The 2010/2011 season was an outstanding success for the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club. The club had one of its most successful competition seasons in many years. We concluded our patrol function on a stable and solid note, continued to host an array of surf club related functions and events with success, and also held numerous social occasions that greatly assisted in bonding the fabric of this great club.

The actual list of events, functions and community service the club has provided this season is enormous and more detail about these will appear in the relevant sections elsewhere in this annual report. However, I would like to list some of these as a guide and reminder of the broad and vast great work the club does for the community, its youth and broader membership:

- Had solid representation at every carnival (Junior, Senior and Masters) in Victoria this season
- Successfully managed the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (Nippers) of some 450 Nippers
- Had 184 Nippers attend the State Titles at Lakes Entrance
- Had 60 senior competitors attend the State Titles at Lakes Entrance
- Won the Junior points tally at the State Titles and finished second overall in the combined junior/senior points tally
- Had 33 competitors attend and compete at the National Titles at Kurrawa, Queensland
- Won a National gold medal for the first time in twelve years thanks to Coach Geoff Water's Open Women's R & R team
- Held numerous spit roast nights, a muso night, Nippers' functions and disco that saw hundreds of members, supporters and families have fun and engage with the broader club
- Held a magnificent annual presentation night that was standing room only!
- Continued to secure a number of major sponsors to assist and support the club financially
- Continued to invest in infrastructure gains for the club and its environs
- Worked closely with the Point Leo Foreshore Committee and broader community to provide a safe environment for all visitors to the Point Leo area

These are just a few of the enormous tasks the club undertakes on an annual basis and it is sometimes timely to reflect on the overall breadth and scope of the activities the club participates in. This year I am proud to report the club has excelled in many areas. I also believe it is timely to reflect that the club has again achieved a tick for the most important function it delivers to the community – maintaining a safe bathing and beach environment throughout the patrolling season. This is without doubt our number one priority and well done to everyone who assisted in this outcome for this season.



On a broader note, I am also pleased to report that the club is in a sound position. The club has a solid and hardworking committee that has put in hundreds of hours of work behind the scenes this season. NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 2011

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these accounts.

a) General

These financial statements are prepared for distribution to the members and for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply the Accounting Standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements, except for those Standards specified in Schedule 1 of the Associations Incorporation (Prescribed Particulars) Regulations.

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention and a going concern assumption. They do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non current assets.

The accounting reports have been prepared on the basis of recognizing in dollar value only assets and liabilities generally described as cash based.

b) Principal Activity

The Club's sole activity is to provide life saving services and facilities for the community and its members. The Club did not carry out any trading activities during the financial year other than those incidental to the above activity.

c) Income Tax

No amount was required to be provided for income tax.

d) Property, Buildings and Amenities

Buildings and items of plant and equipment are recorded in the balance sheet at cost. The value of such items is brought to account as depreciation over the expected life of each asset.

Chief Instructor's Report

The 2010/2011 Lifesaving Season saw an increase in the number of Nippers developing their skill level and gaining their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC). Due to the high number of participants this season we ran three programs for the SRC; this allowed us to train 46 new SRC's. In the 2011/2012 season, we are endeavouring to run at least two SRC programs, with facilities to run additional programs should there be the need.

The Bronze camp was again very successful with 37 members completing their Bronze medallion assessment. In addition to the Bronze camp, the club also had 11 members complete their Bronze award through Westernport Secondary College, and we again had a number of adults completing their Bronze award throughout the season.

I would like to thank everyone who was involved in the running of all training programs throughout the season. Without your help, we would not have been able to conduct these very successful programs.

While many members will choose to only gain their Bronze Medallion, I would like to remind members that there are many other awards that they are able to work towards, including first aid based awards and IRB awards. Unfortunately, the number of people gaining additional awards was rather low in 2010/2011, and we would like to see the number of Point Leo members attending training programs increase over the next twelve months.

Members will be able to refer to the club website or the club facebook page during the year for information regarding future courses. By completing additional awards, members are also helping our club from defaulting on patrol.

There will be a few changes occurring in the 2011/2012 patrol season, with the main change seeing all members who hold an IRB award having to complete an in-depth proficiency paper and a practical component at the annual requalification. Once the details of the requalification have been received from Surf Life Saving Australia and Life Saving Victoria they will be circulated to all members holding an IRB award.

Lastly, in order to continue running the Bronze and SRC Camps, the club requires more qualified trainers and assessors. There are courses for Trainers and Assessors coming up later in the year on the Mornington Peninsula, so if you are interested in becoming a trainer or assessor, please let me know.

Again I would like to thank everyone involved in the training and assessing of our Bronze and SRC programs, and I look forward to working with you again in the new season.

The trip to Wollongong to row in the ASRL Open was an eye opener for our girls as they raced against crews from all over Australia that were far more experienced and probably just a bit fitter and stronger too. Wollongong had challenging

Natty and Simmy G then spent five hours at Tweed Heads Hospital (NSW) getting Simmy G's injuries treated and decided that only a good friend would drive interstate for medical treatment! Hopefully next year the girls will get to compete, but between now and next Aussies they have acknowledged that they have a lot of work to do to improve their surf skills.

Not only did the girls have a great season of training and competing but they had a great social season, including sharing tents at carnivals, drinks after carnivals, and dinners and nights out with the other Victorian crews. The season culminated in the boatie convention at Kurrawa, which was a very festive day celebrating the season of rowing and congratulating those who did well. Our Women's crew had a good first season together. It had its challenges but they will make the girls stronger rowers for next season. Thanks must go to the sweeps Phil and Grumbles (Peter Ford) for all their efforts throughout the season.

Junior Report

Once again, Point Leo SLSC Nippers had an awesome season!

Our program continues to evolve. Each year, new elements are introduced that ensure we have the most progressive and effective program. It is amazing to see just how far we have come over the journey.

A bit of semantics, but we are now referring to our Program as the **Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP)** rather than the "Holiday" Program. This is because we want to position and promote our program as an activity based education program rather than something "kids do" in the holidays. Our goals remain constant and focused. Our main aims are to develop basic beach and surf skills and raise awareness of safety within the beach environment. This is provided in a fun way promoting a healthy and active lifestyle. The JSLP has several pathways for Nippers to move. It can lead to competitive involvement, to Water Safety and to the development of lifesaving skills. Ultimately we want our Nippers to continue to be involved in a capacity of patrolling and for some competition. Point Leo SLSC is a very competitively orientated club amongst the

junior ranks. Our focus however, has been to keep a "balance" between the skills and the sport. We strive to maintain that balance during the JSLP.



Point Leo SLSC is a club that embraces all levels of competitive involvement, not just the "best" or the elite. Our Competition Program is now stronger than ever with the introduction of training from October. The commitment to training has had a huge impact on our club in terms of competitive success but also in a sense of belonging to the club. No longer is Nippers just something you do to fill in time over the summer break. At Point Leo SLSC, you can now be serious about surf lifesaving as a sport .The additional training has also provided a pathway for junior competitors to enter the ranks of seniors. Thanks to Jon Ford, Chris Munro and their many helpers for their time and devotion to developing a strong training program.

JSLP Program

Things worth noting this year include:

- Over the past few years, Point Leo SLSC made a commitment to support the continued growth and development of the Nipper program. This has meant that numbers have grown quite substantially yet it has been managed growth in order to deliver a quality and safe program. Whilst it was agreed that it was time to consolidate numbers, we did in fact increase the numbers of Nippers by over 50. In Under 7, 8 and 9 Nippers were capped at 30 male and 30 female. In Under 10,11,12,13 and 14, numbers were capped at 32 Male and 32 Female. This increase was to try to accommodate as many as possible of those "desperate" to join the ranks of Point Leo SLSC to develop surf lifesaving skills. Nipper membership is now 456. Sadly, there are some that still missed out as some Age Groups were over subscribed. There are, however, spaces in other Age Groups so theoretically we could accommodate over 500 and we are hoping to achieve this over the next few years.
- A special thanks to Kim Williams who worked tirelessly on Nipper Registrations. Once again, Kim was inundated with emails and applications to join our program. This is an incredibly time consuming and difficult task and Kim does a great job maintaining her patience!!
- The organisational structure introduced last year continues to provide a more efficient and effective management process. It has allowed for more information and training of Activity Leaders and Age Managers. It has meant that the workload is distributed and more minds are continually striving for improvements in our program. Dianne Summers once again has taken on both the Administration and Activity Manager roles and has done an amazing job. (As she is also doing Cadets, she has been very busy!). She engaged the help of Therese Neal to assist with the Administration Role. Gavin Taylor, with the assistance of Duncan Fraser-Smith, took on management of the Activity Leaders and both have been incredible. Gavin also took on the Competition Manager role and has been instrumental in streamlining processes here. Andrew Welsh has been a very welcome addition to our Management Team. On an operational level, he has been responsible for the purchase, repair and transport of boards to Carnivals. He has also provided great direction and insight into decision making and in the running of the program. An absolutely massive thanks goes to Di, Gavin, Duncan and Andrew. Our program continues to develop and improve because of your commitment and dedication.
- This was the third season that Cubs and Lions were split into different two sessions. The Cubs include the Under 7, Under 8, Under 9 and Under 10. The Lions include the Under 11, Under 12, Under 13 and Under 14. The split sessions continue to work extremely well. The beach and water areas also look fantastic with the addition of flags highlighting the various areas.
- Water Safety continues to be a challenge but the appointment of David Buntine as Water Safety
 Officer has alleviated many of the issues we have experienced in the past. I thank David so much as
 rather than volunteering, he was dragged into the role by a very persuasive Gavin Taylor. David, to
 his credit, took ownership of the role and did a terrific job. Water Safety is crucial to the success and
 the safety of a Nipper program. We will continually strive for improvements in this area.

- Big thanks also to Blane Paton for managing the IRB Water Safety for both sessions. Blane, once again, did a great job. His ever expanding team of drivers and crew were amazing out there. His fearless team can be found in the IRB section of the report.
- Huge thanks to all those who provided Water Safety for our program. This includes the Surf Rescue Certificate cadets (right), "Bronzies" and parents with bronzes. There are too many to mention but you guys are so important. We would not be able to operate without the safe environment which you provide.
- A goal of JSLP is to develop our Surf Education program and it is getting stronger every year. I thank Wilga Kotteck, Kimberley Lipszyc and Amy Dewhurst for this as well as their assistant Romy Lipszyc (who was prodded and poked in the name of first aid!). The surf education

component will continue to be a focus for the next season. A growing number of Nippers are choosing the path to patrolling and water safety which is fantastic. We will ensure that the needs of this group are catered for by striving to provide further education and first aid elements within the JSLP sessions.

- The Junior Club Championships were run on our final JSLP day. This day was run like a mini carnival to give those new Nippers an opportunity to experience the carnival atmosphere in a familiar, relaxed and fun environment (on their beach with their mates). The Nippers got to participate in a wade, board, sprint, flags, swim and Iron race. The results from each event were aggregated to give an overall girl and boy club champion for each age group. A list of the Junior Club Champions can be found on page 38. The day was a HUGE success and many thanks to Gavin Taylor who organised this day. It was great to see so many Nippers having fun whilst experiencing competition.
- This program is a parent operated program and I am convinced that we have the most enthusiastic, capable and highly motivated and involved parents. That is why our program is so sensational.
- Our Age Managers are truly incredible. They take care of their own group of kids and not only
 organise but nurture, encourage and motivate them through the JSLP and in most cases the
 Competition Program. The assistants are also to be thanked for their strong support of the Age
 Managers and for taking over when required.
- We also have the best and most skilled Activity Leaders around. Thank you all for your dedication and contribution in delivering a sensational Nipper program.
- Thanks to Jenny Burgess and Annette Precht for taking on the Uniform shop with such skill and patience.
- This year, we introduced a roster for the parents who had not taken on a major role. The roster covered BBQ, Beach Set Up and Clean up. All in all, the parents rose to the occasion and were fantastic in contributing where they could.
- Once again I extend my gratitude to the amazing BBQ team of Steve Roadnight, Richard Ellis and their many assistants. Not only do they provide much needed sustenance but they raised over \$7,400 which is a fabulous effort.

- Also thanks to Tina Bedford who not only provides the best coffee and Iced Chocolates on the Peninsula for us but also donated \$2,530 to Point Leo SLSC. Great work!
- Thanks also to the leadership of our Club Captains Caleb Grey and Lucy Welsh and our Vice Captains Lachlan Robinson and Natalie Dimitrakis. You guys are great role models. I congratulate all of you for your wonderful season and hope to see you back helping out next year.
- And finally congratulations to all the inspirational Nippers who participated in the program with so

Junior Competition Team

Whilst the focus of Point Leo Nippers is participation, all Nippers enrolled in the JSLP are also given the opportunity to compete for Point Leo at Junior Carnivals. All nippers irrespective of their individual abilities are encouraged to join the competition team. This season, 240 juniors registered to continue with training and competition beyond the JSLP. This represents a significant increase on last year and continues an established trend of growth in competition numbers. Whilst the increased number of nippers enrolled in this year's JSLP contributed to this expansion there are several other potential reasons, including:



- High retention rate of Nippers from last year to this year.
- Excellent professional coaching provided by dedicated and experienced club members.
- Emphasis on fun and participation.
- Support from committed and enthusiastic Nipper parents.

Carnival Review

In total Point Leo Nippers competed in 5 carnivals including the Regional Qualifying Carnival and the State Championships at Lakes Entrance.

A team of 120 Nippers attended our first carnival at Cosy Corner in January. This is an extraordinary number considering 3 years ago our team at Cosy Corner totalled approximately 30 kids. Naturally we competed strongly across all age groups in what became blistering weather conditions (beach flag events were eventually cancelled because the sand was too hot).

Our second carnival at Elwood took place in mild weather conditions in late January. As Elwood is a small beach a staggered start was employed with the older age groups starting later in the morning. Approximately 150 Point Leo kids competed against a mixture of bay and surf clubs. Once again Point Leo Nippers acquitted themselves well with numerous individual and team successes. The staggered start times appeared to work with most age groups finishing their competition with minimal delays.

The Regional Qualifying Carnival was shifted at the last minute from Mount Martha to Point Leo due to the poor water quality in the bay. With less than 24 hours notice, the club organised work parties to set-up for the carnival as well as notifying every Nipper family of the change of venue. A remarkable achievement made

possible by the hard work and organisational skills of club members. More than 200 Point Leo Nippers competed to qualify teams for States. Excellent results were achieved with most age groups qualifying two teams or more for each event.

The final carnival before States was held at Point Leo in late February. Over 1,000 Nippers from all over the State registered for the carnival with approximately 200 from Point Leo attending. Unfortunately the weather deteriorated throughout the morning and the carnival was eventually cancelled with some age group events uncompleted. However, strong results were recorded by Point Leo Nippers in very challenging conditions.

The Junior State Championships were held at Lakes Entrance for the second year in a row. Our largest ever States team of just over 180 Nippers attended this carnival. Many remarkable results were achieved in all age groups with a vast number of Nippers winning multiple medals. In total 42 team medals and 36 individual medals were won by Point Leo Nippers. Point Leo was announced as State Junior Champions for the third consecutive year.



It was also a very proud moment for the club when three of our under 14 competitors, Jordan Collins, Olivia Keppell and Caleb Gray, received LSV State Competitor Awards for season 2010/2011. Jordan was awarded for her outstanding performances in female beach events, Olivia for female water events and Caleb for male beach and water events. In addition Olivia Keppell and Caleb Gray were announced as joint winners of the Fred Westfield Medal for the Junior Athlete of the Year. This was a fitting finish to their Nipper season for all three athletes who have worked hard for their success.

Future Challenges

The increased numbers of Nippers competing for Point Leo presents many challenges that need to be addressed. This year an Equipment Levy was introduced as part of the Nipper membership fees. The funds raised from this levy enabled the purchase of a significant number of new boards for the season. The continuation of this Levy will enable the continued repair and upgrading of Nippers equipment.

An ongoing issue is our requirement to provide sufficient water safety and equipment to cover our carnival obligations. The contribution that parents and club members make to fulfil these obligations is invaluable and their efforts deserve special recognition. Our challenge is to encourage more parents to become suitably qualified so that our increased water safety requirement is easily met.

Board transport has become problematic, as the club trailer is no longer suitable to transport the number of boards needed for carnivals. Discussions on replacing or upgrading the trailer are ongoing and are aimed at meeting our current and future needs. Many thanks to the individual families that assisted with board transport over the course of the season.

The retention of members in the Under 14 to Under 19 age groups is a difficult task for all Victorian Life Saving Clubs. Point Leo SLSC has been no exception and this year the Club undertook a targeted initiative to tackle this issue. We view it as essential to ensure our youth remain engaged and committed to all aspects of club life.

During the 2010/2011 season a structured cadet program was offered to the cadet age group, including the Under 14 Nipper group. This commenced with a cadet launch afternoon in December to introduce cadets to the opportunities for involvement in various club programs over summer. Cadets were also able to meet senior

members who would be involved in the program in support and training roles and to offer ideas that they would like to see implemented.

Social media is an important part of youth communication, hence a Point Leo SLSC Cadet facebook page was developed by one of the senior cadet members with the support of the Cadet Team. The facebook page provided a form of communication amongst the youth membership and also provided a direct link between the Club and its youth membership, rather than relying on communication via parents. Information about club activities and competition training schedules were linked to the facebook page, along with a Social Media Policy that was ratified by the Club Committee.

A Point Leo SLSC Reward and Recognition program based on the LSV Youth Initiative Program (YIPS) was introduced in the form of a rewards passport for the u15 to u17 age groups. The concept is quite simple - it is a reward and recognition program that operates in a similar process to 'Frequent Flyer' points. The cadets collect points for being involved in all facets of lifesaving at the Club. This includes competition and training, gaining lifesaving awards, assisting with water safety and aspects of the Nipper's program, attending patrols, being involved in club social events and undertaking fundraising initiatives. Cadets are able to work towards Bronze, Silver and Gold rewards, requiring increasingly higher points accumulation for the relevant award level. All levels also have a mandatory patrol hour requirement, ensuring that our youth membership is committed to the core business of lifesaving. This year, our first Bronze level award recipient was Will Sullivan who commenced the season by completing his Bronze medallion and went on to provide assistance to the Nipper program throughout the season, attend some training sessions, provide water safety at junior carnivals, assist with the fundraising raffle and enjoy social activities at the club. A great example of youth participation! Five of our Under 15 cadet members were also accepted into the LSV Youth Development camp run in April 2011, focusing on leadership skills that can be utilised to further enhance our Club Youth programs.

Participation in fundraising events was strongly encouraged with the introduction of muffin baking and a raffle during selected Nipper sessions, raising approximately \$1300. Cadets also participated in the campground and road side tin shakes.

Cadets were able to attend board and swim training camps as well as regular training sessions and club nights throughout the season. These programs were led by the club coaches and were very well attended by cadets and had a positive flow on to our Senior Competition results and social connection across a wide age range.

In the Under 14 area, 2010/2011 saw a large group of members complete their SRC at the club, with 50 candidates attending either a 2 day training program or overnight camp before completing the award. As a result,

Gary Tierney Foundation

A Legacy of which we can all be Proud.

It is fitting that the first year of operation of the Gary Tierney Foundation has been bold, aspirational and successful beyond expectation. "Fitting" because the man in whose name this foundation has been established was a person of vision and action. Gary Tierney made things happen.

And so it has been a pleasure and an honour for all of us on the Foundation Board to carry on that tradition in a small, but important, way.

The late Gary Tierney joined the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club in 1964 as a junior member and retained a passion for the club until his untimely death in November 2009. A champion surf swimmer, Gary served for many years on the Point Leo committee, holding various positions including Club President. Behind the scenes, Gary also generously provided significant financial support to the club and individual members, as well as fulfilling an important mentoring role.

To perpetuate Gary's memory the club established the Gary Tierney Foundation Fund in 2010. A separate Advisory Board administers the Foundation under a legally constituted governance charter and investments are restricted to those approved under the Trustee Act. The Board includes two past Presidents of the Point Leo SLSC, members of the Tierney family and club members with appropriate legal, investment and commercial expertise.

The changes to the Club's Constitution were made at the Annual General Meeting on 14 August 2010. In less than 12 months, the Foundation has already become well established. With the benefit of several generous donations having been made, including from the Tierney family and the Club itself, the Foundation had achieved a balance of in excess of \$80,000 by June 2011. The Advisory Board has set a target for capital of the Fund of \$200,000. The Board aims to grow the capital base and to leave this intact, drawing only on the income that can be generated from this securely invested amount. This will ensure that the Foundation has an enduring benefit for decades to come.

The Foundation's aim is to provide financial support to enable younger members of the Club to fulfill their potential in surf lifesaving. Grants will recognize and assist individuals who demonstrate the best of lifesaving – integrity, leadership and loyalty – and who have the potential to make an ongoing contribution to the Club. 

A bit of history re Dick Ellis:

In 1954 Dick Ellis was a member of Sorrento-Portsea SLSC and along with another club member, Alan Forster, had often talked about forming a new club.

After looking at quite a few locations Point Leo was chosen and in 1955 Dick and Alan co-founded the Point Leo SLSC with the first meeting of the club being held at Shoreham on 1 April 1955.

Dick, who at the time was one of the strongest pool swimmers in Victoria, was the initial club captain with Ron Anstee, father of current Club Vic-President Steve, as the vice captain.

Dick was involved in every aspect of club life – getting the first bronze squad organised, choosing the site for the clubhouse and commencing building works, transporting competitors to carnivals, organising patrols and so on. In those days only 2 active members were over 21.

In 1959 Dick became Chief Instructor of the club and in this role, with the assistance of junior club members, played a big part in the reformation of the Lakes Entrance SLSC.

In 2003/2004 after an invitation from Club Life Member Al Buxton, Dick became re-involved in club activities assisting with Nippers BBQ.

Dick attends every possible club function where the BBQ is needed. It is estimated in this season alone that Dick contributed to cooking and turning well over 10,000 sausages (Info supplied by Steve Roadnight!). Since his return in 2003 what we do know is that Dick has assisted in feeding many a hungry nipper, parent, patrol member and anyone else who needs a feed at the club.

The club is blessed to have volunteers like Dick around to support it and it is even more blessed to have one of the co-founders and initial club captain from 1955 still volunteering many hours of help some 56 years on.
