PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As we all descend into the depths of winter, the summer season at Point Leo seems far away. But while the weather this past season may have seemed like a winter, all of us at Point Leo can reflect proudly on another extremely successful year.

Over summer, each of us is busy with individual tasks and activities. We often miss out on seeing the big picture. It has been pleasing for me then, to look back at the past 12 months and to see how much the hundreds of members that make up Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc have achieved. Particularly gratifying is the fact that this has covered all aspects of Club endeavours: patrolling, competition, socially and financially.

Maintaining a safe aquatic environment is our first priority. We have been fortunate to have a highly committed group of patrolling members operating under the leadership of our Club Vice Captain, Andrew Gibson and Club Captain Adam Woods. Our formal patrolling obligations covered November until April. Fortunately Easter came a little earlier this year and so the season wasn't quite as long as last year. Nevertheless it spans almost half the year and requires us to have a fully equipped and proficient patrol on the beach every Saturday, Sunday and Public Holiday over that period. Our Patrols this year have run better than ever, building on the success of the Surf Rescue Team format established two years ago. The commitment of the individual active members of the club is critical to us fulfilling our obligations in patrolling the beach.

Our objective has been to get ourselves within the top ten clubs in the patrol efficiency competition. This year we were extremely unlucky not to achieve that objective. Point Leo ranked 15th out of 36 clubs at the end of the season, with a score of 13,680 points. Unfortunately during each of the three patrol inspections we lost several hundred points for poor record keeping. Hardly any points were lost for our patrol efficiency and rescue tasks! If only we could employ more bookkeepers instead of lifesavers we could have found ourselves in the top 5! We did however come 2nd in the district (after Gunnamatta) and overall our patrol performance was exemplary.

The task of our patrollers has, I'm sure, been made easier by the excellent facilities that the Club now has. The completion of the Clubhouse extension caps off many years of hard work by a huge number of people. Our work started early in 1998 when an application was made for Victorian State Government Funding under the Life Saving into the 21st Century Program. The idea was initially championed by then President, Peter Ford, and continued by John Horwood in his two years as President. It has involved many dedicated members including Peter Merrigan, "Bone" Walker, John Williams and others. Our architect, Ian Douglas, and our builder, Rod Sly, both long-standing Club members, have done an excellent job.

We were able to celebrate the conclusion of this mammoth task with the formal opening of the Clubhouse and public open day on Sunday 27 January. The day was combined with the final day of the Nipper Program that ensured that hundreds of our members, their families and friends could participate in the occasion. The highlight of the opening was without doubt the March Past and formal assembly under the careful guidance of James Keeran. A regiment of hundreds of Nippers marched and wheeled on the beach before proceeding to the front of the clubhouse. They were led by standard bearers Khali and Simone Williams, a team of our competitive members, the surf rescue certificate squad and patrollers.

The day also gave us an opportunity to showcase the Club to various officials from the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council including the Mayor, Bill Goodrem, Parliamentarians, Greg Hunt, Ken Bowden and Martin Dixon. Also present was Nigel Taylor, Chief Executive of Surf Life Saving Victoria.

Notwithstanding the large capital demands of this building program, as well as the ever-increasing costs of running day-to-day Club activities, the Club finds itself in a very strong financial position at the end of the year.

Total revenues were slightly down over the previous year although this is largely attributable to the completion of substantial fund raising activities in that year for the building works. During the year we have also been able to fund some significant equipment purchases such as the 6 x 4 John Deere "Gator" for patrol purposes, undertake maintenance works and buy new mattresses for the bunk rooms. We

therefore find ourselves extremely well placed with our equipment and facilities and we are debt free: a position many other clubs would be pleased to be in.

The formal opening of the clubhouse extensions may have had to wait until January but the real "head wetting" took place with our Gala Ball on 24 November. We had a brilliant turnout of Club members, past and present, young and not so young, friends and Point Leo neighbours. It was particularly pleasing to have some of the great luminaries from the Club's past, most notably one of our co-founders, Richard (Dick) Ellis and one of the members of the first Bronze Squad, Ian Stuart. Formalities for the evening were mercifully brief but we did have a very important task to undertake, the dedication of the Dudes Bar in honour of the late Geoff (The Dude) Kinsey. The evening went flawlessly due to the hard work and good planning of Tamara Brawn, assisted by Tarena Murray.

Christmas this year was cold, wet and windy – what a surprise! Our Christmas patrol was held in very festive settings complete with Christmas tree and lunch provided by Alf and Anne Treadwell. Point Leo has an enviable reputation for always fielding a patrol on Christmas Day even though it is not compulsory. Many other clubs do not.

The miserable conditions continued onto Boxing Day but the weather cleared just long enough to allow us to conduct the swim. Over 250 swimmers took to the water which, whilst not a record, was a good turn out given the conditions. Things heated up in the evening however with a huge turnout for the Hawaiian Shirt Party.

This successful night set the tenor for the rest of the peak summer season over January. The Club was well used particularly with many of the younger members who stayed overnight in the bunkrooms during the holidays. There were also spit roasts and gourmet bbq's held every Tuesday and Thursday and the bar was open on weekends. We were fortunate this year to have Rhonda and Ted Marks undertake the role of Club Caretakers during January. This was a critical factor in maintaining the safety of our members and the security and cleanliness of our facilities over this busy holiday period.

Outside of this time the club has received a lot of use from school and community groups. We hosted the South East Water Schools Surf League, the State Champion Life Saver and Patrol Competition and continued to partner the Youth Development Programs conducted by Westernport and Dromana Secondary Collages.

Our competitive position in the State improved this year. A number of our competing members performed extremely well at the State Championships with the result that we completed the weekend number seven in the State. Some particularly noteworthy individual performances were turned in by Hayden Rydberg, Natalie Johnson, James Anderson, Haydn Tierney and David Morris.

It was a boisterous and optimistic team that therefore set off for the Aussies at Kurrawa. Having achieved a gold in the Under 19 Belt Race and a silver in the Open Belt Race at the States, there were high-hopes for James Anderson. Unfortunately this again was not to be James' year, however his strength of character and skill as a competitor continue to earn the respect of all who were there.

The Nipper program under Jennyann Goodman continues to be a force to be reckoned with. Again we had around 300 enrolments for the program this year, a huge logistical exercise. Despite the ever-increasing expectations in terms of supervision, care and quality of instruction, this year's program was a standout success. Thanks must go to Jennyann and to the army of group leaders, helpers and water safety officers.

The year was not without a few hiccups however. Hasty arrangements had to be made for a few patrols and the conduct of our IRB drivers course when the lure of the far east (Victoria that is) proved too much for our IRB Captain and Life Guard, Daniel Szabo. Our loss was Mallacoota's gain and it was just as well that Dan and Matthew Bunting-Frame were there. The two of them had all their life saving skills tested when they rescued and revived a drowned swimmer on the beach.

There is no greater gift than to save the life of another person and Mathew and Daniel have demonstrated just how important the training we all receive is.

As ever there have been a huge number of people who have contributed to the club's success this year and I cannot name them all here. There are some who work behind the scenes that I need to specifically mention. Peter Taylor continues to serve the club brilliantly doubling as State Centre Delegate and our eyes and ears. He was honoured this year by being asked to represent all officials at the Victorian Championships by taking the Officials Oath. Gibbo (Peter Gibson) has the thankless task of welding together broken prop guards and other pieces of equipment, endeavouring to rebuild IRB motors and obtain fuel for our equipment on a weekly basis. And some people thought there were Pixie's who magically did these things.

Andrew Gibson not only ran our patrols but organised clubhouse maintenance, secured a new PA system, assisted in the organisation of the John Marshall Swim and generally got things done. Rhonda Marks did a brilliant job this year with club uniforms and Simone Williams stepped into the breech to become Mine Editor at a moments notice. Louise and Gary Tierney have continued their great tradition of support to the club. Lorraine Sowerby catered and organised with efficiency and good humour.

Thanks must also go to Ray Gould and the Point Leo Foreshore Committee who are very supportive of our endeavours.

Thanks must go to my fellow members on the Committee. They are a hard working and committed group who have worked together in a very constructive and harmonious way. I extend a special thanks to the Honorary Secretary Peter Whillans who puts in hundreds of hours each year dealing with the volumes of correspondence, preparation of minutes and the production of this Annual Report amongst other things. Also Chris Fennell, our Treasurer and Kim Williams the Registrar who deals with a mountain of paperwork associated with members joining, transferring and renewing. Adam Woods has made a brilliant contribution in his first year as Club Captain and he is a deserving recipient of the President's Award - Senior.

Finally my thanks go to John Horwood our immediate past President. John has been a great role model and support to me in my first year as President. For someone who

wanted to have a little more time for other pursuits, he continues to spend vast

amounts of time and energy on Club activities.

I believe that we finish the 2001 - 2002 year with many achievements. We are well

placed to meet the external challenges of the future as well as the needs and

expectations of our own members. It is my hope that in the 2002-2003 season we can

build on the work we have already commenced bringing a new generation of members

into the Club. We must continue to work hard to provide a transition for our Nippers

into Cadets and senior ranks. In broad terms we must maintain our strong Club ethos

with a sense of belonging and where each of us can make a contribution as well as

receiving the benefits of being a members.

Financially now is the time to rebuild our war chest after the demands of our building

program of the past few years. Building our financial position will allow us to

provide appropriate support for our competitors so that those who compete for Point

Leo are not financially penalised for their loyalty. Additionally we must take care to

maintain the facilities and equipment that we have worked so hard to obtain.

My thanks goes to all of you for your friendship, support and encouragement and for

making Point Leo the great Club that it is.

GEAR STEWARD REPORT

Our pre-season preparation paid off with an almost perfect gear inspection. Special thanks must go to Triggers Bros for the rescue boards' repairs last winter and during the season; safe rescue boards are essential for patrols and training. Andrew Gibson for his effects prior to the inspection – all the patrol equipment passed scrutiny. Gaye Martin and Adam Wood s proved that miracles do happen by moving into the new first aid room and adjusting our first aid stores in record time to meet new SLSV requirements. The IRB section was saved with the new Tohatsu arriving just in time.

From a patrolling perspective we had a good season with each patrol squad and the life-guards having operational equipment every day. The news was not as good on the training front; we incurred significant equipment damage to surf rescue boards and IRBs during training. Our boards are subject to extensive use ranging from school groups, nipper water safety, to Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze medallion training for club and schools. It should be noted that while Triggers Bros do a great job repairing the boards a number are now near the end of their useful life and replacements should be scheduled. If the same levels of usage are to be supported we should plan for a minimum of six (6) new rescue boards in 2002/2003 and a similar number in 2003/4.

Some expenditure will also be required in the coming season to replace a number of rescue tubes and anchors that disappeared during the season. In the future, to minimise this leakage all our gear that is considered to be at risk will be clearly identified as belonging to the Club.

The IRB damage was typically of the wear and tear caused by training a new group of drivers. Hulls, handles, ropes and motors are all, at times, subject to extreme conditions, but there is an urgent need to replace all of the current prop guards. The down time experienced with various items highlighted the need for a third operational IRB and a spare motor. To this end the third IRB hull (the old Pioneer) is being readied to be included in this year's gear inspection and a submission has been made to Boating Victoria, via SLSV, for a trailer, motor, propeller and prop-guard. This together with a new TABCORP motor from SLSV, which is still to be received from

the 2001-2002 season's grant, and a little annual maintenance over the winter, will

provide adequate IRB resources for patrols and training in the coming season.

The Gator has solved some of the problems presented by the old tractor, particularly

reliability. Although currently unsuitable for towing surf boats, the patrol requirement

should be met once wider tyres have been fitted to the IRB trailer.

John Williams, who once again took on the role of the Club's Boat Section official. The parents of our young competitors, who came to the carnivals to support them and ended up assisting me in many ways. The oldies, - Gary Tierney, Garry Rydberg, Ian Knight, Bruce Walker, Garry McKellar and Ron Murray whose advice was sought and appreciated by all competitors.

The State Titles at Ocean Grove was the scene of our best performance for quite a while. Hayden Rydberg, who I think may have been saving himself for a big one was fantastic with Gold in the U19 Iron Man, U19 Surf Race, U19 Board Race, and the U19 Board Rescue Race. James Anderson won Gold in the U19 Belt Race and the U19 Board Rescue (with Hayden) and Silver in the Open Belt Race. Nat Johnstone blitzed the field to take Gold in the U19 Beach Sprint and Haydn Tierney came home with a well deserved Bronze in the Open Surf Race. Haydn, Hayden, James and David Morris also picked up Bronze in the Open Surf Teams. As you can imagine it was a particularly pleasing night at the Barwon Heads Hotel that evening!

Point Leo SLSC travelled to the Nationals at Kurrawa, Queensland with 31 competitors entered in a variety of events ranging from young Andrew Morris in the U16 Beach Sprint/Beach Flags to our oldest Garry Rydberg, who was reel man in the U19 Belt Team supporting James Anderson. The sweep of the Ladies Boat Crew, Ian Johnson, who turned 50 in the week before the Titles, was not far behind Butch in the oldies category. Garry Rydberg and Garth Tierney also competed in the Masters with Butch getting a 4th in the 50-54 Rescue Tube race.

The National Titles has now become a huge event and it is said that it rates second only to the Olympic Games in regard to the number of entrants. There were well in excess of 7000 entries and when you look at some of the event statistics such as 336 swimmers in the Open Men's Surf Race, 545 paddlers in the Open Men's Single Ski Race, 404 in the Open Men's Board Race, 115 crews in the Open Women's Boat Race and so on, that you realise that the Point Leo participation is not that big at all.

But at least we were there having a red hot go!!

From Leo's point of view the highlights were-

> James Anderson's valiant 4th in the final of the U19 Belt,

➤ Hayden Rydberg and David Morris finishing in the mid twenties in the final of the U19 Surf Race, and

Nick Veliadas winning a heat of the Senior Belt at his very first attempt in this tough event.

Our Boat Crews were a little unlucky – both the Women's Crew and the Backbone, the Reserve Crew, had limited preparation leading up to the Nationals due to injuries etc., and the Men's A crew rowed very well in two heats and just missed out on going through to the next round.

Kate Stafford and Nic McCracken were up against some pretty hot competition in the Open Women's Surf Race but both were happy with personal bests. Claire Stocks and Andrew Morris were our Beach Event entrants but found the going a little tough at this level.

It is quite obvious that Point Leo SLSC does have a pool of very talented young competitors (and Julia Treadwell, and the Women' "A" Crew are back next year), however to take the next step we need to improve in the coaching area and that is something the committee must address immediately.
