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# President's Report

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Well this was not the season report I expected to write! The onset of COVID-19 saw our patrolling and senior competition seasons cut short and sent all of us into iso2020.

The pandemic that has impacted the globe has of course impacted our club and curtailed lifesaving and surf sports activities. Thank you to all our members who have done their part in seeing our community dealing so well with this crisis. For some, that has been on the front line, whilst for all of us it has meant practising physical distancing, not being able to utilise our clubhouse, participate in training or have any social events. I am sure we all miss that connection with each other. The committee continued to meet and function through the wonders of video conferencing that many of us are now adept at.

We put together a dedicated team to deal with the COVID-19 crisis. Under the leadership of Tamara Brawn, and with the guidance of LSV, we have put in place a contingency plan to deal with any instances of the virus around the Club and prepare for possible escalation of the pandemic. Thankfully, to date our community has done well in restricting the spread of the virus and there have been no known outbreaks that have required the Club to enact operational aspects of this plan. Thanks to John Gallagher who has stepped up to the plate and admirably filled the role of Secretary for the remainder of the season.

## Notes to the financial statements

### For the year ended 30 April 2020

#### Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

#### Basis of preparation

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*. The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2020 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management.

#### New and amended standards adopted by the Association

The Association has adopted all the amendments to Australian Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board, which are relevant to and effective for the Association's financial statements for the annual period beginning 1 May 2019.

The following standards and amendments have been applied for the first time in their annual reporting period commencing 1 May 2019:

#### AASB 16 Leases

The Association has applied this standard and has recorded a Right of Use asset and Lease Liability in relation to the concessionary lease of the land on which the Club house resides. The amount of the lease liability has been determined at cost over the next 40 years (the same basis for which the building is being depreciated).

The Association did not have any other non-cancellable operating lease commitments.

#### *Impact of adoption*

The new accounting standards were adopted using the modified retrospective approach and as such comparatives have not been restated. There was no impact on opening retained profits as at 1 May 2019.

## **Basis of preparation**

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the Association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

### **(a) Property, Plant and equipment**

Property (buildings), plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

### **(b) Inventories**

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

### **(c) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

### **(d) Income tax**

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

### **(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables**

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period and are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

### **(f) Right of Use Asset**

A right-of-use asset is recognised in relation to the concessionary lease of the land upon which the Association's Club House operates. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the remaining unexpired period of the lease or the useful life of the asset, whichever is shorter.

### **(g) Revenue and other income**

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors. Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### **(h) Goods and services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

#### **(i) Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### **(j) Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### **(k) Impairment of assets**

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

#### **(l) Current and non-current classification**

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or

- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

**(m) Comparative information**

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

**(n) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions**

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

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### **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS OF POINT LEO SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC.**

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the Association), which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30 April 2020, the Statement of Profit or Loss and other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Members Funds, Statement of Cash Flows and the notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and Statement by the Members of the Committee of Management.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at 30 April 2020, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (AASB's) to the extent described in Note 1, the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* and the financial reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012*.

#### *Emphasis of Matter*

Without qualification to the opinion expressed above, attention is drawn to the following matter:

1. As is common for Associations of this type, it is not practical for the Association to maintain an effective system of internal control over cash transactions, until their entry into the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to these activities was limited to the amount recorded.

#### **Basis of Accounting**

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Members of the Committee of Managements' financial reporting responsibilities under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

#### **Basis for opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report.

We are independent of the Association in accordance with the independence requirements of Australian professional accounting bodies, of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012*. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Management is responsible for the other information. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and in doing so consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

### **Going concern**

Management's use of the going concern basis of accounting appears to be appropriate and based on the audit evidence obtained, there is no material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern.

### **Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Association or cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Association's financial reporting process.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud and error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Every decision we made was on solid advice and was done with the safety of our members foremost in our minds. I want to thank all our members for being so understanding and so compliant in all instructions and directions. Enough of COVID-19, enough of doom, gloom and toilet roll madness.

The season at Point Leo was a cracker!

So many members stepped up in so many ways, and I was inspired to step up myself and push forward with initiatives and ideas.

Patrols were again the envy of many Victorian clubs. To our new and upcoming patrol leaders, hats off to you! Rain, hail or shine (often in that order) our patrollers were down on the beach, doing us proud. The same patroller base morphed into a wider water safety army, and I want to thank everyone who filled each of those roles – repeatedly – at the Club.

Applying new patrolling members to patrols based on camp groups has been a great success – perhaps even too successful – as on one occasion the full SRC army did in fact turn up and swamped the remainder of the beach. It's pretty darn rare to have 60+ patrolling members

all at once, however these are the kinds of patrols we are creating: patrols that are rock solid, patrols that are based on mateship and comradery, patrols that will last for years and provide many with leadership, interpersonal, lifesaving and practical skills that prepare them for scenarios beyond the beach.

Our devotion at Point Leo for patrol retention and mentorship comes at no cost to excellence – LSV regularly audits our beach patrols, and this season under the leadership of Ella Swaney and Rhys Cole our patrols were awarded 975/1000 and 970/1000 respectively. These scores were reflective of both excellent leadership and our commitment to teaching and training high calibre patrol members. Well done to everyone who stepped up or encouraged someone to go beyond their usual comfort zone this season – it is showing!



On the matter of teaching and training, our Chief Instructor Brittany Morgenthaler has again organised and executed a flawless season, including but not limited to, two training camps, multiple skills maintenance sessions, multiple award training and assessment courses. In addition, Britt has mentored and encouraged a fantastic bunch of young leaders, who are now well on their way to being qualified to train and assess as well.

The Bronze Camp format took on a different life this season. The consistency and quality of the training was instantly notable as this new wave of leaders taught, guided, nurtured and pushed our Bronzies and SRCs to the limit. They led a very enthusiastic group of our female patrollers and other champions of change for the afternoon.

Many thanks to our young club leaders who organised the day – co-ordinated by Bridget Barnes. It was an inspirational day full of much enthusiasm and pride showcasing the great female involvement in our club which spans across so many different roles. Thank you to everyone who came down to support them, those who participated in the day and those who continue to strengthen and mentor the capabilities of our female members.

Thanks to our Chief Instructor Britt Morgenthaler, we have 22 members who now have their Senior First Aid award. A further 8 members completed this award at courses run by LSV during the year. Congratulations!

Several of the new award holders were able to gain practical experience straight away at the major events hosted by Point Leo, and I hope to continue this when carnivals and major events resume next season. It is a great

opportunity to learn front line decision making whilst in a very supported environment.

The carnivals and Boxing Day Swim Classic hosted at Point Leo were very well staffed from a First Aid perspective. The medical team upon which we rely so much was coordinated yet again by Kate Stern. Thank you to all of those who assisted!

We were able to administer the methoxyflurane inhaler or 'green whistle' to a patient prior to the ambulance arriving. This improves the level of immediate care we can provide in trauma. Thank you to the Point Leo based Lifeguards (especially Andy Nott) who have gone out of their way to become credentialed in administering this drug.

This season Ambulance Victoria trialed a single responder unit based out of Flinders. This meant we had quicker response times for critical incidents. This is going to continue to be valuable to Point Leo, particularly for time critical emergencies like cardiac arrest or anaphylaxis.

Point Leo generously donated a defibrillator and other resuscitation / lifesaving equipment to a volunteer grassroots lifesaving organisation in Mozambique called *Nhatofa*

*Salva Vidas* (below). This will enable them to provide a higher level of First Aid care.



I look forward to continuing to help our members gain valuable First Aid experience at our major events. This experience can be applied not only on patrol when there is less support around, but also in the community or at a workplace.

The boat looks amazing and is certainly the boat drivers and crew fight over.

Gear inspection is a bit like "requal"; I would rather go to the dentist! But there were no issues this year and we got a clean bill of health. Our gear is top notch thanks to those who use and



look after it. We are in great shape for a few years to come thanks to my predecessors.

Minimum age is 12.

All competitors came in safely thanks to the crews who volunteered and stayed vigilant. It can be a long shift and the job is not done until all the anchors are pulled, buoys deflated, and boats cleaned and stowed long after everyone else has left the beach. ## Gear & Equipment

As a club of more than 1,400 members, Point Leo SLSC is obliged to maintain a vast inventory of equipment to meet patrol, training and competition needs. Maintenance of this equipment and purchasing of new equipment follows a familiar rhythm each year. Patrol, rescue and first aid equipment are assessed over the winter months in advance of LSV Gear Inspection in October. Damaged equipment is repaired, obsolete equipment is discarded, and replacement equipment sourced. Considerable effort is required to satisfy SLSA prescribed equipment guidelines for us to successfully pass Gear Inspection and be well prepared for a season of patrols.

Each year new boards are purchased to increase our stock of Nipper and Senior boards. In addition, a considerable amount of time is spent on reviving older boards to provide for an expanding training program. Repair and maintenance of these boards is time consuming and Nick Clarke undertakes most of the work. This is an enormous task and Nick's generosity is greatly appreciated.

To maximise the storage space in the gear shed some improvements were made. New storage racks for the R&R reels were installed along with racking for Surf Boat oars. The wobbly old IRB rack was removed and replaced with a new

bespoke rack. A big thanks to Nick Clarke and Andrew Gibson for their engineering skills in designing and fabricating these racks.

As a volunteer organisation we rely extensively on the generosity of members to provide their time and resources. The Legends patrol was highly active over summer and conducted several mini-working bees where equipment and club house maintenance were undertaken. Thank you to this dedicated band of volunteers for the multitude of tasks completed.

Increasingly we require off-site storage for some of our larger equipment during the winter months. A big thank you to Travis Cargill for allowing us use of his shed to store the Nipper trailer. We are always in need of additional off-site storage space and would like to hear from any members who may be able to assist.

# Education

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Congratulations to all our members on a wonderful season!

A total of 133 new lifesaving awards have been achieved by members in courses held at Point Leo this season. As well as new awards being achieved, members have upskilled their existing awards on the Skills Maintenance days which were held in late November and late December 2019. The upskilled awards allow our beach to be safe for the public and to meet LSV's requirements for each patrol over the summer period. A fantastic effort by all, as the majority of our patrols fulfilled all awards required for a full patrol.

Throughout the season the Club held:

- two Bronze Medallion courses
- two Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) courses
- one First Aid course
- one Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) Crew and Driver course.

In some of the courses we trialled the blended option, which allows members to learn with a hybrid of online and face to face sessions.

We continue to offer training opportunities for members to help run Nipper sessions, compete, actively patrol and further their education.

This season we held two successful Skills Maintenance days. Members completed proficiency assessments for a total of 317 awards at these sessions. It was fantastic to see all members come down to upskill their awards. Thank you to all those who helped make the Skills Maintenance days successful.

Bronze Camp was held from 15 - 21 December 2019. The course ran well with 37 successful participants achieving their Bronze Medallion. Participants had a range of people taking time out of their busy schedules to talk to the Bronze candidates. These included Rhys Cole, who is a crew member in the Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter Service, Dave Neal from Ambulance Victoria, and some

Point Leo club legends. All participants thoroughly enjoyed the visits and were very thankful for the guests coming down to Bronze Camp. It was terrific!



Throughout the course we had several trainee trainers working towards becoming Bronze Medallion educators. Well done to all participants and the trainee trainers for a wonderful camp.

I would like to give a big thanks to John Horwood, Alf Treadwell, Anne Treadwell, Tom Mollenkopf and Max Jeffery who cooked a wonderful roast and spoke to the Bronze Camp participants. It was a highlight of the camp.



Thank you to all those who helped run the course. It is terrific for the Bronze participants to meet the leaders of the Club.

The 15th Adult Bronze Medallion course ran in November and December, with 17 people

undertaking the blended format for the first time. All participants had some connection to Nippers and wanted to do Nipper water safety as well as patrol. Andrew Gibson held some sessions at Frankston pool and the remainder were held at the Clubhouse.

Thirteen of the starters completed the course and gained their Bronze Medallion after assessment. A big thank you to Andrew Gibson for running the course and those who helped throughout.

This season the Club ran two SRC courses. The SRC Camp ran over two weekends in early December. All participants were fantastic and very enthusiastic. It was a delight to see all SRC participants on patrol and eager to continue to learn. - 3-4 times per week swim training sessions at Fitzroy Swimming Pool and Pelican Park in Hastings
- Longer ad hoc paddling sessions and gym programming done by smaller groups

Over Spring we ramped the training up to:

- 4/week swim sessions
- 2/week ski, 1/week board and 1/week iron/transition training at Point Leo
- Saturday Gunnamatta sessions
- 2/week kayak/ski training at PLCC and Martha Cove

Many of the squad excelled in this program, including younger and older more experienced members, particularly Josh Doherty and Harry Atkins. It was great to see experienced

Nippers join the sessions throughout the year, as well as some Masters athletes.

Thanks to Jamo Porter (Alexandra Headlands), Zayne Hamill (Surfers Paradise) and Peter Gargulio for their support of the program. Also, to the coaching and selection panel (Nick Clarke, Iris Cassell, David Austin, Lachie Robinson and Bella Ford) for their input.

In late September, the bi-annual "Goldie" sports camp was held on the magnificent Gold Coast. We had over 20 Nippers attend this camp which consisted of 5 solid days of training in the sun and surf of Queensland.

The days started with early morning swim sets at Miami pool, time for a quick breakfast and then hitting the boards for am and pm sessions at iconic Gold Coast locations (Snapper Rocks, Currumbin Alley, Burleigh Heads and Palm Beach), with guest coaching from surf lifesaving legends including Trevor Hendy, T J Hendy and Kirsty Higginson. The experience the kids gained, and skills learned through this intensive program was second to none and established a firm base for ongoing training and the start of competition.

There were some promising results in the early carnivals of the season particularly Josh Doherty almost making an interstate Ironman final. However, as we all know our carnival program was cut short by large surf at Lorne followed by COVID-19. Coaches and athletes are looking forward to 2020-2021 by building strength using simple body weight resistance programs. Using a simple chin up bar ( $\pm$  power band for those who struggle with chin ups) and other body weight exercises, our strength program should dramatically improve the surf sports capabilities when we come out of restrictions. Water sessions in a safe setting over longer distances are also planned for athletes of all levels once the COVID-19 restrictions ease.

### Junior Surf Life Saving Program

What an amazing season we have enjoyed! This year a record 511 Nippers participated, and it was incredible to see the beach filled with so many Nippers having fun each morning.

For several years now we have been faced with increasing enquiries and requests for participation, having to close off registrations early and leaving many people disappointed. This season we took a bold step and reorganised the program on several levels to accommodate an increase in participation whilst maintaining the quality of our great program and introducing new ways to enhance the Nipper



experience. The changes were enthusiastically embraced by participants, parents and volunteers alike and the feedback was extremely positive.

A new era for the Point Leo Nippers had begun.

The significant changes included:

The under 7s were allocated their own area on the beach and we totally redesigned their program to make it even more fun. Thanks to Tarena Murray for redesigning this program for the under 7s. Her experience as a recent under 7 Age Manager was the perfect insight required!

The under 14 program was given a complete overall and we introduced a broader range of lifesaving activities including: beach care, champion lifesaver come 'n' try events, social evening, Nipper graduation and first group patrol. We also gave our senior athletes a structured opportunity to connect with the under 14s by taking on the roles of Activity Leaders. They started their sessions slightly later to ensure our water safety for the younger age groups was not compromised and they enjoyed their own dedicated area on the beach.

A new LSV sports carnival app was introduced to help with the administration and submission of competitors, along with specific requirements for each club to supply qualified Officials at each

On the competition front, our Nippers had the opportunity to attend six LSV carnivals (including the Junior State Championships) supported by competition training every Sunday from mid-January to the State Championships in March. For 15-year olds the season commenced with the Bronze Camp. This camp is organised by the Chief Instructor, Brittany Morgenthaler, with the help of her growing band of training officers.

2019-2020 saw the U14/U15 competitors continue to be included in the Youth section of Senior carnivals. Support for this transition comes from the Team Manager, Iris Cassell and Head Coach, Jon Ford. The group was also supported on the beach by senior competitor Lachie Robinson who was out of action due to injury.

The U15 and U17 Cadets returned in significant numbers again to undertake water safety for the Lions age groups at Nippers. They also took up Junior Activity Leader roles and assisted with the new U14 program which was developed and led by Sarah-Jo Mason.

This year saw the establishment of a Youth Leadership Group prior to the commencement of the season. A group of young members, Cadets themselves in recent years, came together to generate ideas for supporting Cadet engagement.

Specifically, the Youth Leadership Group aims were to:

- provide authentic leadership opportunities for the next generation of

club leaders and support them in their leadership journey

- develop meaningful relationships with the Cadet group to facilitate a stronger sense of connectedness to the Club and assist with development of a positive youth culture
- build social connections through identifying, providing and promoting social activities for the Cadet age group
- promote the variety of surf lifesaving pathways as an engagement strategy to the Cadet age group

The club was successful in obtaining a grant under the State Government Change Our Game program that supports female and gender inclusive initiatives in sport. The YLG organised the Club's inaugural Pink Patrol, with a celebration led by Point Leo's only female Club Captain, Life Member and Hall of Famer Simone Munro, Australian Kayak team member and club member Hannah Scott and elite netballer Sarah Collett. The Pink Patrol was ably led by Patrol Captain Ella Swaney and Patrol Vice-Captain Bodhi Woods. Unfortunately, a planned Bronzie Reunion night was postponed due to the impact of COVID-19 and is now planned as a 'kick-off' for the 2020-2021 season.

A big congratulations to members of the Young Leaders Group for their involvement as our next wave of club leaders and Cadet mentors and for bringing their enthusiasm and ideas – Bridget Barnes, Bodhi Woods, Ella Laussen, Caitlin Robinson, Zali Cargill, Georgia Cassell-Ashton, Charli Cassell-Ashton and Ellie Doherty.

Andrew Welsh and his band of merry helpers organised another Point Leo Trivia Night on behalf of the Cadet section. The Trivia Night is one of the social calendar highlights of the summer season.

Looking forward to another year of fun, friendship and lifesaving in the 2020-2021 season.

## Honorary Life Members

Election as Honorary Life Member is one of the highest awards any club can bestow on a member. Each of the four new Life Members of Point Leo SLSC is very worthy of this honour with years of service and consistent behaviour that reflects the values that we all hold so dear.

Peter Braithwaite joined the Club in 1963 and became an avid patroller. From 1965 he held Instructor and then Chief Instructor roles, before joining the Committee in 1970 as a general member and then Vice President until he moved to WA for work in 1977. Peter was a founding member and inaugural President of The Bobbas and has continued to play an active role in this important fundraising and club support group for over 50 years. ## Gary Tierney Foundation

### The Past Twelve Months

It is now ten years since the Gary Tierney Foundation was established and it is worth

reflecting on why we are here, and what we have achieved.

The late Gary Tierney joined the Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club in 1964 as a Junior member

and retained a passion for the Club until his untimely death in November 2009. A champion surf swimmer, Gary served for many years on the Point Leo committee, holding various positions including Club President. Behind the scenes, Gary also generously provided significant financial support to the Club and individual members, as well as fulfilling an important mentoring role. To perpetuate Gary's memory the Club established the Gary Tierney Foundation Fund in 2010.

In the past decade, the Foundation has awarded 14 Fellowships and granted more than \$50,000 to deserving young members of the Club. In addition to the annual Fellowships, there have been Special Purpose grants made to individual members and a major contribution to the Club's LifeChanger Program. In ten years, nearly \$230,000 in funds have been raised, complemented by investment earnings of some \$55,000. The Fund's corpus stands at over \$230,000, which will continue to provide the income to allow us to support members for many years to come. Those who knew Gary miss him greatly, but we are pleased to continue his legacy, albeit in small measure compared to the man himself.

With many lifesaving activities cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the need for financial support, especially for competitors, declined this year. The Club's LifeChanger program did not proceed in the past 12 months and a Foundation contribution toward the cost was not requested, and as the National Titles at Broadbeach, Queensland were cancelled, travel cost assistance was not needed. In the previous 12 months \$5,800 was provided for these areas by the Foundation. We were however very pleased to make a Fellowship award to an outstanding young member during the year.

### **Financials**

As of 30 April 2020, the Foundation funds balance stands at \$235,276 an increase of \$4815 over the balance as of 30 April 2019. Over the 12 months period income to the Foundation was made up of \$12,586 from donations and interest from the bank account balance and bank term deposits. Outgoings for Fellowship Grants totalled \$4,800.

The Foundation holds a long-term investment of \$70,000 in the Surf Life Saving Rescue Fund which was valued at \$74,392 on 30 April 2020, a downturn of \$2,972 since 30 April 2019. The decline in value of this investment is consistent with balanced investment funds across the globe due to the slowdown in the global financial markets and the resultant lower stock exchange valuations as a result of concerns around the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Advisory Board will be watching this investment closely. The balance of funds invested of \$160,884 is with The Balnarring and District Community Bank Branch of the Bendigo Bank in cash and term deposits at competitive rates of interest.

### **Gary Tierney Foundation 2020 Fellow – Rhys Cole**

The 2020 Fellowship was awarded to Rhys Cole. Rhys, who is a top-class competitor, transferred to the Club from Mt Martha Lifesaving Club, where he had been a member for 11 years, to develop further as a competitor.

Rhys has fitted in very well at Point Leo. In the current season he is a Patrol Captain, has joined the Club committee as Social Coordinator, assisted with coaching at the Bronze Camp and previously with the LifeChanger Program. He has competed for the Club with success at local carnivals, at the States and the Nationals and in the Coolangatta Gold.

Over the season he worked as a paid LSV Lifeguard and has volunteered with the Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter Service, becoming a qualified rescue crewman and is training to become a winch operator.

### **The Future**

The Advisory Board will continue to provide financial support to allow younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving. The Foundation will provide grants or funding as Fellowship Grants or as Special Purpose Grants.

The Board is interested to hear from more members about how they can be assisted by the Foundation and will be promoting its work and

opportunities in the lead up to the coming season. It is planned to put together a promotional video and to continue to address participants at the annual Bronze Camp. A permanent clubhouse display of the names of all Fellows is being explored. The Board members will also offer to assist future Fellowship nominees with the content and context of the official nominations.

The Board also agreed that the Foundation would extend its grants program to include contributions to the cost of club members participating in appropriate development activities such as the Somers Camp.

### **Gary Tierney Foundation Governance**

The Gary Tierney Foundation is managed by an Advisory Board. On 30 April 2020, the Board consisted of Tom Mollenkopf (Chairperson), John Horwood, Haydn Tierney, Bella Ford, Kelvin Anderson, Tamara Brawn and Luke Treadwell. During the year one of the long-term Advisory Board members, Ian Knight, stepped down and Luke Treadwell accepted our invitation to join the Board.

The Foundation's Patron is Louise Tierney. Over the past 12 months the Advisory Board has met formally on two occasions and on a number of informal occasions. The Foundation's finances are audited annually as part of the Club's statutory audit and the Foundation maintains a separate bank account to ensure that donations are quarantined and only used in accordance with, and as specified by, the Foundation's Governance Charter.
