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President's Report

The 2008-2009 surf life saving season at Point Leo witnessed increasing activity around the club with social, competition and training activities being well supported. Our club is in a good position thanks to its dedicated committee and the ongoing support of its members, new and old.

The club has developed in both structure and personnel. Structurally we have a new kitchen while on the personnel side I sense that through the encouragement and training of our members the club has a good foundation to develop further.

As we are aware Surf Life Saving has many protocols that require proper training and development. Many of our members continue to participate in such training so as to assist in club activities. We look forward to continuing this important development in junior, cadet and senior ranks. The contribution of those involved in training and the dedication of those being trained is to be commended.

In the competitive arena the club continued to dominate the State junior competition with its strong Nipper team. An amazing support structure which is now being fine-tuned along with internal and external training opportunities has further strengthened this part of the club's competitive position. In Senior competition the club was supported by our 'old guard' competitors during the summer series. Over the past years Point Leo seniors have relied on a few unbelievably dedicated athletes. These guys and girls have done an amazing job in keeping the Leo colours in the water and on the sand. They are waiting for the new band of competitors to come through. During the season we started to see some new faces representing the club in senior competitions. I believe that over the next two seasons we will see strong representation in both water and beach events. 2009 also saw further interest and development in the Boat section, which I believe is an integral part of any Surf Life Saving competition team.

Most of you would have learned that next year's State titles are a combined junior and senior event. The combined event although logistically challenging, will be a great opportunity for seniors and juniors to support each other and to view both competition arenas. This will illustrate our club strength through our participation. 2010 also brings the National titles back to Kurrawa, which should also witness an increase in participants from the Point Leo SLSC.

Our social activities during the season were very well patronised by members and their guests. The club is stronger for its social activities. The numerous roast nights, the music nights and our official occasions were all good fun. We will continue to develop these occasions over the next season.

The future of our club and its activities are dependent on the contribution from members. Over the past two years we have put in place a club structure that is slowly being developed. The particular functions and sub committees are taking shape which, when in place, will take the burden off particular individuals. It is all well and good to have a "viewable" structure in place, but more importantly the structure must work. Each individual must take responsibility for their appointment.

I note that the club has not done terribly well in the area of patrolling. The burden appears to fall on a few dedicated members. We must all remind ourselves that the activity of supplying an active public beach patrol is the pivotal "reason to be" for any surf life saving club.

In summary I would like to acknowledge the support the club has had from the Point Leo Foreshore Committee and the immediate community. I extend a big thanks to the general committee who have done much and continue to work to make our club stronger for the future.

If re-elected, 2010 will be my last year as President. I thank the club for the honour of being President over recent years.


In the opinion of the Committee:-

Scope

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these accounts.

a) General

These financial statements are prepared for distribution to the members and for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply the Accounting Standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements, except for those Standards specified in Schedule 1 of the Associations Incorporation (Prescribed Particulars) Regulations.

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention and a going concern assumption. They do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non current assets.

The accounting reports have been prepared on the basis of recognizing in dollar value only assets and liabilities generally described as cash based.

b) Principal Activity

The Club's sole activity is to provide life saving services and facilities for the community and its members. The Club did not carry out any trading activities during the financial year other than those incidental to the above activity.

c) Income Tax

No amount was required to be provided for income tax.

d) Property, Buildings and Amenities

Buildings and items of plant and equipment are recorded in the balance sheet at cost. The value of such items is brought to account as depreciation over the expected life of each asset.

Club Captain's Report

It has been a mixed year for the club, with some highlights, gallant efforts, and also some lowlights and areas which can be improved on. However, as always, the active Point Leo members were enthusiastic and enjoyed themselves which is always a good start!

The highlights of the season included the Point Leo Under 19 R and R team's Silver medal at Aussies this year. Coached by Khali Williams, the team approached the final with motivation, integrity and commitment, and the hard work paid off! I know the team didn't believe me all year when I kept telling them they were going to have huge success at the Aussies, but eventually the predictions came true!

Whilst an incident at the beach is serious and unwanted, the response to an incident at Second Reef over the summer break was of an excellent standard. I am sure details will be included elsewhere, however special mention must go to Richard Ellis, Jackson Curtis and Andrew Gibson for their handling of the situation.



On continuing the themes of patrols, we again saw improvement in the number of people attending patrols, specifically the Lifesaving Stars of this season. I think one cold day we had 13 Stars and 3 bronze holders on the beach! However, at the other end of the spectrum, the number of experienced, highly skilled lifesavers is dwindling, and this severely impacted on our performance in the patrol audits conducted over the season. We finished as the worst ranked club across the state, which, as Club Captain I am not proud of, and is an unacceptable standard. This needs to be an area of focus this coming season due to the changes in patrol requirements.

The Water Safety program continued to grow this year for the Juniors, with the need to appoint a Leader for their water safety, and an increase in the management of the program each day. Congratulations to Jackson Curtis for stepping up to this role, and also to his support team including Blane Paton, Richard Ellis and Jack Garner. Also congratulations to Julia O'Shaughnessy and her merry team of Nippers on their win at the Junior State Titles.

2008/09 was the third year for the new patrol system and my first year as Club Vice Captain. The patrol season started off well with encouraging attendance and maintenance of the high level of patrolling standards that we strive for. There was a training and feedback session held with the Patrol Captains midway through summer which provided excellent feedback as to what we were doing right and what could be improved. There were also a number of camps and programmes throughout the summer which helped to stimulate interest and patrol attendance. Then as usual as the weather got colder and patrollers headed back to school, attendance dropped. None the less it was a reasonably good season for Point Leo; we ensured there was a patrol on the beach every day that was required, with many members going above and beyond simply their regular patrols, including the hot weather evening patrols and numerous members doing countless hours on the beach.



Thank you to everybody who attended their patrols and was involved with the patrols over the season. Thank you also to the fantastic Patrol Captains who all did excellent jobs throughout the year. Next season there will be a revamp of the patrolling system, in coordination with Patrol Captains, to ensure that we improve patrol attendance and develop our patrol standards for the coming season.

Motorola Donate New Radios

This season we were very fortunate to receive a donation of new radios for our patrols. Radio Officer Mick Treadwell, with the help of Ben Marshall, was able to arrange this very generous donation to the club from Motorola. Our old base station radios were the Motorola originals installed in the Club many years ago and Motorola have actually taken them for their Museum. The base station radios gave great service and were still working well, which is a credit to the quality of their manufacture. Our handheld radios have also been replaced with the newest models. We greatly appreciate the support of Motorola in assisting us to maintain this equipment.

First Aid Report

- The types of injuries sustained to specific parts of the body were very close to last season's statistics.
- The biggest difference was an increase in injury to feet and toes but a decrease in ankle injury.
- Most of the foot/toe incidents were unavoidable.

- Ice-packs and bandaids were the most frequent method of treatment administered throughout the season.
- Other incidents included Asthma, Heat Exhaustion and Bee Stings.
- Steps in Preventative First Aid were taken in the following ways:
 - Memos in "The Mine"
 - SLISA stickers regarding hygiene and safe handling, put up around the Clubhouse (First Aid room; Boat area; Patrol room etc)
 - Shade, Sunscreen, Water, and Public Safety Messages at Events & Carnivals
- Additions to First Aid Room included:
 - New Bench Kit, to be continuously re-stocked from cupboards and maintained according to gear inspection list
 - Wall-mounted glove dispenser
- Tracking and Replacing Stock: There is still a discrepancy between actual stock used and stock referred to in Incident Log Books. eg Ventolin and Saline.
- I would like to thank all of the patrollers who followed the simple system of making sure that logs were completed in detail, that the bench kit was re-stocked from the cupboard and that all used stock was noted in the 'Orange' book for re-purchase.

Training and Development

Building Leaders Scholarship 2008/2009.

In 2008/2009 Jack Garner and Simone Williams participated in the "Building Leaders Scholarship" run by LSV and funded by the Harris Foundation. This program included four weekends spent completing personal development, the gaining of a new award and completion of a program of significance. Jack's project focused on the youth of the club, and looked at ways to improve the transition between junior and senior competition arenas. This was an area of focus for the year on both Jack's and the committee's behalf, and he will continue the project in the coming year. Simone's project looked at the process of "capping" Nipper Programs around the state, examining the barriers and enablers that are faced by Junior Co-ordinators when completing their programs. Next season, the project will change focus, and look at producing resources and strategies to increase the capacity of Victorian Clubs' Nipper Programs. Congratulations to both Jack and Simone on their acceptance into this program and for the many hours they have devoted to completing the course and their projects.

Under 18 Leadership and Development Course

Congratulations to Gus Royal-Hebblewhite on gaining a place in the Under 18 Leadership program. We look forward to hearing about his experiences and the project he is planning for the coming season.

Under 15 Leadership and Development Camp

Earlier this year, Sophie Welsh, Hillary Van Leeuwen and Hudson Keppell attended the LSV Under 15 Leadership and Development camp in Yellingbo. The camp journey started at Southern Cross Station, where they caught a bus to Yellingbo in the Dandenongs. On their arrival at Yellingbo they had to hand in all phones, iPods, cameras and even watches. Once settled in, the activities started. Activities ranged from climbing up a very high, very steep, very slippery timber wall, only using themselves and nothing else, to completing a mountain walk, blind-folded. They also completed many trust exercises, team bonding sessions and on the last day they had a scavenger hunt that involved running all over the camp, looking for boxes with questions in them. They then had to answer the questions for points. All three participants had a lot of fun whilst improving and enriching their leadership skills.

IRB Report

During the season Point Leo began running IRB crew and driver courses again, with many nipper parents and patrollers keen to take part. Junior Report

Holiday Program

It was another amazing season for the Point Leo SLSC Nippers this year. Point Leo SLSC made a commitment to support the continued growth and development of the Nipper program in the 2008-2009 season. We had a record number (again!) of 400 Nippers, however, sadly we still could not accept all those who wanted to join.

Our Junior Surf Life Saving Program is about providing basic beach and surf skills and raising awareness of safety within the beach environment. This is provided in a fun way promoting a healthy and active lifestyle.

Our Nipper program is considered to be one of the best. Its reputation is fantastic and the program itself simply gets better and better each year. We have grown in numbers quite substantially over the past few years, yet we have managed to continue to deliver an excellent program while strengthening our club spirit.



This season it was necessary to restructure the sessions in order to cater for increased numbers, maintain quality and ensure the safety of our nippers. The nippers were split into two groups; **CUBS** (U7 to U9) and **LIONS** (U10 to U14). The Cubs sessions ran from 8.50am till 10.30am and the Lions sessions ran from 10.30am to 12.30pm. I also thank the sensational Lifesaving Star nippers who did water safety in the early session before their own program.

Congratulations to Haydn and Ben on a fantastic effort and thanks to the support teams who worked so hard to help them to the finish.


Victorian Senior State Titles

Ron (Bomber) Murray

On 21 December 2008 Ron "Bomber" Murray clocked up 50 years of active membership of Point Leo SLSC. Major First Aid at Second Reef

On Sunday 25 January 2009, just as the Nipper Club Championships were getting underway, Jackson Curtis (Jacko) was approached by a guy who had run from Second Reef to report that a surfer had hit his head on a rock and was badly injured. Patrol had yet to start when Richard Ellis ran down to the patient while Andrew Gibson and Jacko took the Gator to pick up the First Aid kit, defib and oxygen. Bonnie Aliotti went to the tower to advise LSV Comms and monitor transmissions. The patient had been brought ashore by another surfer. He had a serious head injury and there was a lot of bleeding. Our assessment was: major cuts, no arterial bleed, concussion, possible skull fracture, possible spinal injury. He had neck pain, headache and nausea. He was lying in the recovery position. His head was stabilized with piles of sand. An ambulance had already been called. We organised opening the access track for the ambulance and looked after the patient's son who was a little distressed. Richard stabilised the patient and administered oxygen. Our strategy was oxygen therapy, reassurance and monitoring pending the arrival of the ambulance. Luke Treadwell took over in the tower and Bonnie and Darcy came down to help with communications and crowd control. The ambulance then arrived and took over the management of the patient. They administered morphine and anti-nausea drugs and decided to evacuate using the air ambulance. Shortly after this the CFA and Police arrived. We marked out a landing area on the beach for the air ambulance. The patient was flown to the Alfred Hospital. The whole incident was an indication of what great emergency services we in Australia are privileged to enjoy. This one surfing injury was attended by five Lifesavers, two Ambulance officers, three Air Ambulance officers, six CFA volunteers and two policemen.

Fred Westfield Medal - Victorian Nipper of The Year

Congratulations to Hudson Keppell on winning the LSV Nipper of the Year award. Hudson joined Nippers in 2002. He soon showed that he had the potential to be extremely competitive at a state level. In 2008 Hudson was one of four U13 boys selected to represent Victoria at an interstate challenge at Bondi to celebrate 100 years of Lifesaving. He was again selected in 2009 to represent Victoria in Perth. This year he was selected as Junior co-Captain, a role that was developed to give our older nippers some responsibility and to help support and nurture our younger members within the club.

Hudson had an outstanding competition year in 2009. At the Junior State Championships he was named U14 Boys Water Champion and won the prestigious Fred Westfield Medal. Hudson is the 22nd recipient and the first Point Leo member to receive the Fred Westfield Medal.



Presentation Night

Presentation night was held on 20 May at the clubhouse. It was a blustery winter night to head down to the beach, and we had a smaller turnout than previous years. A good night was had by those who attended! The highlight of the night was the rousing applause for Jackson Curtis for "Patroller of the Year" and the U19 R & R team "Team of the Year" presentations. Another highlight of the evening was when Greg Hunt, our local Federal Member of Parliament, presented the \$3000 'Local Sporting Champions' grant to the Point Leo R & R section (left). The Local Sporting Champions program is an Australian Government initiative designed to provide financial assistance for junior sportsmen

and women, particularly from regional areas, towards the cost of travel, accommodation, uniforms and equipment when competing at an endorsed state or national sporting competition. The Point Leo R & R section would like to thank Greg for supporting our club with this grant and for attending our Presentation Night.

He is our man behind the scenes ensuring we have the correct protocol with respect to SLSV. Chris has gone far beyond the call of duty in his role as team manager.
