

President's Report

The Season

After another challenging year of distance and isolation, it was delightful to see so many smiling faces and to be able to interact with our fabulous membership once again. Although hampered by having limited opportunities to mingle socially once again, there was still a great vibe of activity around the Club and throughout the season. What a great summer we had! The energy, enthusiasm and commitment amongst members to surf lifesaving volunteering and to Point Leo SLSC is extraordinary and has resulted in a level of excellence across all of the Club's operations and programs (and there are many). We have a welcoming, inclusive and joyful place for our members to belong. We also have many leaders; young, old, new to lifesaving and those with years of experience, who inspire and mentor others. I thank you all for the contribution you have made to ensuring our club remains the unique place it is.

Unfortunately, we continued to be impacted by COVID-19, especially at the commencement of the season. With our experience with COVID-19 from last season under our belt, we were well prepared to overcome the many challenges that restrictions bring. Our dedicated Pandemic Team continued to work with LSV to deal with COVID-19 related issues and develop strategies to ensure that we were able to provide programs and operations in a Covid Safe manner.

Our Club's guiding principle was to keep members and the public as safe as possible in the most practical way. Covid Safe plans were prepared and implemented for all sections of the Club. A huge thanks is owed to Tamara Brawn who led the Pandemic Team and devoted an enormous amount of time and energy developing the COVID-19 Management Policy consistent with LSV guidelines for our Club. I also want to thank to all those on the Pandemic Team and

particularly Jason Romari and Tarena Murray, our COVID Coordinators. Tamara and Tarena spent much time contacting the close contacts of known covid cases within the Club. Not surprisingly, this was especially onerous over the period of the JSLP with so many families and children active on the beach.

The season kicked off with lifesaving training and the COVID-19 challenge remained. Brittany Morgenthaler, as Chief Instructor, did another amazing job leading an incredible team of volunteers to deliver SRC, Bronze, other courses and Skills Maintenance sessions in restrictive conditions. Britt is truly dedicated to her role in training and we thank her for her commitment and flexibility in being able to pivot these core programs as needed.

Patrols, once again, ran incredibly smoothly over the season with congratulations and thanks due to our dynamic duo of Club Captain, Romy Lipszyc, and Vice Club Captain, Bridget Barnes. Many thanks also to all the Patrol Captains and their teams in keeping our beach safe and presenting such a welcoming and settled environment. I have been getting to know more of the active patrol members and am so very impressed with your commitment and dedication to keeping the beach safe and welcoming to visitors. Patrol members of all ages performed with maturity and professionalism across the summer, and it was particularly pleasing to see good attendance at patrols. Keeping each other and the public safe at Point Leo Beach is our main priority, and we fulfilled our duties with skill and commitment.

The Pride Patrol on 12 February 2022 was a day to celebrate diversity and inclusion within the Club and broader lifesaving community. Romy Lipszyc is to be congratulated for organising our Pride Patrol in support of our LGBTQIA+ members and community and fostering a welcoming and inclusive culture within our club.

The Pride Patrol was followed by a great turnout for our annual Pink Patrol on 19 February 2022, celebrating the contribution of girls and women to lifesaving. This time we thank Bridget Barnes for the organisation of the pre-patrol celebrations, including a most impressive IRB demonstration rescue.

Swim Classic

It was fantastic that we were able to hold our annual Boxing Day Swim once again, and whilst conditions were challenging, it was a fabulous day and a well-attended swim. Thank you to Simon Merrigan and team, for organising all the work teams that contribute to such a large event and to all those who assisted on the day. The new Surfboat was “christened” and we again appreciate the many friends and our major sponsor, Balnarring and District Community Bank Branch of Bendigo Bank who generously donated the surf boat to our club.

Juniors

After another difficult year, it was heart-warming to see our Nippers finally get on the beach in our Junior Surf Life Saving Program (JSLP). Dianna McKellar led the enormous task of planning the program once again and enabled the return of large nipper numbers, a total of 469.

Dianna, together with Tarena Murray, Sarah-Jo Mason and the huge support team of parents, delivered another successful program in mostly good weather with fine conditions. We certainly appreciate the hard work and many hours put in by the JSLP team, as well as those who assisted in the very onerous set up and pack up, particularly Andrew Welsh and Nick Clarke. Mornington Prime Cuts came to the rescue again in supplying beef sausages to provide sustenance to water safety and for hungry Nippers. This is a significant fundraiser for the Club - so thank you. We are also thankful to C. Fulton Garden and Building Supplies Hastings who supplied the bucket hats that were handed out to deserving Nippers over the course of the program.

The Junior Sunday Sessions leading into the LSV State Carnival followed the intensive JSLP. This program focused on participation, inclusion and skill development. The Junior Surf Sports Program is an extension of the JSLP and Sunday Sessions. It offers Nippers an additional level of training and continues to strengthen and grow with inclusivity. Amber Skehan as Junior Coach led this program and we thank her for her dedication, passion and expertise in giving participating Juniors an opportunity to further their skills, build team spirit, respect and camaraderie.

As we emerge from COVID-19 lockdowns and restrictions, many of us have been drawn to communities like that of our Point Leo SLSC. The 2021-2022 season felt the lingering impacts of the pandemic, however we still sought the best of the summer. Despite some of our favourite events such as Muso Night and youth activities like the Lion's Den Movie Night battling against COVID-19 restrictions and outbreak scares, much of our surf lifesaving lives was able to return to 'normal'. Our Boxing Day Swim Classic was back in action, as was our Presentation Night. Patrols were gradually unconstrained from restrictions, and our committee meetings returned to being in-person. It's interesting to see the marks that the pandemic has left on us; flexible online meetings, elaborate elbow bump greetings, Nippers and water safety streamlining, and we all have a far better appreciation for Tina's burgers – we have survived and conquered a trying time.

This has been my first season as Club Captain, and my figurative skull cap goes off to Bridget Barnes, Vice-Club Captain. Her steadfast dedication, approachable personality and masterful Excel skills have made the patrols and water safety of the season flow as smoothly as they possibly could. I extend my gratitude and thanks to our Patrol Captains – again their flexibility and determination to facilitate a safe beach and welcoming space is highly commendable. While Bridget and I finalised the patrol roster in the middle of a lockdown last year, we've ended the season with *easing* of COVID-19 restrictions that I don't think many of us could envision 6 months ago.

Of course, patrols could not happen without our patrolling members – the bedrock of our surf lifesaving community. It hasn't been easy maintaining qualifications throughout the pandemic, but I thank you for providing your best efforts. Skills maintenance and training continued to be affected by COVID-19, but Brittany Morgenthaler took it all in her stride and got the job done. Training marks a time for all members, especially the youth, to come together and learn valuable skills. Since our Club's training is facilitated and assessed by Point Leo members, members are afforded valuable opportunities of mentoring too.

This has been greatly facilitated by the Lion's Den program, and the keenness of mentors to participate in such roles. Furthermore, as the summer season draws to a close, our training sector is not quietening down. It's exciting to see on the horizon an IRB course in collaboration with other clubs on the Peninsula – an initiative we've been working towards for quite some time.

The inter-club collaboration extends towards some of our social causes too – Dromana SLSC and Portsea SLSC joined our Point Leo SLSC members in the Midsumma Saint Kilda Pride March this year for the first time. This year was our club's third year participating in the march,

and our second year hosting a Pride Patrol - an initiative that has spread across Victorian Surf Lifesaving since the inaugural event at our club last year. While we strive to welcome and celebrate the LGBTQIA+ community within our club and surf lifesaving more broadly, we acknowledge there are still barriers to break down and initiatives to be undertaken in the space.

A huge thank-you must be given to all the patrollers who volunteered on the day either as water safety, in the IRBs or under the patrol tent.

This season our patrol teams also continued the Pink Patrol and Pride Patrol initiatives. Pink Patrol aims to recognise and celebrate the achievements of woman in lifesaving. Gear & Equipment

As a club of more than 1,000 members, Point Leo SLSC is obliged to maintain a vast inventory of equipment in order to meet the club's patrol, training and competition needs. Maintenance of this equipment and purchasing of new equipment follows a familiar rhythm each year. Patrol, rescue and first aid equipment is assessed over the winter months in advance of LSV Gear Inspection in October. Damaged equipment is repaired, obsolete equipment is discarded and replacement equipment sourced. Considerable effort is required to satisfy SLSA prescribed equipment guidelines in order for us to successfully pass Gear Inspection and be well prepared for a season of patrols. Thanks to Andrew Gibson, Andy Nott, Ella Swaney and Morgan Jones for helping in the preparation for this year's Gear Inspection.

Each year new boards are purchased to increase our stock of nipper and senior boards. In addition a considerable amount of time is spent on reviving older boards to provide for an expanding training program. Repair and maintenance of these boards is time consuming and Nick Clarke undertakes the majority of board repairs. This is an enormous task and Nick's generosity is greatly appreciated.

This season we took delivery of a new Kawasaki Mule ATV. This purchase was possible through a generous donation from Bluescope Steel and access to various grant programs. The operational value of having an additional beach vehicle was highlighted throughout the season

Team Manager's Report

It was another season that was threatened to be derailed by COVID-19. Fortunately, LSV were able to navigate the waters and complete a season with only some minor interruptions.

A few false starts saw the early season competitions postponed as we came out of lockdown. This resulted in 4 carnivals back-to-back: the State Endurance Championships, Mt Martha, Jan Juc and Ocean Grove.

Unfortunately, the winter pool lifesaving season was hampered by COVID-19 and eventually the 2021 National Pool Rescue Championships were cancelled in December. In the New Year, our local Anglesea carnival was also cancelled as

case numbers flared and there was a risk that by holding a state-wide carnival, we could spread COVID-19 back to clubs, affecting patrol numbers and other critical club functions.

Our Masters team once again swarmed the beach in orange to be the Champion Club for the 2022 Victorian Masters State Championships. One in six competitors were in a Point Leo cap, amassing 499 points, with Ocean Grove coming second on 197. Congratulations to all who committed to the training sessions leading up to it or tested out the calves for the first time on the day. It was a particularly big weekend from a Team Manager perspective, with many helpers required as our Senior team was also racing on

the Sunday. Thank you Gabby McMeeken, for your assistance as Masters Team Manager.

This season we sent an amazing team of 42 athletes to Warrnambool for a very successful Senior State Championships. Some standout results included our Open Women's Taplin team going back-to-back, Charlie Farrell winning the U14 Board Race, Abigail Morgan medalling in both the U17s Beach Flags and Beach Sprint, our U19 women taking out the Beach Relay and our Open Women claiming Gold and Silver in the Double Ski. Point Leo finished eighth in the club tally.

After months of speculation, Aussies was finally moved from Perth back to the Gold Coast due to WA border closures.

It started off with our Youth team at North Kirra getting some valuable experience by racing, and at times matching it with the best in the country. They represented the club proudly and should all hold their heads high. It's been particularly pleasant watching our Youth team remain consistent throughout the season and show maturity beyond their years. Great people first, great athletes second.

Our Masters were lucky enough to remain at Broadbeach for their Championships, with many placing in finals and pushing so close to medals. Congratulations to Frank Christian and Haydn Tierney who both came away with bronze medals in the 60-64 surf race and 40-45 2km swim, respectively.

The Open Championships were relocated to North Kirra, as wild conditions were forecast throughout the carnival. This proved true, as even the slightly protected North Kirra beach was challenging on the outer bank. Everyone handled and embraced the moment with maturity. It was a superb standout performance

by Harry Atkins in the Open Men's Belt Race with fifth place in a stacked final.

- Thursday Masters and beginners board/ski (numbers between 10-30)
- Thursday Iron including Juniors (numbers between 10-40)
- Friday kayak (numbers between 5-13)
- Saturday Gunnamatta (numbers between 10-20)
- Sunday Masters and beginners board/ski (numbers between 15-35)

The Junior Surf Sports training sessions are described in the Junior Team Manager report. It was exciting to see members from juniors, Seniors and Masters training and racing together. This was epitomised by the Point Leo racing days on Sundays with some epic “all in” Taplin relays. Another big step forward was our members regularly training in solid conditions at Gunnamatta, setting us up for some great results in the surf at States and Aussies.

- Collaboration between coaching personnel and Senior/Junior Team Managers for greater efficiency and synergy exploration;
- Improving promotions and communications to members and the public on the Junior Surf Sports Program, and
- Expansion of the training sessions for less confident Juniors (particularly in the U8-11 age groups).

Masters Report

Masters State Championship

Huge congratulations to all Leo's Master competitors – Victorian champions for the second successive year!

Point Leo finished on top of the leader board with four hundred and ninety-nine points. To put this achievement into perspective the second club on

the board had one hundred and ninety-seven points. A breathtaking result for Leo.

Our tally of seventy-five medals included individual and team events. Thirty gold, twenty-one silver and twenty-four bronze. The team of forty-six athletes were extraordinary across all the disciplines and we had new members join adding to the high calibre of competitors. Credit

to Jon Ford for coaching and bringing the team together and Andrew Gibson for actively recruiting from the bronze courses.

The sea of orange caps was very impressive at Lorne and certainly depicted the strength of the masters team and more broadly our club.

The conditions were incredibly challenging with direct onshore winds and a significant swell on the Saturday. This season again was like no other at Point Leo, with the Junior Surf Life Saving Program (JSLP) yet again, operating under COVID-19 restrictions. The JSLP team consisted of Dianna McKellar (myself) - JSLP Coordinator, Sarah Jo Mason – Vice President Juniors and Tarena Murray - Nipper Representative. The JSLP team worked hard in the months leading up to the start of the season to ensure that “Covid Nippers 2.0” was going to be a success in another COVID-19 climate. With the experience from having a COVID-19 season under our belts, the team focused on planning to ensure the best experience and outcomes could be achieved for our Nippers. It was the changes forced by COVID-19 team in the 2020-21 season that allowed for the program to continue to try different structures and deliver the program differently.

It was another tough year for families, and it was great to see our Point Leo Nippers finally touch the sand and water in December once again. To see those new Nippers starting their journey in their new orange caps, and glance at the water with a little uncertainty, was a wonderful, familiar sight to see. The weather was very kind to us this season and that allowed for more confidence to be built as the season progressed. COVID-19 positive cases were also minimal as a result of families following our guidelines and the structure of the program. This enabled the Nippers to complete the program to the end, where other clubs were forced to close or cancel sessions.

While Point Leo was not able to have a traditional social gathering and celebration, it did not go unnoticed that this season was the 40th anniversary of Nippers at Point Leo. Thanks to one generous donor and some wonderful sponsors - C. Fulton Garden and Building Supplies and Bluegum Clothing each Nipper was able to receive a 40th Anniversary T-shirt for the season. It was wonderful to see a sea of navy blue t-shirts on the beach and even have one gratefully received by founding Nippers coordinator, Geoff James, in Queensland.

Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club was again one of the biggest programs in Victoria to operate this

season under COVID-19 restrictions. Point Leo welcomed 130 new families to the JSLP with 467 Nippers. The Nippers were able to attend on the same day in 3 sessions for 1 hour with the U12s, U13s and U14s attending for 1.5 hours. Briefings were again not allowed this season and Nippers started straight away on the beach in their designated beach and water areas. The intensive program included 8 sessions in total and included the reintroduction of the Club Championships and Carnival Day. Age groups were able to be placed back into their previous groups of boys and girls. Surf Education was again embedded into the sessions with the U12s attending a Covid Safe face-to-face session on the front lawn and deck area.

The beach areas were marked again with bunting for the 'designated Nipper areas' for each age group as COVID-19 guidelines required. Thank you to all our AGMs and AAGMs for your commitment and time in implementing this amazing program. Congratulations to Rowan Clark and Sharyn Clarke for supporting their U14s to the end of their Nipper journey.

Thank you to our Activity Leaders who kindly volunteered the JSLP their skills, knowledge and enthusiasm. I know our Nippers appreciated your encouragement, support and guidance. Thank you to those who also worked across multiple age groups and offered their experience and support to other AGMs and AAGMs. Planning and engaging Nippers in activities and skills is both rewarding and challenging. Many Nippers feel more confident when they see a familiar face each session and build a connection to another member of the club. Thank you all for your contribution.

COVID-19 again meant that our beach set up and pack up involved more equipment than in previous years, especially with more beach areas operating on the same day. This could not have been done without the preparation and support of Andrew Welsh our Gear Steward and Nick Clarke. Both ensured that the Nipper boards and equipment were ready for the season ahead and led our parent volunteers in the beach set up and pack up each day.

There is an enormous amount of administration work behind the scenes of the JSLP. I would like to acknowledge the hard work before and during the season of Felicity Perry, Sarah Somogyi, Alex McManamey and Nadia Crescia. Without you all we would not have our volunteer rosters set up online, our attendance sheets, our filing sorted, our certificates written and our data entered. Thank you for providing your skills and giving your time.

I would like to acknowledge Kim Williams who tirelessly worked the 'click and collect' uniform shop to ensure our Nippers had all their uniform needs in very challenging conditions, often operating out of the gear shed and courtyard door throughout the season. Thank you to Natalie Johnstone, Mel McPherson, Sandra Williams and Amber Phillips for their assistance in the shop.

Junior Team Manager's Report

Like all club operations the Junior Surf Sports program was affected by COVID-19 across the whole 2021-22 season. Thankfully LSV were proactive and responsive in dealing with COVID-19 issues enabling a reasonably full carnival season to proceed.

There were some difficulties finding a Junior Team Manager so I stepped into the role to support the Junior Surf Sports program. Kylie Clark provided me much support and guidance for which I thank her. In addition, Kim Laity completed all carnival entries which was a great help. Over the season we developed and refined the systems underpinning the Team Manager role with the goal of making the process easier in future. This included identifying "Competition Age Group Managers" committed to promoting surf sports competition and attending all carnivals. This initiative proved very successful in generating engagement in competition. Tarena Murray has agreed to be Junior Team Manager for season 2022-23 with support provided by Kim Laity, the Comp AGMs and myself, which is a great outcome!

The following carnivals were attended (in order of occurrence) with the number of Point Leo SLSC entries (based on Sports App data) listed

1. Ocean Grove SLSC – 17 entries
2. Mount Martha LSC – 19 entries
3. Cosy Corner (Torquay) – 91 entries but carnival cancelled due to weather
4. Point Leo SLSC – 100 entries
5. Mordialloc LSC – 81 entries
6. Lorne State titles – 54 entries

It was a fantastic result to get such high numbers of entries, particularly after the disappointment of Cosy Corner being cancelled. The increase in engagement from U8-U10 with carnivals was particularly pleasing. State Titles numbers were significantly affected by COVID-19 with many late withdrawals as well as the three day program structure (with a late change mandating many of the events move to Friday due to weather). One thing surf sports teaches is flexibility and agility in the face of change that you can't control!

The Junior Surf Sports Program (JSSP) training sessions for 2021-22 were held from October 2021 to States in March 2022 with most participants being in the U11-U13 age groups. These sessions with approximate numbers included:

- Tuesday board (numbers between 10-40)
- Thursday iron in conjunction with senior iron (junior numbers between 10-20)
- Sunday board/swim (numbers between 10-50)
- The Sunday Sessions following the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP) three week intensive were very popular (typically 60-80 participants) with Senior/Masters Surf Sports competitors providing the majority of the coaching
- A small number of “building confidence” sessions were held in December 2021 and February 2022 designed for less confident and/or younger age groups

The Thursday iron sessions in particular were a major highlight with up to 50 competitors from Juniors/Seniors on the beach training hard in their transitions from water to beach; coached by senior athletes including Caleb Gray, Bella Austin and Harry Atkins.

A fantastic initiative of LSV/SLSA was the inclusion of U13 competitors in Senior Surf Sports carnivals during the season and also at Aussies enabling teams to be formed with U14 competitors.

States were held at Lorne with some solid surf and a modified program. Point Leo SLSC came a respectable seventh after a number of late withdrawals due to COVID-19 and the program changes. Full results can be seen on page 46 but commendations to Oscar Skehan, Claudia Kogler, Max Alekna, Luca Phillips and Patrick Benson for accumulating significant points in the individual State Champion results with Oscar winning the U13 Boys Beach Championship!

Special mention to the following Gold medallists at States: March Past Team, Oscar Laity U11 flags, Oscar Skehan U13 board and the U13 male board rescue team.

Also many thanks to all the club representatives from the committee and JSLP program who have supported the JSSP. The coaches of the JSSP (Luke Skehan, Amber Skehan, Darius Alekna, Tim Farrell and Chris Watt) also put countless hours in supporting the development of surf skills; thank you!

If you want to support your junior children in surf sports there's nothing better than getting your Bronze, joining the Masters training program and competition team and helping out with JSSP coaching and water safety; good for fitness, fun and role modelling!

Looking forward to a bigger and even better 2022-23 in the Junior Surf Sports Program.

Gary Tierney Foundation

The Past Twelve Months

For over a decade now, the Gary Tierney Foundation has provided support to the Club's young members, to allow them to pursue their lifesaving interests. It has been a pleasure to continue this work over the past year. The Advisory Board was excited to offer two Gary Tierney Foundation Fellowships, continue its financial support to recent Fellows, and make financial contributions to the younger team members attending Aussies in Queensland.

Outgoings on grants and subsidies exceeded income by \$3,065 (before allowing for changes in the value of the Foundation's investment with the SLSF Surf Rescue Fund). This small cash operating loss is not of concern to the Advisory Board, having regard to the long-term position of the Fund and the overall strength of its Balance Sheet. At year end, the Fund balance was some \$250,000, which exceeds the initial target corpus of \$200,000.

The Foundation has continued its conservative approach to fundraising with income being sourced only from donations and interest received from cash investments. The bulk of its funds are invested in term deposits, but historically, 1/3 of the fund was invested in a balanced investment account with the Surf Life Saving Foundation (SLSF). While not recognised as income for the purposes of the financial summary, the Foundation's balance sheet has benefited from unrealized gains in the SLSF Rescue Fund investment of some \$6,500 for the year.

Gary Tierney Foundation 2022 Fellows

Fellowships were awarded during the year to two extremely worthy recipients, Romy Lipszyc and Harry Atkins. As in past years the standard and

quality of the young active members in Point Leo SLSC is reflected in both nominations.

Romy joined the Club in 2005 at the young age of 8 and since then been engaged in all aspects of lifesaving. Romy has multiple lifesaving awards and has always been keen to pass on the knowledge gained by taking a leading role in SRC and Bronze camps and Nippers surf education programs both as a trainer, and an assessor. Her patrol record has been outstanding particularly as Patrol Vice-Captain and as Patrol Captain. In 2021 Romy received her 10 Year National Patrol Service Award. She has served on the Club committee since 2017, taking on the roles as social media officer, the Mine Editor and Vice-President – Communications. This year she took on the role of Club Captain.

Romy has been leader in encouraging the Club and club active members to become involved in new aspects of lifesaving such as RUOK, Pink Patrols, Pride Patrols and continues to be active in the LSV Female Leadership Network and the LSV Mentor Program. Her infectious enthusiasm is always evident, whether on the beach, in Club fundraising or social functions.

Harry became a Nipper in 2006 and was involved until 2012 when he left the Club to concentrate on his schooling. He re-joined in 2018 and over the past four years has been very active in lifesaving and competition activities for Point Leo. He is an excellent swimming competitor and has been active in passing his attributes to other club competitors and the public. He has been a swim station leader in the Club's Nipper program and a swim leader in the "Lions' Den" Youth Swim Camp as well as assisting primary schools, including Somers and Hastings, with their surf awareness programs.

Harry has a proud record as a competitor representing the Club, has been the Club Swim Captain for the past 3 years and last year was named the winner of the inaugural John Marshall Swim Competitor of the Year. He has joined the Club's coaching program and his objective now is to improve his ski and board skills so that he can play a greater role in improving the Club's competitive standards.

Both Romy and Harry have clear visions about the future direction of the Club particularly regarding lifesaving and community participation on the beach at Point Leo and both are willing to share their plans with other members and lead by example. Romy and Harry received their 2022 GTF Fellowship Awards at the Club Presentation Night held at the Flinders Hotel on 11th December 2021.

Financials

As of 30 April 2022 the Gary Tierney Foundation Fund balance stood at \$253,093, an increase of \$3,626 over the prior year. Income was \$7162 from donations and bank interest. Outgoings amounting to \$10,066 comprised \$7,200 in Fellowship Grants, \$2,800 in subsidies to younger club competitors attending the SLSA National Championships in Queensland, and sundries of \$36.

The Foundation's long-term investment of \$70,000 in the Surf Life Saving Rescue Fund was valued at \$96,977 as at 30 April 2022, an increase of \$6,500 since 2021. This increase reflects the relatively positive performance of global financial markets despite ongoing impacts on the economy of COVID-19. The Advisory Board continues to monitor this investment closely. The balance of funds invested of \$155,925 is with the Bendigo Bank in cash and in term deposits at prevailing market rates of interest.

The Advisory Board will continue to provide financial support to allow younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving. The Foundation will provide grants or funding as Fellowship Grants or as Single Purpose Grants. Since its inception, the Fund

has disbursed over \$70,000 in grants while growing its capital base, giving the Board confidence that its work will continue for many years.

Gary Tierney Foundation Governance

The Gary Tierney Foundation is managed by an Advisory Board. During the year, the Board consisted of Tom Mollenkopf (Chairperson), John Horwood, Haydn Tierney, Bella Ford, Kelvin Anderson, Tamara Brawn and Luke

Treadwell. The Foundation's Patron is Louise Tierney.

The Foundation's finances are audited annually as part of the Club's statutory audit and maintains a separate bank account to ensure that donations to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with and as specified by the Foundation's Governance Charter.

master plan (by Cox Architects), and has been successful in gaining critical grants including from the Federal Government and Lifesaving Victoria for the Stage 2 works. This will allow us to tackle some major issues, which have been split into 'internal' and 'external' works. The proposed works are summarised below.

Internal works – began construction in June 2022

- Providing a multipurpose room that can be used for training courses, meetings, group presentations and as a 'youth hangout' space, with dedicated multimedia equipment and storage for training furniture
- Relocating the caretakers room to the North East corner of the clubhouse, to free up much needed space in the more 'active' part of the clubhouse adjacent to the First Aid room

Detailed design has been completed by Cox Architects in close consultation with the Club committee and the Club's training and youth

leaders. We have now secured funding, approvals and a builder to begin undertaking the 'internal' works, with works recently commencing. The new spaces will be completed within a few months, and will be ready for members to enjoy for next summer!

External works (estimated date 2023-2025):

- Replacing the existing shipping containers, currently used for storing competition and lifesaving gear, and building an attractive and

environmentally sympathetic storage space

- Better access on the east side of the facility providing direct access from the carpark to the changerooms and separating pedestrian and vehicle movements
- New external shower, recreation and barbeque areas

Plans are currently being discussed with relevant agencies (including Council and in the near future the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning), and we are optimistic of in-principle approval. We can then share plans and move to detailed design.

Future Works

We also have an eye to Stage 3 and beyond. The Future Facility plan provided an exciting master concept. We will be simultaneously testing and validating the concept plan over the coming 12 months, drawing on the experience of several other lifesaving facility redevelopments around the coast. We are looking forward to moving forward on this with your support!

The Legends managed a major first aid response to a spinal injury which resulted in a very positive result and an incredibly appreciative patient. On the same day in January 2022, the Legends patrol was audited and received a 1000/1000 points score. An amazing result!

The Legends also undertook another major first aid response to a surfer who had a heart attack on Good Friday. This patient was brought to the patrol tent by off-duty Point Leo surf lifesavers and also resulted in a positive outcome. Throughout the season they attended to many other first aid responses and treated all with professionalism, calmness, and expertise.

Patrols are our core business and the Legends demonstrated that we continue to provide a safe environment to those who visit the beach and continue to provide effective and quality responses to members of the public when required.

Patroller of the Year (Geoff Waters Perpetual Trophy) – Georgia Cassell-Ashton

The Patroller of the Year award is presented each year in recognition of excellence and commitment to patrolling.

This year the Senior Patroller of the Year is awarded to Georgia Cassell-Ashton.

Georgia has made a significant contribution to Point Leo patrols this year by stepping into the role of Patrol Captain and completing 65 hours of patrol and 15 hours of water safety. Georgia has been a professional and committed leader of her Patrol. This season she has volunteered to fill in as Patrol Captain on other patrol teams when that captain was unavailable. She has demonstrated her commitment to public safety by always lending a hand to families needing special access to the beach by helping them with the beach wheelchair or the ATV.

Georgia has taken the time to get to know her new patrollers and help support them and strengthen their skills across the season.

The Junior Patroller of the Year award is presented to a Junior member (U15 - U19) each year in recognition of excellence and commitment to patrolling.

This year's Junior Patroller of the Year is awarded to Charlotte Ashby.

Charlotte completed her Bronze Medallion at the start of the season in incredibly tough conditions. Yet Charlotte displayed incredible resilience to achieve her award and has been a valuable member of her patrol team ever since.

Charlotte has demonstrated a significant contribution to patrol duties across the current season clocking up 44 hours of patrol. Charlotte only missed two of her rostered patrols for the whole season. She has been an enthusiastic and friendly member of her patrol. She was keen to learn more skills on patrol and has completed her First Aid certificate through the Lion's Den program.

Life Saving Victoria Awards of Excellence winners 2020/2021

Emerging Official of the Year – Georgia Cassell-Ashton

As a fairly new technical official (second year) Georgia was selected to fulfill the role of Area Risk Response Officer (ARRO) and was responsible for making sure every athlete that entered the water came back in safely and, in the case of an emergency, was responsible for facilitating the rescue operations for her designated water area. She participated in the safety team at Youth/Senior and Masters State Championships in 2021; both events were particularly challenging given the surf conditions and weather.

Outstanding Achievement of the Year – The Lion's Den (Point Leo's Youth program for 14-15 year olds)

The Lion's Den was developed by our VP Juniors Sarah-Jo Mason to leverage off the U14 program and address the club's issue of engaging and retaining the age group of 14- and 15-year-olds. It is a two-year program that aims to bridge the gap between SRC and Bronze medallion qualifications being attained. The program will support our youth through their lifesaving journey as active, resilient

volunteers vital to the ongoing wellbeing and livelihood of our membership so we can continue to keep our community safe on the beach.

National SLSA Medal for Sustained Service

We congratulate our three Point Leo SLSC members, Andrew Gibson, Michelle Royal-Hebblewhite, and Clayton McDonald who have each been awarded the prestigious Surf Lifesaving Australia National Medal for their sustained service and commitment to Surf Life Saving.

The National Medal is awarded to individuals on behalf of the Governor-General of Australia, His Excellency General of Australia, His Excellency General the Honourable David Hurley AC DSC (Retd).

Established in 1975 as a military recognition award, the National Medal has since branched out into government and voluntary organisations and is now Australia's most awarded civil medal. Other organisations that present the National Medal include emergency services such as Police, Fire and Ambulance services as well as other voluntary organisations such as search and rescue groups and Surf Life Saving.

The National Medal is available to Surf Life Saving Australia volunteers who are eligible with a minimum of 30 hours each season, who have completed a minimum period of 15 seasons, from 1986.

Andrew has patrolled for 24 consecutive years and amassed a total of 1471 hours of patrol. Each season he patrolled for over 30 hours thereby meeting the criteria for the National Medal. Most seasons he completed over 50 hours. In two seasons he completed over 80 hours.

Clayton has completed over 1283 hours of patrol since he started patrolling in the 1979/80 season. He has completed 30 hours or more of patrol for over 20 years which meets the criteria for the National Medal for sustained service to Surf Life Saving of 30 hours of patrol for 15 years since 1986. In 6 of those seasons, he patrolled for more than 50 hours.

Michelle has patrolled for 18 consecutive years at Point Leo for a total of 1019 hours. In 15 of these years Michelle completed over 30 hours of patrol thereby meeting the criteria for the National Medal. In two of these seasons, she was also patrolling at Bonbeach SLSC completing 136.75 hours in 2007/2008 and 122.25 hours in 2008/2009.

We are fortunate to have these three outstanding volunteers at our club who continue their selfless commitment to Surf Lifesaving. They are incredible leaders, role models and absolute veterans of the Club.

Congratulations again Andrew, Michelle and Clayton, this Award recognises your remarkable contributions, and we thank you for your service to our community.

Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of preparation

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is a not-for-profit entity. In the opinion of the Committee, Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is not a reporting entity as its users may request the financial information they need. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared for distribution to members and for the purposes of fulfilling the reporting requirements under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

These special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2021 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management.

New and amended standards adopted by the Association

The Association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the Association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Property, Plant and equipment

Property (buildings), plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(d) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(f) Right of Use Asset

A right-of-use asset is recognised in relation to the concessionary lease of the land upon which the Association's Club House operates. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the remaining unexpired period of the lease or the useful life of the asset, whichever is shorter.

(g) Revenue and other income

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors. Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Goods and services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(i) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(k) Impairment of assets

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(l) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

(m) Comparative information

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

(n) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.
