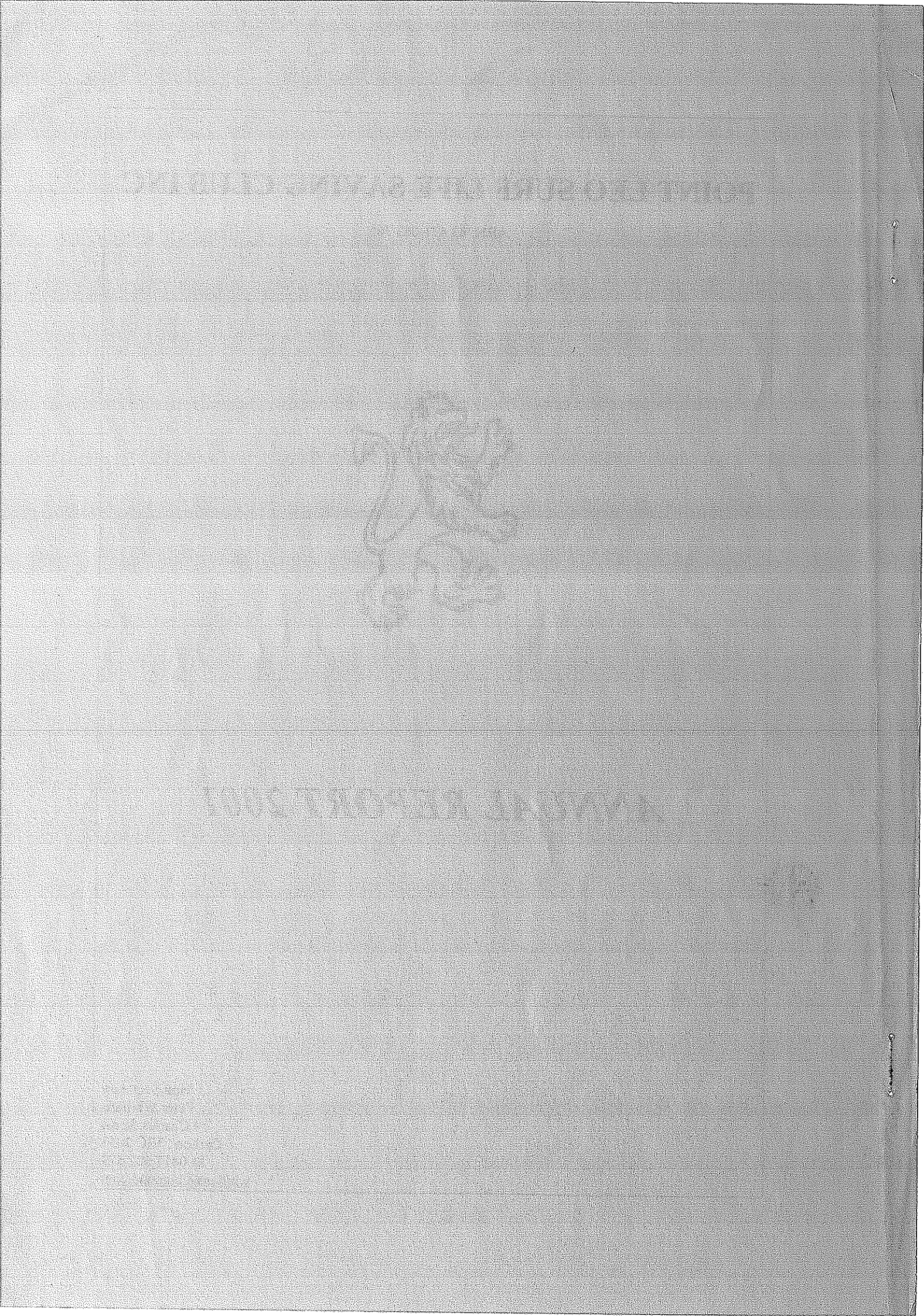

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

There is one thing in our lives that is certain, a season at Point Leo is never boring! When you have a mix of bronze camps, surf rescue patrols, competition, nippers, building maintenance and renovations, fund raising, professional lifeguards, club merchandise, socialising, and maintenance of club equipment, and you match, that with the number of club personnel required to efficiently carry out these tasks you understand the challenges, that your committee face each year.

Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club now have a group of members, some on the committee and some not, some who are active members and some who are not, and some who have family in the club and some who have not, who are quite prepared to put their hands up and chip in to ensure that the club continues to progress in a positive fashion. I expect that a number of these people will have their efforts recognised in the section leader's reports in this Annual Report and I will certainly speak of the contributions made by committee members and others in my report.

Season 2000/2001 commenced with two highlights; firstly when Andrew Gibson was chosen to represent the local community and carry the Olympic Torch through Mornington on 7<sup>th</sup> August, and secondly the Wine Auction and Dinner held on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> November. It was a big moment for Andrew and he certainly had the support of many Point Leo members on the day. The auction was the best fund raiser the club has held and was due to the efforts of two Life Members Gary Randall and Eddie Kidd, a past member Simon Merrigan, and current members Roger Sowerby, Peter Whillans and Jill McKellar. And it was a great social occasion also!

Patrol commitments at Point Leo commenced next day on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> November and after our successes of the previous season in the SLSV patrol competition there were high hopes for season 2000/2001. Andrew Gibson with the assistance of Mark Tierney spent a great deal of time in carefully selecting the club's patrol captains and also compiling the make-up of the eight Surf Rescue Teams that were to patrol up until Easter Monday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2001. Andrew listed nine goals for the Surf Rescue Teams and whilst Andrew may have a different analysis of actual performance against planned than mine my initial reaction is that the club can be very happy with our overall patrol efforts. The club should also be aware of the time and effort put in by Andrew on ensuring that Point Leo SLSC Leo meets its patrol commitments.

The club's annual Bronze Camp was held in the clubrooms from 10<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> December 2001. The week has now become a well established fixture on the club's instructing and training calendar and it was great to be present on the last day when 18 members successfully completed the week and gained their Bronze Medallion. Not sure whether some of the stories coming out of the week were fact or fiction but it was obviously enjoyed by all and the end result was that Point Leo SLSC enhanced its membership with some excellent young people. Congratulations to our Chief Instructor, Janis Caddie House, the Senior Camp Supervisor, Mathew Bunting-Frame, and their group of instructors. Once again, Janis ensured that instruction, requalification, and examination was carried out at the highest levels at Point Leo. Thank you from all of us, Janis.

The Xmas/New Year period at Point Leo is always hectic and this year was no exception! It started on 17<sup>th</sup> December with a full SLSV carnival at Point Leo, quickly followed by the John Marshall Swim Classic on Boxing Day, the Nipper registration day on the 29<sup>th</sup>, and then Bronze Requalification and the first Nipper session on the 30<sup>th</sup> December. The success of this particular period does always depend on member involvement and this year the members did not let us down.

The John Marshall Swim Classic continues to improve as a recognised ocean swim event and in particular there were a number of positive comments from competitors this year. A big thanks to our sponsors, particularly our major sponsor Davenport Industries, and to the race organising committee. This year the committee included two younger members, Dianna McKellar and Andrew Jeffrey, and their input particularly in regard to promoting the event was appreciated.

Nippers continue to play a major part in the day-to-day activities of the life saving season at Point Leo. Jennyann Goodman took over the position of Junior Activities Coordinator from Rod Smallman and I am sure that she had a few sleepless nights wondering whether she had made the right decision in taking on this challenging role. Jennyann need not have worried, with a lot of pre-planning with the likes of Roger Sowerby, Phil Tardiff, Greg North and other stalwarts and with the innovative registration evening and BBQ the Nippers got off to a great start and continued in the right manner. Well done, Jennyann and your band of very keen and conscious assistants.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> February 2001 two prominent members of the club Ian Knight and Steve Anstee, held a function at Point Leo to pay tribute to the late Brad Jones a terrific young member, who had tragically been killed in a car smash twenty years earlier, whilst on his way to State team training at Fairhaven. Brad's father John, a former Club President and his brother, flew down from Queensland and attended the evening with a number of past and current members. I was privileged to be invited to attend and it was quite a memorable night. Can those lads tell some stories!

As most of you would be aware the year 2001 is officially the International Year of the Volunteer. When you think of voluntary organisations in Australia in most cases you would nominate surf life saving, a voluntary body that has been in existence in this country for over 100 years. And it is worthwhile remembering that every role and function carried out at the Point Leo SLSC, from the President down to the youngest member carrying out patrol duties is purely on a voluntary basis.

That is why it is very hard to pick out people in the club to thank for things that they have done over the year, there are so many to think of. However there are always those who do rise above the call of duty, apart from those that I have already mentioned. People like our Secretary Peter Whillans, who is always a great sounding board for me, Our Treasurer Chris Fennell, who is always there when there is cash involved. Club Captain Cameron McGill, very effective in his first year. Section leaders: Haydn Tierney and Tamara Brawn. Building Sub-Committee representatives Peter Merrigan and Bruce Walker. Registrar Kim Williams. Gear Steward John Williams, and Vice Presidents Jill McKellar, Tom Mollenkopf, Roger Sowerby and Peter Taylor. In fact the club has a very united committee and it is always a pleasure to go to monthly meetings.



The club must also pay tribute to two longstanding and outstanding members, Ron Murray and Garry McKellar. Both of these guys, who are legends in their own right and are Life Members of Point Leo SLSC. Ron and Garry joined the club, gained their Bronze Medallion and started rowing in boat crews, all in the late 1950's and both represented the club at the National Titles this year, some 40 years later. In between time, there have been many accolades ranging from National Titles right down to being loyal and hardworking people around the club. There has been some loose talk around that Ron and Garry are considering retirement, or as Garry has stated "hanging up his cap". Hard to believe, lads, it will not be the same without you!

Thank you also to those members, who are always around the clubhouse to help out when required, like Lorraine Sowerby, Rhonda and Ted Marks, Robyn Morris, Peter Gibson, Doug Woolley, Jan Williams, Max Jeffrey, Kim Zervaas, Mark Lloyd, Louise and Gary Tierney and many others.

Thanks also to Ray Goold and the Point Leo Foreshore Committee, the Mornington Shire Council, Nigel Taylor and his team at SLSV and the club's many sponsors for their valuable support during the season.

The club is well placed to proceed into the future. We really have a great group of young active members and many of them are now wishing to get involved in club administration and management matters. During the course of season 2000/2001 a group of these members formed a Junior Members Committee and put forward a number of valid and pertinent points to the club committee. For the latter part of the year Khali Williams was invited to join the club committee as a representative of the Junior Members Committee and has been a significant contributor on all club matters. We now need to ensure that all this young and enthusiastic energy is corralled and pointed in the right direction and this is one of two major challenges facing the committee at the moment.

The other challenge is the completion of our building renovations. We now have the funding in place and Bruce Walker has been leading the way in carrying out the building works as expediently and economically feasible as possible. ## CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

A bus was organised to take 14 club members to Seaspray for the weekend Carnival of the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of Feb. Those who attended, were predominantly our junior members, and I can confidently say that I believe that this group will form the backbone of the Club well into the future.

A visit from the Uncle Toby's ironmen and women for a surf clinic in February was well received.

The successful running of a Full Senior carnival; Nipper carnival; the State Champion LifeSaver and Patrol Championships, along with the John Marshal Swim.

- Under 19 5 Person R & R, Open 6 Person R & R, Open 5 Person R & R (Simone Williams, Khali Williams, James Anderson, and Hayden Rydberg, Annika Krooglik, David Russell, Ian Knight, Steve Morganthaler, and Garry Rydberg)

A special mention must go to our Taplin Relay team, who finished 6<sup>th</sup> (Qualifying for the National Championships), which included Jarad Kohlar, Nick Veliades, Haydn Tierney, Hayden Rydberg, James Anderson and myself. With the exception of myself, the team was aged under 20 – a remarkable achievement against clubs with much more experience. I believe that the basis of a team to carry the prospects of future success has been born.

The National Championships were held at Kurrawa (again, the 6<sup>th</sup> year in a row) over the last weekend of March. It lived up to its reputation, and threw up difficult seas. The club was represented in many areas of competition, with mixed results.

Point Leo was represented in three Finals:

- Under 19 Surf Race (Nick Veliades, 21<sup>st</sup>)
- Under 19 Surf Teams (David Morris, Haydn Rydberg, James Anderson, and Nick Veliades, 8<sup>th</sup>)
- Under 19 Belt Race (James Anderson, The team was disqualified for interference)

Congratulations to David Morris on winning the Club Championship.

Thankyou to: Jennyann Goodman for a successful Nipper program (and also to her many group co-ordinators and helpers), a job well done. Lorraine Sowerby for her help with the accommodation for the State titles, and for catering at Club training days. Daniel Szabo for towing the gear trailer and Haydn Tierney for getting gear to carnivals this season, to John Williams for towing the gear trailer to Kurrawa. Brian Kohlar for driving the bus to Seaspray.

Competition equipment is once again in high demand, and this is mainly handled by the allocation system, or by members purchasing their own equipment. Racing skis and paddles seem to be the next priority, so a major sponsor would be most welcome. Club training days will continue through winter again this year, and hopefully we will see further achievements from our young competitors.

With this our second season of the Surf Rescue Patrol system in place, an emphasis must be made to ensure that all active members not part of the regular rostered patrols, ensure that they meet their obligations to the club. It is one of the few expectations of you, when you receive your Surf Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, or requalify at the Club, that you do patrol hours. Those wishing to compete must also ensure that they complete the minimum number of patrol hours to enable them to be eligible for competition.

I look forward to another successful season in 2001 - 2002.

## BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT – CLUBHOUSE EXTENSION

At the time of the last annual report we were still awaiting advice from the State Government on our application for additional funding. It may not be remembered, but the original grant of \$85,500 and an equivalent amount of our own funds were spent in achieving the lock-up stage.

Rod Sly the builder was approached for an estimate of the costs of completion. This figure was an additional \$125,000.

We were outside the guide-lines for an additional grant, and had used our own cash reserves. A submission was lodged with the Department of Sport and Recreation for a further grant of \$62,500.



After a wait of over 6 months we received advice, that the State Government was prepared to provide a further grant of \$50,000, but the deal was on a "one for one" basis; with the money needing to be spent before a claim could be lodged. At that stage the Club had limited financial resources to commit to the completion of the works.

It was determined, that the only course of action was to complete the works ourselves with as much volunteer labour as could be mustered, and an associated fund raising campaign. The progress has not been as fast as we would have liked, but we have achieved a great deal with the resources available to us. There have been some outstanding efforts by newer members, supporters and the regular reliables. It is not possible or necessary to name all the people, who have given time and effort to this project, but there are some who must be recognised.

#### FUND RAISING

The wine auction was recognised as one of the best ever functions in terms of financial and social success. The committee included Gary Randall, Eddie Kidd, Jill McKellar, John Horwood, Peter Merrigan, Chris Fennell, Peter Whillans and Simon Merrigan. The end result was well over \$10,000 and a good night for all who attended.

#### BUILDER

The opportunity to undertake the self-help scheme was dependent upon the involvement of a Registered Builder. John Williams offered his services in this role without hesitations, in addition to his hands on involvement. This acceptance of responsibility has resulted in a simplified option that has saved the Club a lot of money.

#### FACILITATOR

At the beginning, when there were little funds and an associated lack of direction Connie Loulatzis put his body and resources on the line to commence proceedings, and provide a major funding boost resulting in a full frontal assault on the plastering. There is no doubt he is an Icon.

#### PLASTERING
