating the concept plan, drawing on the experience of several other lifesaving facility redevelopments around the coast. We are looking forward to moving ahead on this with the support of the committee and our members – to ensure that our Clubhouse facilities keep up with our needs!

President's Awards

Dick Catterick Award – (Best Club Member) – Andrew Welsh

This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding all-round contribution during the season. Presented in memory of the late Dick Catterick who was the Clubhouse caretaker/supervisor in the 1970s and 1980s.

President's Award (Junior) – Charlotte Hoskins

Charlotte joined Point Leo SLSC in our Junior Program as an Under 7 in 2007. Charlotte has been an incredible role model for our young members through her commitment to patrolling and contribution to our programs. Charlotte patrolled for an outstanding 44.75 hours throughout the season, which is a great achievement. Charlotte also contributed to the club through assisting with our JSLP as water safety and Activity Leader as well as assisting in the SRC and Bronze camps when required. Charlotte also was a highly valued and accomplished facilitator of the School Surf Aware Program. Charlotte continues to demonstrate strong, quiet, and self-assured leadership and character in her volunteer roles embracing the community spirit of the club. Charlotte is a very worthy recipient of the Presidents Junior Award for this season.

Major Award Recipients

Club Captain's Award – Michelle Royal-Hebblewhite

This award recognises a member whose contribution to club operations demonstrably enhances the development of lifesaving at the Point Leo SLSC or whose commitment to patrol operations, training and education, youth and leadership development or the Junior Lifesaving Program has excelled.

It takes a special candidate to satisfy *all* these criteria, yet over a commitment that spans 18 years, Michelle Royal-Hebblewhite has done just that. Michelle is one of the club's most experienced and committed trainers. A previous recipient of the LSV Education Instructor of the Year award, Michelle has trained an innumerable number of courses over the years and I have been lucky to be the recipient of her teaching. In fact, it was Michelle's passionate and pragmatic approach to training that inspired me to complete my trainers and assessors endorsements. Michelle has a way of cutting through the onerous paperwork and focusing on the important aspects of the curriculum – I really liked her style and I hope she doesn't mind me running with it. Without dedicated trainers and assessors like Michelle, we cannot run Bronze or SRC camps; we cannot run First Aid or Advanced Airway Techniques courses. Without these awards there are no patrols; there is no water safety for Nippers, competition or events – her impact across the entire club therefore cannot be overstated.

Michelle's footprint at the club goes beyond the realm of training. Her patrol record is staggering –she has clocked well over 550 patrol hours, however given this only includes electronic records Michelle's hours are likely much higher. She captains the Legends patrol with Andrew Gibson, inspiring others to commit to more seasons and importantly re-enlist if they've had a lapse. She is a constant presence in the First Aid tent at Point Leo events and has bent over backwards to fill in at the last minute countless times.

Perhaps Michelle's greatest legacy will be her role in the leadership development of our female members. An ardent supporter of our up-and-coming female members, Michelle has provided informal and formal guidance to a number of rising stars. She has contributed her time and energy to the Pink Patrol initiatives, inspiring everyone (myself included) to be better. I am honoured to award Michelle the 2020/2021 Club Captain Award – our club, its members and the wider community wholly recognise your service and thank you for it.

Outstanding Achievement – ‘The Lion’s Den’ Youth Program – Sarah-Jo Mason and Sam Hunt

This award recognises outstanding achievement(s) or contributions in any sector of club activity during the current season.

This year’s winner of the Outstanding Achievement of the Year is the Lion’s Den, a youth program that was developed by Sarah-Jo Mason for this season, executed by Sam Hunt and supported by BlueScope Westernport. A challenge within surf lifesaving in general, and in our club specifically is retention of the Under 15 age group after an immersive period within the structured JSLP. The Lion’s Den is an innovative and motivating program developed to engage the Under 15/16 age group. The program offers a “space” for this age group so that they feel valued, connected to the club, and therefore motivated to continue their lifesaving journey within Point Leo SLSC. The program was holistic in nature including social events, water safety, beach, and water activities, First Aid course and positive wellness sessions culminating in a well-attended swim camp. The Lion’s Den achievement of connecting this age group with their peers and increasing engagement with lifesaving and our club was exceptional, particularly so under difficult COVID 19 restrictions. Well done to Sarah-Jo Mason for developing this unique program and to Sam Hunt, Vice President Youth Development, in leading the program in its inaugural year. Patroller of the Year (Geoff Waters Perpetual Trophy) – Edward (Chuck) Warner

Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of preparation

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is a not-for-profit entity. In the opinion of the Committee, Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc Inc is not a reporting entity as its users may request the financial information they need. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared for distribution to members and for the purposes of fulfilling the reporting requirements under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

These special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2021 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management.

New and amended standards adopted by the Association

The Association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the Association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Notes to the financial statements (continued)

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Property, Plant and equipment

Property (buildings), plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(d) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(f) Right of Use Asset

A right-of-use asset is recognised in relation to the concessionary lease of the land upon which the Association's Club House operates. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the remaining unexpired period of the lease or the useful life of the asset, whichever is shorter.

(g) Revenue and other income

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors. Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Goods and services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(i) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(k) Impairment of assets

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(l) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

(m) Comparative information

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

(n) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.
