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President's Report

The 2015/2016 season was another good one for Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club on all fronts. We kept the beach safe, made an impact at carnivals, ran successful training programs, engaged the community and most importantly had fun doing it.

Club Captain Jack Garner and Vice-Captain Zach Richter provided leadership of the patrols that saw good numbers and professionalism throughout the season. Point Leo performed well in the patrol audits this season; unfortunately the patrol audit results for the state and region are not yet available. One of the pleasing aspects of the patrols this year was the engagement of the new SRC and Bronze lifesavers, they are the future of the club. The Patrol Captains are to be congratulated for their efforts this year. On behalf of the committee I thank each of you.

Another aspect of keeping the beach safe is the Nipper Program which focuses on imparting basic surf awareness and safety skills to younger members of the club. This year 460 nippers from the ages of 6 to 13 signed up for the program. Under the leadership of Catherine McCraith the program ran like clockwork. The depth of support for this program is one of the key factors in its success. Age Group Managers, Activity Leaders, parents, patrollers and IRB crews rise to the occasion each day and ensure that everyone has a safe and enjoyable time while learning basic surf skills.

As usual training was a large part of this year's program. SRC, Bronze Medallion, IRB Crew and IRB Driver courses were run with positive feedback from all. One of the assessors of the Bronze camp commented that it was probably the most competent Point Leo group she had assessed. At this point I should mention that we started the season without a Chief Instructor primarily due to the onerous nature of the task. As is nearly always the case at Point Leo, when there's a need someone usually steps up. I would like to congratulate and thank Brittany Morgenthaler for taking on the role. Special thanks to Blane Paton for his efforts in facilitating the IRB training. This aspect of life saving has become increasingly difficult due to the time required to meet the competency standards currently in place.

As part of our commitment to competition we hosted two summer carnivals this year over one weekend. Andrew Welsh and Kate Stern coordinated the planning for the Peninsula/Eastern Region Nipper Carnival followed by LSV Senior Carnival #4. Two days before the Nipper Carnival LSV asked if we would also be able to host the Nipper Carnival scheduled for Elwood as the bayside water quality forced its cancellation. As history now shows the carnivals were an outstanding success with most Victorian clubs in awe of Point Leo's ability to accommodate the change on such short notice. We must also recognise Ranger Tony and the rest of the Foreshore team for their support and co-operation. With over 1,000 nippers participating on the Saturday there can be no doubt that the junior programs are alive and well.



Regional Carnival Traffic

It has been an outstanding summer season for competition with Samantha Howe dominating at the State and National Pool Competitions which included setting a new World Record in the 50m manikin carry. Sam's incredible achievements have been rewarded with a well-deserved position on the Australian Youth Team to compete at the World Titles to be held in the Netherlands in September. Sam is the only Victorian to make the team. Congratulations Sam, and best of luck in your final preparation and at the Worlds.

The Aussies were a successful outing for the team led by Team Manager Iris Cassell and Head Coach Jon Ford. Among countless personal bests from the team, the outstanding results were from Frank Christian taking Gold in the Masters Tube Race and Silver in the Surf Swim, James Paton coming 4th in the U17 2km run, Bella Austin making the U14 Board final and a 6th place to our U15

R & R team in their first competition season. To have such strong results at both ends of the age spectrum is a great sign for the club as we continue to grow the competition area.

At a State level the competition team continues to improve performances, with the Masters Team coming second at the State Masters competition and too many medals from the Open and Junior State Titles to mention here. It is particularly pleasing to see the U17 and U19 age group competitors working so hard towards their goals on the beach as well as taking the time to support other team members during training and on competition days. Thank you to our members who sign on as officials at carnivals and complete our water safety and IRB duty – without these tireless volunteers the orange cap wouldn't be able to step up to the start line.

The club was very successful in the pool lifesaving competition in 2015. A talented team of only eight members competed in the State Titles and took out second place behind the very strong Mordialloc team. We also had four members selected in the Victorian State Pool Team. Congratulations to Samantha Howe, Madison Howe, Zach Richter and Caitlin Robinson who all competed for Victoria on the Gold Coast in January.



On the community front we again hosted the Disabled Surfers Association at several events and the ever popular Multicultural Day (left). The bringing together of members of the disabled and multicultural community, life savers and other volunteers is certainly a formula for putting “Smiles on Dials”. Congratulations to all involved.

Membership over the 2015/16 season was lower than expected with a total of 1170 members, 75 less than last year. This was down due to less Nippers which resulted in fewer Associate members.

The financial results for the period ending 30 April 2016 produced no surprises. While our club remains in a strong financial position we will need to commit to some serious fund raising if we are to undertake some of the capital projects around the club. The challenge facing the Future Project subcommittee is to integrate some of the shorter term imperatives in the overall plan, in particular toilet and shower facilities and gear shed maintenance. Thanks to Jody Williams and her team for the progress made to date on the futures plan and to Kim Williams for her support, diligence and planning in all things financial.

One of the things all Presidents find difficult is the singling out of members for the President's and Dick Catterick awards. This year is no different; many people have done an outstanding job in supporting the club and its activities. One member stands out every year; he works tirelessly for the club and fits all the requirements for all awards, he is already a life member, and this year was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in recognition of his contribution to Lifesaving. Congratulations Andrew Gibson OAM.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2016

Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

General information

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an Association incorporated under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2016 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management on July 3rd 2016.

Financial reporting framework

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The Committee of Management has determined that Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. (the Association) is not a reporting entity.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*, the recognition and measurement requirements specified by Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures'.

New and amended standards adopted by the association

The association has adopted all the amendments to Australian Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board, which are relevant to and effective for the association's financial statements for the annual period beginning 1 May 2015. None of these amendments have had a significant impact on the association.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Property, Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(d) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(f) Revenue and other income

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(h) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(i) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(j) Impairment of assets

At each reporting date, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(k) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

(l) Comparative information

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

(m) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

(n) Events after the reporting date

There have not been any material events between the reporting date and the date of signing of the financial statements by the Committee of Management.

Report on the financial report

We have audited the accompanying special purpose financial report of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc., which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30 April 2016, the Statement of Profit or Loss and other Comprehensive Income, the Statement of Members' Funds and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the Members of the Committee of Managements' declaration.

Members of the Committee of Management's responsibility for the financial report

The Members of the Committee of Management of the Association are responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The Members of the Committee of Management's responsibility also includes establishing and maintaining internal controls necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal controls relevant to the Association's preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Association's internal controls. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Members of the Committee of Management as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the Independence requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Members of the Committee of Managements' financial reporting responsibilities under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

From the first weekend of December until Easter the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club is alive with activity and as always it's been fantastic to see so many people down at the club and getting involved. What some in our community do not see is that the Club actually runs for twelve months of the year. I'm going to briefly mention a few members that I have had the privilege of working with closely. First, let me extend thanks to the executive, the committee and the broader club membership for another fantastic season on the beach.

We began the season without a Chief Instructor – a pivotal role in the training and education side of the club. First Aid Report

Point Leo SLSC lifesavers attended to a total of 50 first aid cases over the 2015/2016 lifesaving season; 39 minor first aids and 11 major first aid cases. This is comparable to the previous season. Three carnivals in the season contributed to the number of First Aids, as did large swell coinciding with some hot weather, resulting in three suspected spinal injuries and a shoulder dislocation. The treatment of spinal injuries in all cases was very well-handled and Paramedics commended our proficiency. To ensure we continue to be well prepared, conducting a Spinal Management course before next season will be a priority.

First Aid at carnivals and the Swim Classic was very well organised. Thank you to all our Club medicos who assisted and particularly to Dr Graham Cato OAM, who brings his vast expertise to our Swim Classic every year.

22 of 50 (44%) of injuries were associated with Club activities: Nippers, Active Members or carnival participants. There were no injuries related to the Swim Classic, down from 8 in the previous season (these were all hypothermia). Total injuries were down 17%, minor injuries were down 27%, but major injuries were up 37%.

The Ambulance was called for the three spinal injuries and the shoulder dislocation.

Pool lifesaving competition was taken up by just a few athletes this year, eight in fact, but they had a truly amazing outcome with 21 Gold medals, 12 Silver and 5 Bronze. Congratulations to the team (pictured left) of Zach Richter, David Austin, Kate Cassell-Ashton, Samantha Howe, Caitlin Robinson, Madison Howe, Jack Cester and Isabella Austin. These few athletes all contributed valuable points to our overall club point score.

Congratulations to our Point Leo athletes that were selected to represent Victoria in the Australian Pool Lifesaving Championships. They headed off to Queensland for some tough competition. Zachary Richter, Samantha Howe, Madison Howe and Caitlin Robinson, we are very proud of you all!

Our carnivals were attended with enthusiasm, the weather as always was four seasons in one day, but it never dampened the spirits of our athletes. The State Titles proved to be testing of our ability to adapt with an eleventh hour change of venue from Fairhaven to Lorne. With our accommodation scattered across the surf coast we all made it to the beach in good time for warm up. Our team of 40+ athletes, coaches, officials, bus driver and families worked together to make the weekend a success. We placed 5th overall with 257 points. Some highlights were:

- Winning a swag of belt races with some first timers such as Abby Lethlean scoring a Gold medal. Zach Richter also scored Gold in this premium event.
- Our U17 boys Josh and Nick commandeered a Bronze medal in Board Rescue after an appeal in the heats that lasted a nail-biting 12+ hours.
- Caitlin Robinson's amazing board race.

Highlighting the individual efforts by all athletes, it is difficult to separate when there is so much commitment and so many wonderful races. It was marvellous, however, to see Caleb Gray back on the beach racing back to back Iron events for an emotional finish with his family at the water's edge.

The event of the year is always the Open Men's Taplin; we fielded two teams this year. The Taplin is the greatest form of internal competition in our club. For the record, the B team outclassed the A team and the rematch line has been drawn in the sand for next season.

The Australian Titles were held across three beaches on the Sunshine Coast this year. Beach events at Mooloolaba, surf at Maroochydore and boats at Alex Headlands. - Greta Ross made it to the quarter final in U17 Beach Flags.

We need more swimmers, runners and paddlers to knock off Mordy and cordially invite new Masters into the fold! In order to compete in Masters you must have a Bronze Medallion award and complete the prerequisite number of patrol hours.

Aussies – Sunshine Coast

The Leo 'Masters' ventured off to Maroochydore a bit lighter in numbers this year. However, as always the team were keen to 'get on the beach' and test their mature yet ageing skills against the best in the land.

Frank Christian finalled in the 55-59 years surf race and in a thrilling race was third across the line and second Aussie (a visiting American from Laguna Beach just pipped Frank on the line however Frank was the second Aussie so a Silver medal was just awesome).

The tube race again saw Frank Braun and Ian Knight make their way to semi-finals however no finals here. Frank Christian thought he needed to make a statement to all and sundry and lined up on the red and yellow can (right) in the final against some super opposition including one Stephen Fry from Northcliffe. Frank had a wonderful start, swam a perfectly straight course and though the judges took a long time to decide, the outcome declared Frank the winner by the smallest of margins – another Aussie Gold to add to his impressive Aussie medal haul that first started for Frank way back in 1974 at Glenelg, S.A. as a Junior!



The next event saw our coach and mentor Jon Ford take on the best in the 50-54 iron man final including the likes of Grant Kenny. After a super tough start across the bank that saw two packs miles apart in the swim leg Jon powered through to come 13th from a 24 man final. Another great result.

Beach Competitor of the Year: James Paton

James took it up to the 2km Run this year as a personal goal and consistently achieved throughout the season, regularly winning pennants and proving a force to reckon with. A Silver medal at the State Titles was a remarkable achievement and compliment to his external running activities. A well-disciplined athlete, a self-starter and committed to excellence, James has worked tirelessly to maintain consistency in his application to this race. A season highlight, and a result that he should be very proud of, is his earning a fourth place finish at the Australian Titles this year. A national highlight for us all. Well done James!

Head Coach Report

The competition section has established some challenging goals for itself. Supported by a series of specific actions and targets, by 2017 we aim to win Club of the Year, with Point Leo the Victorian hub of coaching and training excellence (development and elite).

Evaluation of season 2015-16

The club has maintained and grown its State Surf Carnival results in terms of performance and also depth of competitors. We held our 5th position on overall Club points score in 2016 (5th 2015; 6th 2014, 2013; 4th 2012).

Athlete coaching and support services were established for most competition sections in a sustainable manner overseen by the Head Coach and we had 44 competitors at Senior States and 25 athletes attended Aussies, with a number of athletes within striking distance of making finals. There is emerging depth in the open ranks (particularly males) boding well for taplin in the coming year and we fielded an R & R team at Aussies, coming 6th in the final. There were ongoing outstanding results in the pool (coming second overall in States) and Leo has multiple State Team members in the pool and beach competitions and Samantha Howe was selected for the Australian Youth Team.

Sadly, the loss of some high performing competitors (Claudia Whitfort and Piper Harrison) plus Samantha Howe not being available for beach states had an adverse effect on our overall points score.

Strategies and actions underpinning our success

A comprehensive training program was provided for Point Leo athletes which included a series of training sessions covering ski, senior board, board skills sessions, U11-13 board, board/ski/swim, kayak/ski sessions, Beach and Swim. Multiple sessions were held each week variously at Leo,

Frankston and Martha Cove. Thanks to Travis Cargill, Di Summers, Nick Clarke, Clayton McDonald, Bella Ford, Tom Aliotti and Caleb Gray.

Board and ski sessions, gym, run and iron/transition training will take place over winter increasing as we move into spring/summer. The Nippers training program will expand under supervision of Kelly James and Cameron McGill will commence as a coach running 5 sessions per week from Patterson Lakes Canoe Club.

Point Leo Code of Conduct and Competition Culture

The competition team has demonstrated consistent adherence to the Point Leo Code of Conduct. There is a positive and highly supportive culture within the team. It is planned to grow this with camps that expose athletes to a variety of experiences, further developing a leadership group of senior athletes (including the Board and Ski Vice Captains) who lead by example and conduct training sessions, attending at least 5 Carnivals as well as States and Aussies. We will also communicate positively with athletes and hold a monthly social event for the competition and coaching group.

Athlete recruitment

Further efforts were made to recruit from kayak, swimming and running clubs. This included a professionally designed (Adam Francis and Craig Ross) promotional A3 flyer which was emailed to clubs. There was a positive response from a number of clubs.

A strong collaboration was formed with Patterson Lakes Canoe Club. Potential exists for an immediate and highly effective recruitment program with Boronia Swimming Club following preliminary meetings. 'Come and try' days conducted for R & R and boats, were well received. A masters' boat team is looking feasible with the participants geared up to continue to grow boats with younger members of the club.

The Cadet Info Night (preceded by Cadet ring-around) was again held with good levels of engagement. A number of Peninsula athletes have approached the club regarding transferring for season 2016/2017.

Competition section camps and key events

A solid social calendar was maintained which was well received with good participation. Pittman's Pain, Clubby Surf Comp, Leo Gold and Kerry's Kelpies were successfully run by Bella Ford and Lucy Welsh (Board and Ski Vice Captains) and we plan to repeat and extend in 2017.

Competition camps were over-subscribed and very well received: Board Camp, Swim Camp, and Competition Camp with Jeff Lemo (September 2015).

Mentoring program for developing and elite athletes

The successful mentoring program continued in 2015/2016. This was an adaptable model depending on athlete requirements. The primary mentors of 12 elite athletes were Jon Ford and Clayton McDonald. These athletes undertook formal goal setting and training planning, a training diary, regular meetings with the mentor and assistance at carnivals. Other emerging athletes engaged in a less formal mentoring program provided by Bella Ford.

Coaching development

A formal coaching development program continued through 2015/2016 including identification of potential coaches, support to complete the Level 1 Coaching Course and practical support and training for coaches and Nipper Activity Leaders.

Gear Steward

The club maintains a vast inventory of essential lifesaving equipment that enables us to fulfil our water safety and patrol obligations. This includes regularly used equipment such as rescue boards and tubes, but also less obvious equipment such as defibrillators and radios. This equipment must be maintained in a constant state of readiness and accordingly must pass a yearly gear inspection where their function and suitability for purpose is assessed. In addition, this equipment is further assessed as part of random patrol inspections throughout the season. The amount of work required to pass gear inspection each season is enormous. Preparation for gear inspection requires many hours of repairing, replacing or upgrading equipment as dictated by LSV guidelines. The considerable amount of work undertaken by Blane Paton and Andrew Gibson in preparing our equipment for inspection needs to be acknowledged.

A large proportion of the club's activity revolves around competition and training. Accordingly, a wide range of lifesaving craft is maintained for nipper and senior competition. Each season our board stocks are assessed with older boards culled and new boards ordered. Considerable time is also spent during the season repairing damaged boards and Nick Clarke's tireless assistance with this is greatly appreciated.

Continual expansion and evolution of our senior competition team has also placed greater demand on cadet board stocks and consequently board storage. Improved board storage and continual replenishment of board stocks will continue to be the primary focus over the next few years. During the season we took delivery of a new beach trailer and had both the patrol trailer and old board trailer modified to better suit our needs. Once again thanks to Steve at Advanced Trailers in Hastings for undertaking this task.

Thanks to all the club members who have helped with various roles this season including board repair, gear transport and promoting responsible usage of club equipment.

Clubhouse Report

Clubhouse maintenance is ongoing and expensive. The Club has three regular tradesmen, usually conducts a Working Bee and has a few members who do far more than their fair share of the work. This year the Legends patrol also scheduled maintenance work to coincide with regular patrols.

- With the assistance of lobbying from our Club and the Foreshore, South East Water agreed to provide sewerage to Point Leo. Sewer pipe installation is almost complete. This will eliminate the many septic tanks on the foreshore, improve the health of the Banksia trees and is a far cheaper alternative to the Club being required to install a treatment plant. Many thanks to Tom Mollenkopf and Ranger Tony for their help in making this happen.
- The male showers and amenities were 'spruced up' significantly with new doors and showers, tile repairs, plumbing work, a new hot water service, repairs to rot and rust and a professional repaint. The female amenities had similar treatment last year. These are all stopgap measures to bring them to a reasonable standard. Complete replacement of all amenities is planned over the next couple of years to coincide with connection to sewerage.
- The roof of the gear shed is our oldest roof and is showing the ravages of rust due to the salty environment. Our plumber, John, did extensive repairs over winter with the aim of postponing roof replacement for a year or two. Eventually this major job will have to be done.
- Thanks to Nick Watson (Legends Patrol) who repaired all the damage to our plasterboard walls.
- Our gas cooking range has been problematic since we installed it several years ago, with problems including being hard to light and hard to keep alight. This was replaced with a domestic-style range with gas cook-top and electric oven.
- A bunch of old guys (editor's note: not all admit to this description) got together with the Ranger's tractor and removed the big sand drift that was threatening our courtyard wall. The sand was carted to the beach and the drift brought down to level with the track.
- The two ancient bar fridges and the large kitchenette fridge were all replaced. Thanks to Haydn Tierney for getting us a good deal on these through his contacts.
- The Tierney family generously donated 11 new tables and 32 new chairs, in Leo orange, for the bar.
- The attrition rate on the folding tables continues from heavy members perching on them and bending the legs. Four destroyed this season.
- There was a noticeable upsurge in graffiti, wilful damage to equipment and thefts.
- The Club successfully applied for a grant from the State Government to install solar panels. This should occur over winter. Thanks to Michael Treadwell who did all the work on this.

Flinders Hotel Point Leo Swim Classic

Once again the Point Leo Boxing Day Classic was a triumph of club spirit over adverse weather. Is it just me or do we just never cop good weather on Boxing Day?

*Both races featured some elite top end talent. In both distances experienced open water swimmer **Sam Sheppard** edged out **Mack Horton** for first with **Matt Gilling** coming in third. In the 1.2km Sheppard won by only 1 second, making for a dramatic finish. Both Sheppard and Horton will be competing for spots on the Australian Olympic Team in a few months.*

***Lisandro De Carvalho** (33:35) was the first overall female in the 2.5km beating **Kendra Jewell** (34:25) and **Madeleine Wood** (34:30). In the 1.2km race it was the young **Annabelle McPhail** taking the victory with a time of 13:52. De Carvalho was 2nd with a 14:42 and **Molly Batchelor** rounded out the top 3 with a 15:04.*

This year's edition of the Point Leo Swim Classic was a great success with 400 athletes competing in the 2 distances making for a fun and exciting Boxing Day.

Fast forward a few months and it was great to see Mack Horton qualifying so solidly for the Rio Olympics after using the Leo swim as a warm up event!

We had a record number of pre-registrations with interstate participants from NSW, Queensland, ACT, NT and WA and internationals from as far afield as Scotland and Chicago! The new format 2.5km swim proved popular with 126 participants and there were 273 who managed to negotiate the shore break, increasing wind and an escaping marker buoy in the 1.2km Classic. The 4km beach run saw 30 competitors beaten home by home town hero James Paton who ran a cracking time.

Caleb is a former Junior Club Captain and is the current Swim Captain and since being presented with this award he was selected to represent LSV in the Interstate Carnival held at Torquay. Caleb has fulfilled his patrol commitments on the beach at Point Leo and intends to improve on his qualifications in the areas of ART, Spinal Management and Beach Management.

Administration and Activities

At the commencement of season 2015/2016 the Advisory Board of the Gary Tierney Foundation agreed to adopt a conservative approach to fundraising and maintain the \$200,000 capital target that was originally set six years ago. This is an amount that the Advisory Board believes is reasonable at this stage to provide an income stream that allows it to implement a sound development program for young lifesavers at Point Leo. The Fund bank balance stands at \$209,742. This compares with a balance at the start of the financial year of \$199,031. Forecast expenditure this coming financial year will include Fellowship Grants totalling \$4,000 plus Special Purpose Grants and the costs of the Leadership Program (yet to be determined).

About the Gary Tierney Foundation

Since the establishment of the Gary Tierney Foundation in 2010 it has undertaken a Fellowship scheme to provide financial support to enable younger members of the club to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving. As indicated earlier the Foundation has presented Fellowships since 2011. In addition the Advisory Board is able to make Special Purpose Grants from Foundation funds in order to help young club members with particular financial needs. Two such grants were made last year however none this year.

The Foundation has established a Grants Policy and it has published Guidelines for nominations for Grants. These are available to all club members. The Advisory Board requests nominations publicly, via the Club Committee and for the 2016/2017 season it is expected that this will occur in October 2016 with the recipient(s) being announced at a Presentation Night on Friday 13th January 2017.

Governance

The Gary Tierney Foundation is controlled by an Advisory Board that in turn reports to the Point Leo SLSC Club Committee. The Foundation's Patron is Louise Tierney and for the past twelve months the Advisory Board Members were: Tom Mollenkopf (Chairperson), John Horwood, Simone Munro, Ian Knight, Richard Batchelor, Lachlan Pearse, Andrew Mansour and Haydn Tierney. The Advisory Board met formally on three occasions during the financial year to 30th April 2016 and met additionally at informal meetings.

As a sub-fund of the Point Leo SLSC the Foundation's finances are audited as part of the Club's Statutory Audit. A separate bank account is maintained to ensure that all amounts donated to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with and specified by the Foundation's Governance Charter.

Point Leo SLSC Bobbas

Through the internet we keep the Bobbas abreast of what is going on at the club and it was pleasing to note that Gary Richardson, winner of two Gold medals in the Junior Belt back in the sixties was very keen to express his pleasure in Leo's success in the belt events at this season's State Titles. The interest in the club continues to be maintained by the Bobbas.

During 2015 the Bobbas met on three occasions for lunch at the Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club and held a Bobbas and partners luncheon at the clubhouse at Point Leo at the conclusion of 2015/2016 patrol season. During the past season the Bobbas assisted Club Life Patron Dick Ellis with the Nipper BBQ and helped with parking and catering at the carnivals held at Leo on the weekend of 30th and 31st January 2016.

One of the highlights of the luncheons and the ongoing email communication is the vivid recollection of past events at Point Leo. Past memories get more vivid as time goes by – body surfing Point Leo, the paddle from Leo to Phillip Island, the waves cracked in boats at various carnivals and the medals and pennants almost won at carnivals on beaches throughout Australia. Every Bobba has something to add and we must ensure that this continues.

All Bobbas are proud of the achievements of the Club on the beach at Point Leo, at carnivals and in the pool and in the local community and offer congratulations and ongoing support to the committee and all members.
