President's Report

I am proud to submit my first report as President of the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club.

I was lucky to inherit the President's role at a time when the club is in excellent standing across all aspects of life saving. This is in no small part due to the leadership of our immediate past President, Ian Knight. I would like to thank him for his many years of service to the club and his personal support over the last year. It was particularly pleasing to see him achieve his goals at the Masters National Championships in Scarborough with a Surf Teams Silver Medal.

Season 2013/2014 saw the club continue its history of excellence in the four pillars of life saving:

- Patrols,
- Community Engagement,
- Competition, and
- Development.

I am pleased to report on the success of a range of new initiatives in all four of these areas this season. In the patrols area Captain Jack Garner and Vice Club Captains Morgan Jones (until January 2014) and Callum Pearse (from January 2014) ran weekend patrols for the first time to build on our result from season 2012/2013 as the "Most Improved" in the state. These weekends allowed the patrol teams to get to know each other better, enhance their lifesaving skills and build a sense of belonging within each patrol. I thank each of the Patrol Captains and Vice Club Captains who took on additional responsibility to make these weekends both fun and educational.

The club expanded its community engagement through a very popular season opener event, walking around the streets of our local area. This was a great way for people to get together before the season kicked off, and for our neighbours to meet us away from the flags. The multi-cultural and disabled surfing events hosted by the club this year expanded the community that we engage with, through the people who participated and also through the media coverage that these events attracted. These events also provided an opportunity for personal development for our members as they learned about other cultures and the broad spectrum of ability and knowledge that is too often hidden in the term "disability". It is encouraging that there is strong support from within the club and with our new friends to continue to grow these programs in the coming years.

This season has seen continued momentum in the competition sections with the appointment of Jon Ford to the role of Head Coach. This role is responsible for increasing sporting participation and excellence across the junior, senior and masters teams as well as developing coaching expertise from the amazing group of athletes we have within the club. Jon has taken to this role with gusto; setting goals, planning and establishing training facilities and opportunities for athletes of all levels. The competition team was well led by an active group of coaches over summer who undertook a new mentoring program for athletes. I would like to thank Jon, Chris Munro, Lachlan Pearse, Matthew Bunting-Frame, Clayton McDonald, Haydn Tierney and Hayden Rydberg for their ongoing commitment to the club.

While we mainly focus on the summer competition season, over winter 2013 Point Leo successfully competed in its first pool competition season with medals at the State Titles and representatives selected for the State Team. The pool team is busy training for the 2014 State Titles to be held in August for both Junior and Senior athletes. This winter also sees an emerging IRB competition team. This type of competition provides an opportunity for our patrolling members to increase their driving and crew skills in a wider range of surf conditions. I encourage anyone who is interested in IRB training to join this growing team. These two new teams will be bolstered by a Life Saving Team for the coming season as part of

the longer term goal that the coaches have set for the club to win the overall points score at State Titles by 2017.

You will find more details on all of these initiatives later in the report, but I would like to also draw your attention to some other highlights of the season:

- Huge Bronze camp, with over 50 candidates qualifying.
- Great attendance and smooth running of the Boxing Day Swim.
- Inductee for the fourth year of the Gary Tierney Foundation (Jack Garner).
- The Club hosted both a Junior and Senior carnival over one big weekend, with very positive feedback from Life Saving Victoria on the service and support we provided to the carnivals.
- The competition team made a trip to the Manly/Freshwater Australia Day weekend of carnivals.
- Strong representation at all carnivals including the Junior, Senior and Masters State Titles; and Senior and Masters Aussies.
- Three National Masters medals – Gold for David “Jack” Russell, Silver to the 150+ Surf Team of Frank Christian, Jack Russell and Ian Knight and Bronze to Frank Christian in the 55 – 59 Surf Race.
- Ongoing close relationship with the Point Leo Foreshore Committee and broader community to provide a safe environment for all visitors to the Point Leo area.

With 1200 members, the club is in a stable financial position and will carry no debt into the coming season. We should all also be proud of the productive and collaborative relationship we maintain with Life Saving Victoria.

While Season 2013/2014 has undoubtedly been a great success across all aspects of life saving, as we prepare for the 60th anniversary of the club in April 2015 we must be cautious not to rest on our laurels. Specifically, we face the ongoing challenge of meeting our patrolling requirements not just in regards to numbers on the beach (particularly in the second half of summer once we all head back to school and work), but also in the number of qualified members across the range of life saving awards. We will be offering training in all awards in the lead up to the 2014/2015 season and I challenge each active member to gain a new award.

The Gary Tierney Foundation continues to work towards reaching its capital base to ensure that it can continue to support the development of our younger members for years to come. We would like to reach this target in the coming year so that we can focus future fundraising activities on a new five year plan to refurbish and upgrade our clubhouse to meet our growing needs. You will be hearing more about these infrastructure plans as part of a wider vision for the future of the club.

As President one of the more difficult tasks I have faced has been selecting worthy recipients of the Senior and Junior President’s Awards and the Dick Catterick Award (Best Club Member). I am honoured to nominate the following people for their outstanding contribution to the club:

- Senior President’s Award: Andrew Gibson
- Junior President’s Award: Hannah Carboon
- Dick Catterick Award: John Horwood

The club is exceptionally served by the hard work of the committee, who come from a wide spectrum of the membership base and therefore ensure that you are all represented in decision making. In particular I would like to acknowledge the contribution of Club Secretary Andrew Gibson, Club Treasurer/Registrar Kim Williams and Club Captain Jack Garner. These three work incredibly hard for the club and their unwavering commitment ensures that we meet our compliance requirements and all the activities of the club keep ticking over, as well as literally keeping the lights on by paying the bills and fixing things.

On behalf of the club I would like to thank our Sponsors; these individuals and businesses provide support to our core activities and their contribution means that we can continue to provide a safe beach environment for each other and the community, as well as continue to provide opportunities for our members to grow and compete. Please take note of our Sponsors and thank and support them when you can.

There are too many people doing small and large things around the club to thank them all here, but I assure you that each and every time you help out we are all grateful and as a club and a community we all benefit. It is this sense of family and friendship that is what makes Point Leo great!

Whether it is the smile on the face of the nipper who makes it around the swim cans for the first time on their own, the Bobba laughing while catching up with long lost friends, the board paddler pumping the air while crossing the finish line, the parent proudly wearing their Lion spray jacket, the new bronzie sighing with relief after passing CPR or the nameless member of the public leaving the beach tired and happy after a safe day on our beautiful beach, each of you make these things possible.

Congratulations on a great season, thank you for all your efforts and I look forward to seeing you all on the beach this coming summer.





Scope

We have audited the attached special purpose financial report comprising the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement and Accompanying Notes of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the year ended 30th April 2014. The members of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on its preparation and presentation. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with Australian accounting concepts and standards so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the financial position of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. and the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualifications

It is not practicable for us to audit all monies received prior to the initial entry of those transactions in the accounting records. Accordingly, the audit of those receipts was restricted to the amounts recorded in the accounting records.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 2014

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these accounts.

a) General

These financial statements are prepared for distribution to the members and for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply the Accounting Standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements, except for those Standards specified in Schedule 1 of the Associations Incorporation (Prescribed Particulars) Regulations.

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention and a going concern assumption. They do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The accounting reports have been prepared on the basis of recognizing in dollar value only assets and liabilities generally described as cash based.

b) Principal Activity

The Club's sole activity is to provide life saving services and facilities for the community and its members. The Club did not carry out any trading activities during the financial year other than those incidental to the above activity.

c) Income Tax

No amount was required to be provided for income tax.

d) Property, Buildings and Amenities

Buildings and items of plant and equipment are recorded in the balance sheet at cost. The value of such items is brought to account as depreciation over the expected life of each asset.

Club Captain's Report

The 2013/2014 season has once again proved to be an enormous success across the full spectrum of club activities. The club hums with life over the summer period, and this season was no exception. We had the largest number of attendees at our bronze camp, record numbers of nippers on the beach, an array of highly tuned athletes training and competing throughout the season and record high attendance at patrols. A huge assortment of members contribute, in both small and large capacities, over the summer period and into winter to ensure that the club runs smoothly over this exceptionally busy period. I will touch on only a few of these people, but I extend my personal gratitude and thanks to all of those who committed their valuable time to help build, maintain and improve Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club over these last twelve months.

The patrols section of the club has gone from strength to strength over the past few seasons. Morgan Jones has redesigned and redeveloped the patrols and we are beginning to reap the rewards of the hours of hard work that he has contributed to the club. This year we saw the inclusion of the highly successful weekend stay over, involving a double header Saturday and Sunday patrol, with a team dinner on the Saturday night. The response from the patrollers has been highly positive, and the number of patrolling members over the peak periods has increased greatly.

Congratulations are in order for Morgan Jones, who has temporarily left our fold, and moved to Sydney to continue his studies. Morgan has donated a huge amount of time and effort as Vice Club Captain over the last two years; the role which in essence involves the co-ordination of all of the volunteer patrols for the whole of the summer season, and ensures that our most basic function, of keeping the beach safe, is met. Morgan has been a great asset to the Club and the committee; his conscientious work ethic, mastery of the patrol team formulation and good humour will be sorely missed. Thankfully we had a very suitable candidate in Callum Pearse for his successor. Callum has been a patrol captain for a number of years, helped to train and run recent Bronze Camps and is a mature and hardworking club member. He has done a fantastic job of running what is the club's most essential function for the second half of the season.

Thank you also to all of the members who patrolled consistently throughout the season and especially those who attended the number of extended hours patrols that we put on; without you the patrols would not function. It's also fantastic to see so many young SRCs and Bronzies (as well as some more "senior" patrol members) wearing their yellow and red and doing the club proud down on the beach.

Swim Section Report

Continued performance and success by the Swim Section has cemented Point Leo as one of Victoria's premier surf swimming clubs.

Point Leo has successfully fielded swim competitors during the Summer Surf Series, interstate events, State Championships, National Championships and LSV and SLISA Pool Competitions. We have also had numerous members represent Victoria in State teams.

At the State Championships members of the Swim Section won a total of 10 medals between them - a great effort!

Our Masters swimmers were very successful at the Masters State Titles. A total of 13 medals were won (7 gold, 3 silver and 3 bronze).

Well done to the team of athletes that trekked to the Australian Championships at Scarborough. Again the Masters team demonstrated how to compete at high-level competition returning home with 3 medals (1 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze).

For the first time in the Club's history we had a team of swimmers participate in the LSV Pool competitions and the Victorian Pool Championships in August 2013. The swimmers were very successful bringing home a total of 29 medals between them (8 gold, 12 silver and 9 bronze). - More regular testing (e.g. time trials/fitness), documentation and feedback to athletes.
- Expanding of the coaching section with a focus on new young coaches and all competition sections.
- Targeting specific team events at 2015 and 2016 Aussies where there is a realistic chance of a medal.
- A recruitment drive particularly targeting swimmers and runners.
- Expansion of the Athlete Mentoring Program.
- Complete reworking and session by session planning of our training program.
- Greater conversion of Bronzies into ongoing club activity participation.
- A range of Board and Ski initiatives (see section report).
- An expanded social program throughout winter for all athletes U14 and up.
- Introduction of the “Leo Legends Cup”; a monthly award and perpetual trophy for the best trainer of the month.

Some fantastic developments relating to these plans include:

- Lucy Welsh and Bella Ford being nominated and accepting the role of Board and Ski Vice Captains.
- IRB training commencing with the highly accomplished Rob Andronaco as the coach backed up by Matt Bunting-Frame. Many younger members are already on a waiting list to do their crew award and get involved.
- Hannah Carboon committing to further developing R & R after a stellar performance from her and her athletes (right) at the 2014 Junior State Titles.
- A number of new swimmers committing to the club once getting their Bronze.
- Iris Cassell, Zach Richter and Tony Carr taking on the running of the Pool competition with many athletes expressing a strong interest to participate in 2014.

- An enthusiastic reception, particularly by members whose focus is patrolling, on the Lifesaver Events. Stay tuned for more information on this from your Patrol Captains.

One of the club highlights is always the “Leo Gold”. Based on the famous Coolangatta Gold (and being only a fraction shorter) Point Leo athletes on 15 January toiled to the Camo Pole and back (ski), ran to 2nd reef and then to the powered camping site, swam around cans to the pier at Crunchies and then boarded home. The race was handicapped and had perfect conditions for the second year running. Congratulations to Zach Richter for winning this annual event.

In terms of season 2013/2014 the extent of our results can be seen in the section leader reports. Point Leo came 6th in State Titles this year (1 point behind Torquay). We are optimistic that we can significantly improve on this in 2014/2015. A substantial result in the Lifesaver Events in February will be essential to improving our overall State ranking.

Outstanding results for last season include Claudia Whitfort, Lachlan Robinson and Kate Cassell-Ashton being selected in the State team, Jack Russell’s individual gold medal at Aussies as well as teaming with Frank Christian and Ian Knight for silver in the 150+ years Surf Teams and Bella Ford’s final appearance at Aussies in U19 individual ski. Finally we had 11 athletes selected in the State High Performance Squad. Chris Porter (Victorian Head Coach) and a range of other elite coaches will be mentoring and benchmarking these athletes in the lead up to season 2014/2015; a great opportunity!

Junior Surf Lifesaving Program

The 2013/2014 season has proved to be another successful season for the Point Leo Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP). Participants both competitive and non-competitive have been engaged in a quality Life Saving Program. The balance between fun and sending the right message about safety around the water has been maintained. The Surf Rescue Certificate Camp in December was at its highest participant level ever. This has been very successful in ensuring that our cadets and older Nipper members continue to support the club in many other capacities. It is also fantastic to observe the friendships that have developed from the Nipper program. The importance of such relationships cannot be underestimated.

Point Leo JSLP Numbers

As the program relies totally on volunteers - and with a record 469 children participating this year – I have been thrilled with the awesome support from our Nipper families. We simply cannot run the program without water safety, IRB crews, activity leaders, age group managers, competition managers, administrative support and the group of helpers who clean, cook sausages and provide help in so many ways. A feature of this year’s program has been the enthusiasm, the commitment and the selfless work done by so many. In order to continue to provide a safe and high quality coaching program we need to focus on the ongoing requirements of recruiting and training new IRB drivers, bronze qualified parents and motivated activity leaders.

In particular this year, I would like to thank the Activity Leaders. Our Nippers benefitted from high quality and consistent coaching in beach sprints, surf swimming, board and beach flags. I must acknowledge the role of our club seniors, many of whom took on Assistant Activity Leader roles and shared not only their skills, but also played an important mentoring role.

The support provided by water safety this year was exceptional. Many of our Nipper parents were awarded their Bronze Medallion during 2013, and along with our existing “Bronzies” did a fantastic job of keeping our children safe in the ocean, and also provided encouragement and reassurance to so

many. Our newly qualified SRCs were also amazing, and their care and patience with the children was awesome.

Of course the program couldn't run without the Age Managers and Assistant Age Managers. Some age groups had up to 35 children – all of whom had to be encouraged and nurtured over the three week program. You have all done a magnificent job.

Many children managed to conquer personal inhibitions about the sea as well as develop crucial skills. The energy and 'buzz' on the beach was fantastic! Well done to all of you.

I know that there are many people who 'put-in' to the Club and spend many hours organising and ensuring that everything runs smoothly. To the coaches, uniform shop gurus, BBQ supporters, cleaners, patrol personnel and people that I may have missed, THANK YOU, and I hope you continue to be part of a very special team next season.

Junior Competition Team

Whilst the focus of Point Leo Nippers is participation, all Nippers enrolled in the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP) are also given the opportunity to compete for Point Leo at Junior Carnivals. Juniors interested in competition are encouraged to become part of the Point Leo Competition Team, irrespective of their abilities. This season in excess of 130 Point Leo Nippers registered and competed, making our junior competition team a force to be reckoned with.

There are many potential reasons for such a large competition group, including:

- The inclusive and supportive nature of the JSLP program.
- Exceptional encouragement and support from a large group of dedicated Age Managers.
- Excellent professional coaching provided by experienced club members.
- Tireless support from a committed and engaged Nipper parent group.

Every Junior wishing to compete in water events at carnivals must meet the Junior Competition Skills Evaluation requirement (previously S-badge). Accordingly, the first few Nipper sessions are always chaotic as there is limited time for their proficiency to be assessed and details processed before our first carnival. The pre-season assessment session enabled a large number of Juniors to pass their Junior Competition Skills Evaluation ready for the Cosy Corner carnival in early January. This was a great success as it eased the workload once the JSLP commenced. Thanks to Andrew Welsh, Dana Sawyer, Andrew O'Hara and Di Summers for organizing this and thanks to the large contingent of water safety personnel who ensured the safety of our Juniors. The collation and data entry workload associated with Junior Competition Skills Evaluations is enormous and the work done by D'Arne Longwill in diligently completing this must be acknowledged.

In total, Point Leo Nippers had the opportunity to compete in 5 carnivals including the Regional Qualifying Carnival and the State Championships at Warrnambool. In addition, under 13s and 14s were able to compete at the Point Leo Senior Carnival in February.

Our first competition carnival for the year was “Cosy Corner” in Torquay. Always a popular carnival, Point Leo had 129 competitors. The day was beautiful with perfect conditions. All the large west coast clubs competed at Cosy Corner including Torquay, Jan Juc, Anglesea and Lorne and I am very proud that Point Leo came in second overall.



Point Leo hosted the Regional Qualifying Carnival on 1st February. As the host club, a large number of club volunteers were required to help organise and run the carnival. This carnival ran seamlessly and it was a credit to the many club members who assisted on the day. Over 130 Point Leo Nippers competed in excellent conditions. Terrific results were achieved with all Nippers relishing the opportunity to compete in team events and qualify teams for the State Titles. Most age groups qualified two or more teams for each event.

On Sunday 2 February, our U13 and U14 Nippers had the opportunity to compete in the Senior carnival held at Point Leo. It was a spectacular event, with hundreds of surf boats, surf skis, boards and swimmers taking to the water at any one time. It gave our Nippers a chance not only to experience the brilliant atmosphere, but compete against Nippers from the other big clubs in a quite different environment.

The next carnival on the program was held at Jan Juc on Saturday 8 February. Our competition team attended in good numbers and performed well with outstanding individual and team results across all age groups.

The Torquay carnival on 22nd February introduced an experimental staggered start time formula, with Cubs starting early and Lions later. For families with nippers in both groups, it proved to be a very long day. The tough conditions, both in and out of the water, highlighted the dedication and passion for surf life saving held by both the Nippers and their fabulous parents.

A team of approximately 110 enthusiastic Point Leo competitors descended on Warrnambool for the State titles in mid-March. After navigating the seaweed, which had blown in overnight, the individual events were conducted on the Saturday after a delayed start. A number of outstanding individual results were recorded with Point Leo competitors medaling in all age groups. On Sunday our competition teams competed bravely and skillfully with many teams medaling. At carnivals end, our point score was sufficient to secure fourth place overall at the State Titles. Congratulations to all our Competition Team members on achieving such a fantastic result.

Congratulations must also be passed on to Hannah Carboon, who was named R & R Coach of the Year. Hannah coached two teams, Under 12 and Under 13, to win gold medals at States. The Under 13 R & R Team, comprised of Abby Allsopp and Hailey Reid also won R & R Team of the Year.

Of course we couldn't compete at carnivals if we didn't provide officials and an amazing fifty-five Nipper parents turned up to the official's course held at Point Leo. I would encourage those of you who haven't yet done so, to complete the required paperwork and qualify as an official.

The large number of Nippers competing for Point Leo presents many challenges that need to be addressed. A major issue is our requirement to provide sufficient water safety personnel and

equipment to cover our carnival obligations. The contribution that parents and club members make to fulfill these obligations is invaluable and their efforts deserve special recognition. However, we need more Nipper parents who have their Bronze to train as IRB crew or drivers as we have a critical shortage of suitably qualified parents.

A feature of the 2013/2014 Junior Carnival Program was the high ratio of carnivals held at open beaches (especially West Coast beaches). It is expected that this trend will continue as water quality issues at bay beaches make the scheduling of carnivals at these venues a risky proposition. The challenge for us is to equip our competitors with the right level of skill and knowledge to compete confidently in open beach conditions. The continued evolution and expansion of the coaching program and the development of specialised coaches will dramatically improve the confidence and competence of all Nippers in surf conditions.

The involvement and support of Nipper parents is crucial to the success of Point Leo Nippers. The commitment of the IRB crews throughout training and competition needs to be acknowledged, particularly the efforts of Blane Paton and Chuck Warner. Particular mention should be made of the outstanding work done by David Austin in managing the competition team in a thoroughly professional manner. His organisational skills and attention to detail ensured the smooth running of the competition program. The support provided by Andrew Welsh, Iris Cassell and Dianne Summers should also be acknowledged. Finally a big thank-you to all the parents and club members who assisted with the myriad jobs associated with completing another successful season.

Gear Steward

The club maintains a vast inventory of essential lifesaving equipment that enables us to fulfil our water safety and patrol obligations. This includes regularly used equipment such as rescue boards and tubes but also less obvious equipment such as defibrillators and radios. This equipment must be maintained in a constant state of readiness and accordingly must pass a yearly gear inspection where their function and suitability for purpose is assessed. In addition, this equipment is further assessed as part of random patrol inspections throughout the season. The amount of work required to pass

gear inspection each season is enormous. Preparation for gear inspection requires many hours of repairing, replacing or upgrading equipment as dictated by LSV guidelines. The considerable amount of work undertaken by Blane Paton, Matt Bunting-Frame and Andrew Gibson in preparing our equipment for inspection needs to be acknowledged.

A large proportion of the club's activity revolves around competition and training. Accordingly, a wide range of lifesaving craft is maintained for Nipper and Senior competition. Each season our board stocks are assessed with older boards culled and new boards ordered. Considerable time is also spent during the season repairing damaged boards. Continual expansion and evolution of our Senior Competition Team has also placed greater demand on cadet board stocks and consequently board storage. Improved board storage and continual replenishment of board stocks will continue to be the primary focus over the next few years.

During the season we took delivery of our new Junior trailer. The trailer (right) was built to our specifications by Advanced Trailers in Hastings and was made possible through the generous financial support of club members and sponsors. This trailer is specifically designed to carry all our equipment securely to Junior carnivals and is a considerable improvement on the old Junior trailer.

Clubhouse Report

Some good work has been done around the Club again this season.

- Last year's big story was the asbestos (cement sheet fragments) found in the sand in front of the clubhouse. The asbestos was removed by a contractor paid for by the Point Leo Foreshore Committee and the area was covered by crushed rock and clay. It was ultimately determined that the cement sheet had come in decades ago with loads of gravel put down to make a track to the beach. We have planted grass over the site and hope to establish a nice extension to the lawn in front of the Clubhouse.
- We employed a professional painter to use the 200 litres of Weathershield paint donated by Dulux. This was the yellow (Wheat) colour and did about half the downstairs outside render and brick. Dulux have promised 250 litres more to finish the job.
- A new double fridge was bought for the kitchenette. Thanks to Haydn Tierney for procuring a good deal on this.
- The equipment room was given a major revamp before the season, with extended board racks, installation of a flammable storage cabinet (acquired courtesy of Richard Ellis) and relocation of reels and oars.
- The IRB room had a major overhaul with a new vice, cupboards, bench and shelving and three new trolleys. The trolleys have greatly reduced manual handling of motors, thereby reducing injuries.
- IRB and equipment room improvements made the whole storage area much roomier and more efficient through the busy times.
- The Building Sub-Committee was re-established to look at the long-term needs of the club facilities. This work will continue into next season.
- The Club has applied for a \$60,000 VESEP grant to refurbish the toilets and change-rooms. Many thanks to Simon Merrigan for his quick and elegant production of plans for this upgrade.

Jack has offered a vast amount of time over his years at the Club and we believe he has more to offer. Jack continues to look for innovations in Club operations, increasing member retention and youth development, and the overall enjoyment of every club member.

As a young member just concluding his university studies and embarking on a career, the Advisory Board considered that he would benefit from financial assistance to support his professional development and leadership skills within surf lifesaving. The Fellowship involves an annual payment of \$1,000 over three years which is intended to assist with lifesaving development costs.

Jack's Fellowship was announced at the Foundation Presentation Night on Saturday 4 January 2014 at the clubhouse.

Financial Position

With the generous support of Club members (past and present), the Club committee and the Tierney family, the Foundation is now secure and well on the way to achieving its target of \$200,000. This is the capital amount considered necessary for the Foundation to ensure that it can be self-sustaining for decades to come. As at the end of the Financial Year (30 April), the Foundation's balance stood at just over \$179,000. At the date of this report (24 July 2014) the figure had grown to some \$188,000.

The total of donations, fundraising events and a transfer from the Club came to approximately \$33,000 during the year. Interest on investments totaled just on \$14,750 and Fellowship Grants were \$2,000.

The Advisory Board has taken a conservative financial approach in these formative first four years of the Foundation as the capital of the Fund is built. The Board is now considering what other initiatives it can support consistent with its Charter.

Annual Financial Statements and Governance

The Gary Tierney Foundation Fund is a sub-fund of the general Gift Fund of the Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Incorporated. The Club has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office as a deductible gift recipient in respect of its general Gift Fund. The Foundation was established to support and raise funds for the Club consistent with its purposes and in particular to provide financial support to allow younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving.

As a sub-fund, the Foundation's finances are audited as part of the Club's Statutory Audit. A separate account is maintained to ensure that all amounts donated to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with the approved purposes as specified in the Foundation's Governance

Charter. The Foundation's Charter and Grant Policy were approved by the Club Committee in December 2010.

The Foundation's patron is Louise Tierney. Advisory Board Members during the year were:

The Board formally met on ten occasions during the financial year to 30 April 2014.

Grants Policy

The Foundation has established a Grants Policy and it has published Guidelines for Nominations. These are available to all Club members.

The Board seeks nominations publicly, via the Club Committee, or it may nominate of its own motion following any consultation or enquiry it considers appropriate. For the 2014/2015 season, the Board expects to call for nominations in October and will announce the Awardee in January 2015.

Point Leo SLSC Bobbas

Steve was part of the 6 Man R & R team that won Silver at the SLSA Nationals at Scarborough in 1991.

Election of New Honorary Life Members

Two well-known and very worthy members were admitted to Honorary Life Membership at the Club's 2013 Annual General Meeting: Kim Williams and Andrew Gibson.

Kim Williams joined Point Leo SLSC committee in season 1998/1999 following an earlier involvement with her daughters in the Nippers. In that first year Kim joined the club committee in the role of Team Manager. In 1999/2000 she took on the role of club Registrar and in 2004/2005 Kim was appointed Treasurer.

Kim has continued in both roles and has overseen the club's involvement in Surfguard, has helped set up and taken responsibility for the club's website, has directly been involved in preparing and publishing the club's annual report since 2006, weekly club emails, and also The Mine. Kim has also found time to assist with the running of Dude's Bar, the uniform shop and the Boxing Day Swim Classic. Kim also attained her Bronze Medallion in 1998 and qualified as a Level 1 Surf Official in 2008.



Over the past 15 years Kim has been a major contributor on the club committee and a number of sub-committees such as Awards, Constitution Review and Nippers and has on the club's behalf maintained a regular and steady relationship with LSV and SLSA.

Andrew Gibson gained his Bronze Medallion in December 1994 and commenced patrolling the beach at Point Leo in that season. He has patrolled every season since and in most years has clocked up between 60 and 80 hours on the beach. In 1999 Andrew took on the responsibility for beach patrols at Point Leo, introduced the "Point Leo Surf Rescue Team" concept and improved patrolling standards to the extent that the club finished 3rd in the LSV Patrol Competition in season 2003/2004.



In season 1998/1999 Andrew joined the club committee and has served as a general committee member, Vice Club Captain and in 2006/2007 he took on the role of Club Secretary, a position that he still maintains. Over the years Andrew has had a "hands on role" in a number of areas: Boxing Day Swim Classic co-ordination, maintenance and management of club assets, and qualified as a LSV carnival official attending many carnivals to ensure that the club's commitments are met.

In the past three years Andrew has intensified his involvement in surf life saving education, assisting with annual bronze camps, adult bronze squads, and with IRB training.

Club members attending the Annual General Meeting voted to approve both Kim and Andrew's nominations and all club members congratulate them on their election as club Honorary Life Members.

Election of Life Patron – Richard Ellis

At the 2013 Annual General Meeting, Richard (Dick) Ellis was appointed to the position of Life Patron. This appointment recognised Dick's exceptional services as an Honorary Life Member of the Point Leo SLSC.

Dick has had an outstanding involvement with the club. He, along with the late Alan Forster and the late John Marshall, was a co-founder of the club in 1955 and in those very early days he played a very big role ensuring that all new members to the club became qualified to gain their Bronze Medallion, thus enabling the club to formally patrol the beach at Point Leo.



Dick was the first Club Captain and was involved in everything that happened at the club – competition, patrols, instruction, chauffeur to carnivals, administration and fund raising. He also played a huge role in the construction of the clubhouse at Point Leo. It was very much a "hands-on" job carried out primarily by club members and a few very helpful locals and Dick, because of his building background, took on the position of site supervisor and he carried it out very well.

He was also club delegate at State Centre (now LSV) and filled a number of other positions with the Board of Examiners and within State Centre. For a number of years Dick had to step back from his direct involvement with the club due to family and business matters; however he always maintained an interest in all things at Point Leo.

In more recent years Dick has become involved at the club with the Nippers, organising and running the BBQs that provide refreshments at each Nipper session. He is very much a familiar face around Point Leo SLSC and it is a complete surprise to most current members when they learn of his lengthy and prominent role in the formation of our club.
