

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2017

Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

General information

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an Association incorporated under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2017 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management on 2 July 2017.

Financial reporting framework

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The Committee of Management has determined that Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. (the Association) is not a reporting entity.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*, the recognition and measurement requirements specified by Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures'.

New and amended standards adopted by the association

The association has adopted all the amendments to Australian Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board, which are relevant to and effective for the association's financial statements for the annual period beginning 1 May 2016.

None of these amendments have had a significant impact on the association.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Property, Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(d) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period and are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(f) Revenue and other income

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(h) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(i) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(j) Impairment of assets

At each reporting date, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(k) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;

- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

(l) Comparative information

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

(m) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

(n) Events after the reporting date

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. Statement by the Committee of Management

The Committee of Management has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity and that this special purpose financial report should be prepared in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Note 1 to the Financial Statements.

In the opinion of the Committee, the financial report, comprising the Statement of Profit or loss and other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash Flows and Notes to the Financial Statements:

1. Present a true and fair view of the financial position of Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2017 and its performance for the year ended on that; and
2. At the date of the statement, there are reasonable grounds to believe that Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS REPORT

To the Committee Members of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the year ended 30 April 2017

Opinion

We have audited the special purpose financial statements of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the entity), which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30 April 2017, the Statement of Profit or Loss and other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Members' Funds and Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the entity as at 30 April 2017, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (AASB's) to the extent described in Note 1 and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

Basis for opinion

Without modifying our audit opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 in the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. to meet the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* under the requirements of special purpose financial reporting. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report.

We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the independence requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other information

The Members of the Committee are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Annual Report for the year ended 30 April 2017, other than the financial report and our Auditors Report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

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In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and 'in doing so' consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Going concern

The Members of the Committee's use of the going concern basis of accounting appears to be appropriate and based on the audit evidence obtained, there is no material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the entity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Responsibilities of the Members of the Committee and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

The Members of the Committee are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, and for such internal control as the Members of the Committee determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the Members of the Committee are responsible for assessing the Entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Members of the Committee either intends to liquidate the Entity or cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Entity's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud and error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Members of the Committee's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the entity's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the entity to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence and, where applicable, related safeguards.

From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the financial statements of the current period and are therefore the key audit matters. We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

Point Leo SLSC has had wonderful success with training and assessment at the club during the 2016/2017 season. It has been very busy and many members have achieved awards and updated their skills throughout the season.

This season we held a Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) Camp, Adult Bronze Medallion Course, Bronze Medallion Camp, Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) Driver and IRB Crew course, Spinal Management course, First Aid course and an Advanced Resuscitation Techniques course (ART).

A big thank you to those members who completed the Training Officer and Assessor courses this season.

The club ran two Skills Maintenance days this season. On 17 December members were able to requal their Bronze, SRC, Spinal and ART awards. On Saturday 26 November members holding IRB awards were able to requal their IRB Crew and Driver awards. This was a big success with more than 160 participants attending these days. Thank you to the Assessors who helped on the day.

The 2016 SRC camp was a huge success. The camp was run on 10 and 11 December with 41 participants. All participants passed their SRC award and the camp ran smoothly for the weekend. This season, Point Leo members responded to and provided care for a total of 42 First Aid cases. 39 cases were minor first aid, and three were major first aid. This is down from 50 cases in the 2015/2016 season.

As in previous seasons, the majority of First Aid was actually provided outside of regular patrols, with just 16 of the 42 First Aids attended on patrol. The ambulance was called for two of the three major first aids.

Not only will your skills make Point Leo a safer place, but you will develop important skills that you can transfer to all parts of your life.

Team Manager's Report

It was a year well-travelled for the Senior Competition team, from sunrise to sunset, Seaspray to Apollo Bay and then some. We really enjoyed the journey trying and testing these beaches which were not in our usual path. A real highlight was the weekend spent at Seaspray SLSC. It may be a

beautiful, tiny place at the end of the rainbow, but it was girt by great roaring surf. An informal Friday night race off was not for the fainthearted. Thankfully it settled to a friendlier offering on competition day. We hope to head back that way again soon. Throughout the year we worked with change as the LSV Aquatic Sports Council introduced more craft-based carnivals and Saturday competitions to offer a place for growth in opportunities for our competition. Swim, Board and Ski races are now graded over 2-3 races across divisions enabling more racing opportunities. This is fantastic for single discipline athletes and a real test of endurance for the multi-disciplined, especially our guys who are keen to have a go at everything.

We need to congratulate Caleb Gray and Isabella Austin for selection on the Victorian State Representative teams. Both athletes competed with Point Leo passion when donning the blue and white cap at Alexandra Headlands.

Samantha Howe competed on the Australian Youth Life Saving Team at the World Championships 2016 in Eindhoven in the Netherlands and won 3 Gold and 1 Bronze Medal in her individual races. An outstanding effort! She also set two World and three Australian records at the SLSA Australian Pool Life Saving Championships in August 2016. Her undeniable success in the pool has this year seen her selected for the Australian Open Life Saving Team to compete in the pool at the World Games in Wroclaw, Poland from 22-23 July.

Back home Samantha and Zach Richter both represented Point Leo SLSC at the Victorian Pool Lifesaving Championships bagging us 5 Gold and 2 Silver medals in the process.

The 2017 State Championships were held at the lovely Port Fairy SLSC. Again, at these faraway places it seems like time has stood still and there is a great vibe and excitement of an unfamiliar beach. We had so many emotional heart-stoppers over the two days. Isabella Austin U15 winning Bronze in the Iron and Surf race and then a brilliant Gold in the Board race. The multi-talented Greta Ross excelling in Beach Flags and Ski – Gold and Silver. She also gained Bronze in the Open Ski Relay with Evie Wilkins and Bella Ford. There were more medals in Rescue Tube Rescue again thanks to the help of another returning champ Marco Kelsall and the always there when we need him Jack Cester. Masters Report

State Championships – Lorne

The State Masters competition is held annually at Lorne and this year a team of 13 men and 6 women lined up for Point Leo. The conditions were excellent; plenty of sunshine and a small swell made ideal conditions for the Leo team.



Marc Aliotti started the 'gold-rush' taking out the 2km Beach Run, quickly followed by Jon Ford in his Ironman race, the first event of the water program. Jon led comfortably for an easy win to take out the Ironman State Title for his age group. Leo's "elder statesman" Andrew Gibson was in top form and started his day with Gold in the Ironman – just the first of a lazy seven Golds that he bagged on the day. Hall of Famer Frank Christian also had a great 'day out' bringing home six Gold medals. Jane Starr (left) had a very successful day winning 4 Gold and 4 Silver medals. The last event of the Men's program, Beach Flags, was won by Marc Aliotti, who later admitted to having secret coaching from son Tom.

Point Leo ended the day with an amazing total of 41 Gold, 25 Silver and 6 Bronze medals across Men's and Women's competition. The Point Leo Men's team won a total of 56 medals (compared to 39 in 2016) - 35 Gold, 16 Silver, 5 Bronze. The Point Leo women's team had a medal tally of 16 (compared to 8 in 2016) - 6 Gold, 9 Silver, 1 Bronze.

The competition was a lot of fun, sometimes intense, sometimes laid back, sometimes hilarious. The sportsmanship is excellent, friendships are renewed and there are a lot of laughs as the oldies strut their stuff.

The final 'Event' of Masters is our self-catered team meeting and debrief. A magnificent effort to come 6th as the oldest team in the race was well received by all and, as often is the case, just a few points off the medals. Well done lads!

Next up was the Taplin relay – an event Leo rarely makes an appearance in let alone does well in at national masters level. After making the final last year could they do it again? A hard heat saw Jon (Ski) , Frank Christian (board) and Ian (swim) make the final and after a wonderful last up effort the boys pulled in 12th in the country...an excellent effort against some super strong teams.

Head Coach Report

The competition section has developed a new model for collecting and analyzing data for 2017. Unfortunately the spreadsheet was not fully operational in time for completion of this report. The club's States results were affected by the location (Port Fairy being a very long drive from Point Leo) and date (clashing with a major swimming event). Aussies water events were cancelled due to conditions from the cyclone apart from the first day where a number of team events were held.

Nevertheless some outstanding results were noted - none more so than Point Leo winning, for the first time in its history, the Male Open Taplin Relay. This achievement exceeded our goal for 2017 of medaling in the event. Congratulations to Caleb Gray, Lachlan Robinson, Adam Howgate, Matthew Graves, Joshua Doherty and Rhys Cole. The Open male and female athletes excelled in many events, earning medals in a range of other team and individual events. Caleb Gray comfortably won the Open Male Ironman but was unfortunately disqualified (a lesson that he and the club have learnt from). These results demonstrated a greater level of athlete resilience under pressure on the back of a number of years focusing on developing this attribute.

Samantha Howe is to be congratulated for again making the Australian Life Saving Team heading to 'The World Games' in Wroclaw, Poland from 22-23 July 2017.

The club is working hard over winter to develop strategies to increase competition success in Nippers that translates to greater numbers coming through to Senior competition. This will be critical in ensuring the strength and depth of the competition team for years to come.

A full description of the factors that led to this success is provided below.

Surf Sports Training program

A comprehensive training program was provided for Point Leo athletes including:

- Senior ski sessions (3 per week – Jon Ford)
- Development ski sessions (1 per week – Paul Doherty)
- Senior board sessions (2 per week – David Austin)
- Senior iron sessions (1 per week – Caleb Gray)
- Development board sessions (2 per week – Travis Cargill)
- U11-13 board sessions (2 per week – Nick Clarke)
- Senior run sessions (1 per week – Nick Ford)
- Martha Cove kayak/ski sessions (2 per week – Jon Ford and Bella Ford)
- Main Ridge gym sessions (2 per week – Nick Ford)
- Beach sessions (1 per week – Matt Blair)

Strategies from the Head Coach to maximise effectiveness and engagement with this training program included:

- A complete periodisation schedule for the season with a greater focus on fitness and commencement of speed training later in the season
- Greater engagement of the squad with gym resulting in improved strength, power and speed (as measured by gym performance and maximum speed during training)
- Over 30 “sample” training sessions for board and ski for each period of the training season for use by all coaches
- Manage the Coaching team to ensure the highest quality training program is provided
- Communicate with all athletes on a regular basis regarding training sessions and any modification by Team App
- U17/19 athletes regularly competing in Open during the carnival season to develop high level skills and experience
- Skills sessions for board rescue, rescue tube rescue, belt and relays
- U19/Open athletes competing regularly at the Summer of Surf interstate carnivals
- Successful running of the Surf Sports Camp at Lorne in September 2016 with Jett Kenny and Jamo Porter (right) coaching Nippers and Seniors
- Successful running of the Ali Day training weekend at Point Leo in January 2017 for Nippers
- Engagement of Trevor Hendy to provide advice regarding elite athlete mentoring
- Closer monitoring and specific treatment of injuries (using Justin Moar from Lifecare Frankston) resulting in fewer significant injuries than 2015/2016



Plan for 2018

- Further refinement and improvement of the Surf Sports training program including:
 - Commencement of a tailored gym program catering for skeletally immature (as per 2017) and also elite U19/Open competitors developed by Peter Gargiulo (ex Australian Kayak Team Development Coach)
 - Cameron McGill supporting Paul Doherty commencing development ski at Martha Cove from August 2017 (12 year olds and up)
 - Strengthening the collaboration with Patterson Lakes Canoe Club and Cameron McGill’s kayak squad
 - High level ski technique sessions for experienced paddlers using Peter Gargiulo (already commenced fortnightly)
- Equipment purchases (new BOS double ski and Kracka board rescue board) to allow elite U19/Open competitors to target high level Aussies results
- Employing a range of further strategies to enhance fitness, skills and speed including
 - Downwind and “sawmill” sessions
 - More regular training at Big Left and Gunnamatta

- Surf Sports Program training camp on the Gold Coast for Nippers and Seniors in September 2017 with Trevor Hendy, Ali Day, Harriet Brown, Jett Kenny and Jamo Porter
- Continuation of the above successful strategies

Competition culture

The competition team has demonstrated a positive, supportive and collaborative culture during training and competition. This is reflective of strong leadership, reinforcement of the Point Leo Code of Conduct, social/camp based activities to build relationships, coaches providing meaningful and positive communication at least once with each athlete at each training session, the club's athlete mentoring program, encouraging members to participate in the Surf Sports Program for fitness even if they don't want to compete and transparent implementation of the Senior Selection Policy.

This positive competition culture has been noted and commented on by many people external to Point Leo.

Athlete recruitment

Further efforts were made to recruit athletes including:

- Running a camp for Boronia Swim Club athletes; 9 of whom went on to obtain their Bronze Medallion and patrol/compete for the club
- Supporting the competitive transfer of 3 high level athletes from Mount Martha SLSC to Point Leo

- Extension of the Patterson Lakes Canoe Club collaboration including participation in the 5000m time trial and some marathon events
- Sam Richardson to pursue collaborations with swim clubs
- Conduct a Cadet Camp in July 2017 to facilitate transition from Nippers to Seniors
- Cadet ring around
- Masters ring around

Coaching development

A formal coaching development program continued through 2016/2017 including:

- Identification of potential coaches
- Support to complete the Level 1 Coaching Course
- Regular discussion with coaches and the Head Coach regarding conducting training sessions
- Provision of written training session plans for all coaches
- Ring around of nippers parents to identify skilled and enthusiastic Activity Leaders

The Junior coaching program (using our senior athletes as coaches) continued with Bella Ford, Caleb Gray, Nick Ford and Rhys Cole providing coaching for many of the Board and Ski sessions.

Matt Blair continued his outstanding work as Beach coach and provided a program that enjoyed high level participation over the summer period.

This year we were also fortunate to be visited by Chloe McCardel, the 21 times swimmer of the English Channel and holder the of the world record for the longest ocean swim (124.4km), and Ali Day, an amazing Ironman and legend of the Coolangatta Gold. Their stories were a real inspiration to our Nippers.

For our most enthusiastic Nippers training started in September 2016 and continued through to March 2017. The Lorne Board Camp was a great success, providing Nippers with an early opportunity to learn new skills, make or renew friendships and build training loads. My thanks to Jon Ford and all the other volunteers, coaches and helpers who made the event successful. My particular thanks to Nick Clarke for his enthusiasm and energy running competition training for Nippers under our Junior Surf Sports Program banner.

Gear Steward

As a club of more than 1,000 members, Point Leo SLSC is obliged to maintain a vast inventory of equipment in order to meet the club's patrol, training and competition needs. Maintenance of this equipment and purchasing of new equipment follows a familiar rhythm each year. Patrol, Rescue and First Aid equipment is assessed over the winter months in advance of the LSV Gear Inspection in October. Damaged equipment is repaired, obsolete equipment is discarded and replacement

equipment sourced. Considerable effort is required to satisfy SLSA prescribed equipment guidelines in order for us to successfully pass Gear Inspection and be well prepared for a season of patrols.

Board camps are usually held during the September holidays where Cadet boards and Nipper boards are required. Up to 30 Cadet boards are needed for this camp and preparation for camps requires many hours of repairing previously damaged boards during the winter months. Each year, new boards are purchased to increase our stock of boards but a considerable amount of time is spent on reviving older boards to provide for an expanding training program. Repair and maintenance of these boards further intensifies once Nippers and Seniors summer training commences. Nick Clarke undertakes the majority of board repairs and repairs up to 50 boards in a season. The magnitude of this task cannot be understated and Nick's generosity is greatly appreciated.

There were several significant new equipment purchases over the season. A new Kawasaki Mule ATV was purchased to replace our aged and beach-worn Mule. This new Mule is more refined than its predecessor and is equipped with anodic corrosion protection to better withstand the challenges of salt and sand. The old Mule is to be stripped down and galvanised over winter in preparation for a supporting role next season.

This season a Public Access Defibrillator was installed at the clubhouse near the entry door. This was made possible through a successful grant application and is a welcome addition to our First Aid capabilities.

As a volunteer organisation we rely extensively on the generosity of members to provide their time and resources. The Legends patrol was very active over summer and conducted several mini-working bees where equipment and club house maintenance was undertaken. Thank you to this dedicated band of volunteers for the multitude of tasks completed.

Increasingly we require off-site storage for some of our larger equipment during the winter months. A big thank you to Ashton and Amanda Woolley for allowing us to use their shed to store the Nipper trailer and old Mule. We are still in need of some off-site storage space and would like to hear from any members who may be able to assist.

Solar panels

Gary Tierney Foundation

The Past Twelve Months

The Gary Tierney Foundation has continued to provide financial support and guidance to enable younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving.

Through the 2016/2017 season, grants or other funding assistance totalling \$7,500 was given to club members, comprising a payment of \$1,500 to Sam Howe to assist with travel costs involved in competing in the national team at the World Titles, annual Fellowship grant payments of \$5,000 and a \$1000 contribution towards the costs of those club members competing as teams in the 2016 Coolangatta Gold.

Over the period, the Foundation held a number of fundraising events: the annual Point Leo Family Walk, a Gala Dinner at the clubhouse, and a raffle and wine auction in conjunction with the Fellowship Award Presentation in January. These activities were complemented by generous donations from a number of people associated with the Club.

Having reached its target of a capital base of \$200,000, the Foundation's Advisory Board has maintained a relatively modest approach to fundraising, seeking to ensure that the corpus remains intact, while being able to gradually grow its grant program and other support.

Financials

At 30th April 2017, the Foundation bank balance stands at \$220,451. At the same time in 2016 it was \$209,742 – an increase of \$10,709 over the period. Income to the foundation related to \$10,875 from donations, \$2114 from fundraising activities and \$5,220 being interest from the bank account and term deposits. As outlined above outgoings of \$7500 were payments to club members in line with the Gary Tierney Foundation's Governance Charter.

Our 2017 Fellows are Brittany Morgenthaler and Andrew Nott, two young members who started with the club as Nippers and who have both taken on leadership roles in Club lifesaving activities. The Fellowship award presentation took place on 13th January.

Brittany holds the position of Chief Instructor, a demanding role that has seen her organise and lead the SRC and Bronze Medallion Courses in the 2016/2017 season, with all participants qualifying. Britt has also organised and been involved in a number of other member's lifesaving award courses and is also a Patrol Vice-Captain. Andy is a Club Vice-President and Committee member, a Patrol Captain and has involved himself in IRB activities within the club – water safety, training for competition and assisting with Driver and Crew award courses.

Brittany and Andrew have each demonstrated their commitment to lifesaving and have genuine potential to make a valuable contribution to the Club and to lifesaving.

At the Point Leo SLSC's 2016 Annual General Meeting, Tamara Brawn and Geoff Ewert were nominated to become Honorary Life Members of Point Leo SLSC. The club's Statement of Rules and Purposes sets out the process by which members are nominated and considered for Life Membership and the final process is that nominations are considered by all members present and eligible to vote at the AGM and such nomination must gain two-thirds of those votes.

Tamara and Geoff were duly elected Honorary Life Members of the club.

Tamara and Geoff have been outstanding members of the club and when their individual circumstances are outlined it is clear that they each took very different paths in their club involvement.

Tamara originally joined Lorne SLSC in 1992 and transferred her membership to Point Leo in 1995 because of the opportunity to row competitively in a surf boat at Leo whereas Lorne did not have a female boat crew at the time. Tamara became part of a very good crew at her new club. They were the top female crew in Victoria, very competitive at the Nationals making the final in 1998/99 and finishing fourth in the Seven Oceans (World Titles) in 1996/97.

After retiring from competition Tamara became involved in administration both with the club and at LSV and has maintained her involvement in both areas. Within the club Tamara was elected the first female Club President in 2013/14 and at LSV and SLSA Tamara is a highly regarded Senior Boat Referee at carnivals.

Geoff joined Point Leo SLSC in 1955 and was a member of the first club Bronze Camp and in fact has the honour of receiving the first Bronze Medallion awarded at Point Leo – medal number V184 dated 11 December 1955. From those early days Geoff became very involved in setting up the club at Point Leo, representing the club in competition and becoming involved in SLSV matters on behalf of the club. An immediate priority was the building of the clubhouse and Geoff, who had just commenced work as an apprentice carpenter, was very much involved right through until the building was handed over in 1962. Over the years, Geoff has maintained his involvement with the club helping at Leo home beach carnivals, with the Nippers at BBQs, and through the Bobbas.

Both Tamara and Geoff received their HLM medallions with dignity and pride and both talked about their early recollections of the club. Tamara remembered that despite being from another club she was immediately accepted as a Leo member by everyone and that since those early days she has had no desire to be anywhere else. Geoff recalled the first winter at Leo – you could not drive all the

way down Western Parade some weekends, and once there, it was hands on building work – setting out, frame construction and so on and on many weekends having a surf was out of the question.

All club members congratulate Tamara and Geoff on their election as Honorary Life Members of the Point Leo SLSC.
