NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 2010

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these accounts.

a) General

These financial statements are prepared for distribution to the members and for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply the Accounting Standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements, except for those Standards specified in Schedule 1 of the Associations Incorporation (Prescribed Particulars) Regulations.

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention and a going concern assumption. They do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non current assets.

The accounting reports have been prepared on the basis of recognizing in dollar value only assets and liabilities generally described as cash based.

b) Principal Activity

The Club's sole activity is to provide life saving services and facilities for the community and its members. The Club did not carry out any trading activities during the financial year other than those incidental to the above activity.

c) Income Tax

No amount was required to be provided for income tax.

d) Property, Buildings and Amenities

Buildings and items of plant and equipment are recorded in the balance sheet at cost. The value of such items is brought to account as depreciation over the expected life of each asset.

Club Captain's Report

It has been a mixed year for the club, with some highlights, gallant efforts, and also some lowlights and areas which can be improved on. However, as always, the active Point Leo members were enthusiastic and enjoyed themselves, which is always a good start!

On a personal note, I would like to acknowledge the guidance and direction that Gary Tierney provided me during my time as Club Captain. While he didn't see the end of my term, he played a huge role in shaping and guiding me to be the leader in the club that I became and was the first person I would call for support. My heartfelt condolences go to Louise and family. It was a great honour to present Haydn Tierney (right) with this year's

Some changes were implemented this season which had a positive effect, however this needs to be an area of continuing development and improvement.



The training and assessment arena was expertly taken over by Bree Ambry this year and we have begun to chip away at the more senior awards required to patrol our beaches. Thankyou Bree for everything you have achieved this season for Point Leo – you have been a great recruit! The following table is a summary of awards.

However, some points on this table warrant discussion. Of the 247 basic qualified members (new and proficient Bronze Medallion and SRC holders), only 186 members patrolled, completing 6012 hours in total. Only 120 members completed the required 16 hours of service. If the remaining qualified members assisted in 1 patrol (as a minimum) next season, this would decrease the burden on the current active members, as 16 of our members completed over 50 patrol (excluding water safety) hours each. We defaulted three patrols – this is unacceptable.

Furthermore, only 20% (50) of our patrolling members met the senior qualifications required by State Centre (as many hold multiple awards). This meant that all of the patrols required over the season (approx 48 days) were shared between these 50 members. I personally challenge all members to obtain a new award next season and ease the burden – in a volunteer club we must all contribute to our patrolling obligations.

Vice Captain's Report

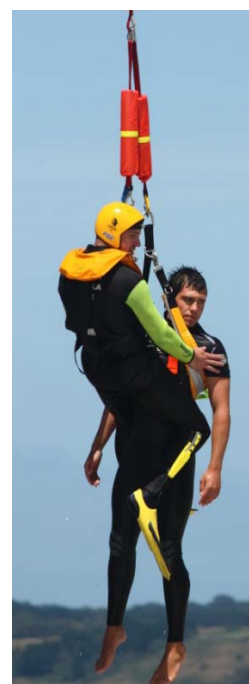

I also thank all of the members who have been involved with the delivery of training programs such as the Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) course, Bronze camp and IRB programs. I look forward to seeing these programs develop further as the new season commences.

While SLISA and LSV are increasing award requirements for patrolling, it is good to see so many members taking up the challenge to work towards gaining these new and additional awards. The season has seen an increased number of members gaining their Surf Rescue Certificate (43) and Bronze Medallion (60), along with an increase in the number of IRB awards (17) gained over the past season. A complete list of 2009/2010 new award holders is on page 36.

With the large number of nippers moving up to cadets in the 2010/2011 patrol season, along with new members joining the club, it is anticipated that we will need to run two Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) courses prior to the start of the new season. These courses will be in addition to the annual Bronze camp and the Adult Bronze programs. Please keep an eye on our website for information on upcoming training courses.

Dates for the Diary:

All Bronze, SRC, IRB and patrolling award holders are required to annually complete a proficiency test. The proficiency dates for the 2010/2011 season are as follows:

- Sunday 28th November commencing at 10am
- Sunday 19th December commencing at 10am

Further information regarding these proficiency tests will be on the club website as soon as it has been made available from LSV.

No different to last season, ice-packs and bandaids were the most frequent methods of treatment. Oxygen therapy was administered to five patients.

Steps in Preventative First Aid were taken in the following ways:

- The dissemination of basic beach-related first aid information through "The Mine" included information on the **prevention** of avoidable incidents (such as heat exhaustion) and information on the **recognition and management** of local hazards (such as jelly fish stings).

- Placement of signs and SLSA stickers (relevant to hygiene and safe handling) in appropriate places throughout the clubhouse.
- Shade, Sunscreen, Water, and Public Safety Messages at Events and Carnivals.
- Instruction and equipment demonstration for groups of Nippers as part of their Surf Education program and new award holders/patrollers as part of their orientation and on-going training.

Additions to the First Aid Room included a new Suction Kit.

I would like to thank all who assisted me throughout the season by helping to clean and organise the First Aid room and replace oxygen cylinders.

Moving forward we must continue to raise the bar and not only strive to achieve our personal goals but continue to accomplish results as a team.

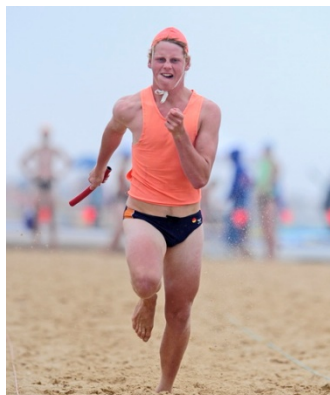

Holiday Program

There are a few things worth noting this year.

- Over the past few years, Point Leo SLSC made a commitment to support the continued growth and development of the Nipper program. This meant that numbers grew quite substantially, yet it was manageable growth in order to deliver a quality and safe program. It was agreed that for 2009/2010, it was time to consolidate so numbers were maintained at around the 400 mark. We envisage for the next few seasons that numbers will remain at this level. Age Groups will be capped appropriately and, aside from Under 7, new nippers in other age groups will only be able to be accepted where a vacancy is created due to non-renewal. This does put pressure on the Registrar and I thank Kim Williams for the many enquiries and nonsense she has to put up with!
- This was the second season that Cubs and Lions were split into two different sessions. This year the Cubs included the Under 7, Under 8, Under 9 and Under 10. The Lions included the Under 11, Under 12, Under 13 and Under 14. The Age Groups were organized like this to cater for the increase in numbers in the older groups. This is really positive as it indicates that Nippers are staying involved in Under 13 and 14. Previously many did not continue through to these age groups. The split sessions continued to work extremely well. There was pressure on water safety but this was somewhat alleviated by the appointment of a Water Safety Manager for each session and the increase in the number of under 14's who completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and provided water safety for the younger age groups. I would like to thank Nick Wood and Dee Walker who took on the difficult task of Water Safety Manager. I would also like to thank Richard Ellis, Tom Mollenkopf, Andrew Gibson and Marc Aliotti who assisted in mentoring Nick and Dee. Big thanks also to Blane Paton for managing the IRB Water Safety for both sessions. Blane did a terrific job. Water Safety is crucial to the success and the safety of the Nipper Program. We will continually strive for improvements in this area. And thanks to all the parents who did their bronze and also those who did IRB crew and driver courses so that we could provide a safe program.
- Following the 2008/2009 season with its record numbers, it was necessary to review the processes and structure (or lack thereof!) of the Nipper Program. A dedicated group of parents including Gavin Taylor, Di Summers, Stacey Lethlean, Duncan Fraser-Smith, Blane Paton, Lucy Gust and myself developed an organizational structure for the management of the Nipper Program. This structure was approved by the Committee and adopted this year. The introduction of this structure resulted in a more efficient and effective management process. It allowed for more information and training of Activity Leaders and Age Managers. It also meant that the workload was distributed and more minds were continually striving for improvements to our program. Huge thanks to Di Summers and Gavin Taylor. Di has taken on both the Administration and Age Manager's Leader roles and done an amazing job. Gavin, with assistance from Duncan Fraser-Smith, took on the management of the Activity Leaders and has been incredible.

It is vital that our Holiday Nipper Program remains focused on its main aims of providing basic beach and surf skills and raising awareness of safety within the beach environment. We aim to teach these skills in a fun way through an activity based program.

Our Surf Education program is getting stronger every year and I thank Wilga Kottek, Di Summers, Rowena Paton and the under 7 to under 10 Age Managers for this. The Surf Education component will be a focus next season. A growing number of Nippers are choosing the path to patrolling and water safety (rather than competition) and this is great to see. We will ensure that the needs of this group are catered for by striving to provide a stronger Surf Education Program and less competitive focus within the holiday program sessions.

Point Leo Swim Classic



Point Leo Swim Classic

The Boxing Day 2009 Point Leo Swim Classic was again a success. The Swim Classic is a major fundraiser for the Club and an important day on our calendar. Many thanks to our sponsors, our members and the Open Water swim community for their support in making this day a success.

The weather smiled on us, providing a warm and intermittently sunny day, ideal for an open water race. After a couple of unpopular

changes the previous year, we returned to the 1200m swim format and measured the 4 km run course more exactly – improvements that were favourably received. This year we had at least one hundred helpers on the day, doing everything from taking entries, to first aid, to providing water safety.

The one negative for the day was the breakdown of the sound system. Unfortunately someone ran through the dunes, tripped on a wire and dislodged a plug. By the time we located the problem we had twiddled so many knobs that we had to recall the technician to get us back on the air.

We now run four separate events on the day:

- First Reef 300 (Nippers / novice swimmers)
- Honeysuckle 4km Beach Run
- John Marshall Surf Race (400m)
- Point Leo Swim Classic (1200m)

Swim Classic numbers stay pretty stable around 290 swimmers. There are good and bad aspects to the Boxing Day timeslot. We have a lot of 'regulars' who set the day aside as the start of their recovery from Xmas excess. We also lose a lot of potential swimmers who have family commitments on the day. The Honeysuckle Run and First Reef 300 both tripled their numbers this year and we see good potential for future growth in both events. Next season we plan to run a 'Parent/ Child teams' category in the First Reef 300, so Nipper parents should start training now.

Gary Tierney

5.5.1949 – 19.11.2009

The 19th November 2009 was one of the saddest days in the long and proud history of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club. One of its most dedicated and longest serving sons, Gary Tierney, tragically passed away as a result of a motor vehicle accident in South Australia.

Gary's service to Point Leo spanned five decades and his heart, magic and influence touched every aspect of the club and everyone who has been associated with it.

Gary obtained his Bronze Medallion on 31st January 1965 and soon threw himself into all club activities with much gusto. He soon became a regular member of Victorian teams competing at the Australian Championships and had much success at the National level over many years. However, Gary's competitive streak was not his only forte in the early years. He became a patrol captain, a committee member and Gary set a wonderful example to other members as to what could be achieved with a fierce determination and unswerving club loyalty.



Over the next 40 years Gary excelled in a multitude of club activities – competitor, coach to all, numerous committee roles, club sponsor, recruiter, teacher and confidant. Gary touched literally hundreds of Point Leo members (and many other people) over this time in a positive and meaningful manner; he not only taught people how to be successful in the competition arena but had a major influence over the direction many took their lives.

Gary also played a significant role in the sustainability and success of the club, particularly in the more difficult times. Gary's personal and professional contribution to Point Leo placed the club on the path of continuous prosperity for which it will be forever indebted.

One of Gary's proudest legacies was watching his two sons Mark and Haydn take to the club and surf lifesaving in particular. Gary was often seen on the beach helping Mark and Haydn develop strong all round surf skills along with the broader characteristics that have made his boys strong, proud and successful men in their own right.

A précis of the many achievements and awards Gary obtained over the years include:

- Represented Victoria twice in the Wieland Shield team against the USA
- Represented Victoria eight times between 1966 – 1980 (as competitor, manager and coach)
- Point Leo Club Captain 1979 - 1981
- Point Leo Club President 1984 - 1985 and 1989 - 1993
- Awarded Life Membership in 1982
- Chairman of the 1985 National Titles Organizing Committee
- Inducted into the Point Leo Hall of Fame in 2005
- Won 8 Australian Title medals at Open National level between 1966 – 2004 (some 38 years apart)
- Won 4 Australian Masters Championship medals including Gold at Kurrawa Queensland in 1995 in the Over 120 Surf Team
- Won an inordinate number of State Title medals over the forty five years spent competing in Surf Lifesaving.

On 7th February this year Gary's ashes, along with those of his father Graham, also a past Club President and Life Member, were scattered in the waters off Point Leo beach in traditional surf life saving fashion. Many Tierney family members, friends, past and current club members attended the beach for this moving ceremony (below).



Gary is survived by his wife Louise, his two boys Mark and Haydn, his mother Claire and sister Cheryl.

Honorary Life Members

The club has a non-active membership category titled *Honorary Life Member*. Honorary Life Members may be elected, subject to qualifying under certain provisions as detailed in the Statement of Rules of the club. To be elected, persons have to be members of the club and must be nominated by a member of the club. Nominations are considered at a convened meeting of the existing Honorary Life Members who consider the nominations to ensure that they meet the stated qualifications for honorary life membership.

If the meeting of Honorary Life Members determine that the nomination meets the qualification for special service then the nomination is forwarded for final determination, by vote, at the Annual General meeting of the club. Once approved at the AGM, that nominated person becomes an Honorary Life Member of the club.

Since the founding of the club on 1st April 1955, thirty five members have been elected to Honorary Life Membership of the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club. Sadly twelve of these Honorary Life Members have passed away since they were elected, one of these being Jill McKellar, the only female member of the group.

Of the remaining twenty three, four currently reside interstate and the remaining nineteen live around Melbourne, many locally on the Mornington Peninsula. Regular contact is maintained amongst the group, either through the club or through the Bobbas.

Richard Ellis, the longest serving Honorary Life Member (even though he insists he is the youngest looking), is still very active around the club, particularly with the Nippers. Clayton McDonald still regularly does patrols, Alf Treadwell and John Horwood are Vice Presidents of the club, Geoff Waters, Peter Ford, Ron Murray and Garry Rydberg assist with coaching R and R and surf boat competitors, Peter Gibson is always around, with a smile on his face, to assist in maintaining gear and equipment and the club's newest Honorary Life Member, Max Jeffrey, is only too happy to help out at the Nipper BBQ and the club dinners.

All Honorary Life Members of the club maintain a healthy interest in the activities of the club and are always keen to assist with and participate in social functions and fund raising matters. The club's 50th Anniversary celebrations held in April 2005 were a terrific example where many of the Honorary Life Members rallied around to help with organization and to assist with the publication of a commemorative book.

Honorary Life Membership is not like other membership categories where members are accepted into the club as long as certain qualifications are met. Honorary Life Membership recognizes those members who have met objective and/or subjective provisions for qualification as a minimum, but they must also be recognized for their special service to the club over an extended period of membership.

Nominations for Honorary Life Membership of the club are encouraged and are always treated by the meeting of the existing Honorary Life Members with a great deal of respect and consideration and final decisions on all nominations are not made lightly. If any member of the club wishes to consider the nomination of another member for Honorary Life Membership it would be a good idea to seek assistance and advice from a committee member or an existing Honorary Life Member, they would be only too happy to oblige.

Point Leo SLSC Bobbas

In the late sixties a number of the early members of the club who for varying reasons had drifted away from the day to day activities of surf life saving decided to get together as a group and meet regularly on a Friday night to have a social drink, or two. The common theme of course was the Point Leo SLSC and the group wished to remain involved with the club and assist however possible at social

functions, working bees, carnivals at Leo etc. The group decided to call themselves The Bobanarrings, after Bobanarring Point, the original name of Point Leo. This in turn became the Bobbas.

Over the years the Bobbas kept up their meetings at various pubs and clubs around Melbourne and held social functions and golf days but after awhile, mainly because of career and family obligations, the Bobbas fizzled out. Some of the highlights included the newsletter "The Bobbas Bugle", and the bottling of some Brown Bros port, trips to Sydney to swim against the Harbord Frigid Frogs and kids Xmas Days at Leo, some of which featured a young Max Jeffrey as Father Xmas.

Around the time that the National Titles were held at Point Leo, 1985, Geoff (The Dude) Kinsey decided to take on the task of reviving the Bobbas, with reasonable success. A great function was held at the Flinders Pub on the Saturday night of the Titles, the Bobbas assisted where possible with the day to day running of the carnival and later on at other carnivals held at Leo. The Dude also organized club reunion functions and revived the "The Bobbas Bugle". But once again this fizzled out. In the mid-nineties The Dude made a come back and commenced organizing reunion lunches at the Prince Alfred Hotel in Richmond. These occasions became known as Legends Luncheons and were mainly attended by some of the original and early members of the club who had kept in touch over the years. Geoff enthusiastically kept this up until his untimely death in January 2000. He also organized some club reunions, grand final lunches and a couple of New Years Eve functions at the Leo clubhouse.

Various people kept the Legends Luncheons going at PA's and in 2005 the club decided to arrange a 50th Anniversary function at the Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club and at the clubhouse at Leo. A number of the Bobbas/Legends chipped in to help organize and run these highly successful functions and in fact it was three of the early members, Alan Warby, Dick Batchelor and Brian Horwood, who put together and produced a great read in the "Fifty Years of Service and Achievement" publication of Point Leo SLSC.

Following the 50th there was a renewed interest in the Legends and attendees at the luncheons started to include a number of the "newer" old members. It was agreed that three luncheons would be held each year, one in April, one in the week before the AFL Grand Final and one in early December.



Due to the involvement of Gary Tierney other Hall of Famers, Peter Francis, Damien Flouch, Geoff Waters and Ron Murray became regulars along with occasional visits by our interstaters Geoff James, Loftus Overend, John Forsyth and John Jones.

A highlight of the last luncheon was the attendance of Dick Ellis, one of the original co-founders of the club, now better known as the sausage sizzler on our Nipper days at Leo. And of course it was good to see the Club President, Marc Aliotti and Club Secretary, Andrew Gibson come along also. We are working on Garry Rydberg and Tom Mollenkopf. Also it has been agreed that we would revert to being known as The Bobbas.

These luncheons (above) are now becoming a unique opportunity not only for the old timers to get together but also for these guys to meet some of the newer and current members and keep abreast of what is going on at Leo. It probably sounds like "death's waiting room" but it certainly isn't – not yet anyway.

In March this year we held our first Bobbas Golf Day at the Flinders Golf Club and it went very well. We welcome anyone from the club who would like to attend our luncheons and if interested get in touch with the convener, John Horwood, through the club.
