These works also provided the club with an upgrade to our fire safety systems, increased capacity for training, a flexible meeting space for members and community groups and more inclusive and accessible facilities. We welcomed many of our club and Life Members as well as sponsors and key donors, to this event. Thanks to Luke Treadwell for leading the

# Club Captain's Report

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How fantastic it has been to see our club and community in full swing over the past season! No longer at the whim of COVID-19 lockdowns or restrictions, we entered the 2022-23 season in full force. We were able to see the regular SRC and Bronze courses, as well as Nippers and surf sports, and were able to enjoy the likes of Muso Night and our End of Season Celebrations. I'd like to particularly remark on the Boxing Day Swim Classic; with huge swells, a high tide and many of our members working off Christmas lunch, we were truly put to the test.

Congratulations to Chris Oldham and the whole team who spear-headed the Boxing Day Swim Classic chaos – a major success story!

Our high standard of patrols and water safety carried on throughout the season, with several hefty and complicated rescues putting our skills further to the test. While we don't wish misfortune on our Point Leo visitors, it is always pleasing to see a rescue carried out by our extraordinary teams. I'm consistently in awe of the commitment and decision making brought to the beach by our patrolling leaders – it's a great marker of our club's health to have some thirteen patrol captains, who bring with them a variety of motivations, past experiences, and expertise, as well as 'their people' from the club, creating a diversity of patrolling members on the shores of Point Leo. It's exciting to see the roll-out of LSV's new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain's award, which three of our members have already attained. I encourage all patrolling members, regardless of age, confidence, or role on patrol, to undertake this course, which is proving to produce great leaders and critical thinkers.

Speaking of awards, we had another huge season of training and assessment, headed by Brittany Morgenthaler. Joyously, SRCs and Bronzies no longer were split into bite-sized groups for COVID-19 reasons. I'm always inspired to see the consistent collaboration between the Lion's Den and the training sector, with the annual First Aid course for this group of young members, extending their knowledge, skills, and confidence. Training and Skills

Maintenance bring together many aspects of our club, much like patrols providing opportunity for members of all facets to work together, as well as providing pathways for eager members to take. Keep an eye on the horizon for more courses coming your way over the winter, a perfect opportunity to upskill in Advanced Resuscitation or IRB. These qualifications have afforded many of us immense opportunity (and fun) beyond the lifesaving world, so I encourage you all to take every chance you get at our club to see where you can go!

Our inter-club collaborations continued from the winter IRB course in 2022, with another IRB course in January amongst other initiatives. It's great to see the Peninsula clubs working as one, especially as each of us have achievements and issues from time to time – sharing the load is always a relief. Social issues that play an important part in our wider community also continue to be pushed by Point Leo SLSC and neighbouring clubs, creating a safer and welcoming space for all beachgoers, no matter where they visit.

She has always been on time with completing her patrol logs and helped create a fantastic team atmosphere on her patrol by preparing yummy lunches for them. He has been flexible and adaptable with patrol dates and was a massive help to Romy and myself when organising the patrol roster around the very busy competition calendar. Together with these three new captains, we also had three new vice-captains. India and

India and Riley only completed their Bronze Medallion last season; however, they have truly excelled in this role. Charlotte Lillywhite also joined Bella Warner as a fresh new vice-captain. Charlotte has had a busy season balancing working at the Kiosk and patrolling, but she has been instrumental in creating a welcoming environment on her patrol and is always encouraging younger patrollers to come and join in.

While Point Leo has experienced a mainly safe patrol season, some patrol teams did deal with significant rescues and first aids. All patrol members who dealt with first aids this season, whether they were small cuts or suspected spinal injuries, did so professionally and calmly. Notably, Bella Warner's patrol team conducted an impressive rescue of a kite surfer off Crunchies. The kite surfer's equipment had broken in the very windy conditions, and he was floating in the surf with his board awaiting rescue. The IRB Driver for the patrol that day, Giselle Northcote, and her IRB Crew, Zoe Warner, responded to the situation swiftly. Giselle and Zoe launched the IRB and navigated both the shore break and choppy trip around the point to locate the patient before bringing him to shore. All the while Giselle was coordinating with Bella to have the patrol meet them and the patient on the sand at Crunchies. The patient was very grateful for Giselle, Zoe, and Bella's efforts – congratulations Giselle, Zoe and Bella on your incredible rescue!

This season our patrol teams also continued the Pink Patrol and Pride Patrol initiatives. The Pink Patrol aims to recognise and celebrate the achievements of women in lifesaving. This year's Pink Patrol was focused on encouraging younger patrollers to take on leadership roles. On the day of Pink Patrol, the patrol was set up and organised by new SRC and Bronze holders under the watchful eye of some older patrollers. Pride Patrol was another initiative that aims to establish Point Leo as a welcoming environment for members of the LGBTQIA+ community. Despite an unlucky

wet-weather patrol, the Pride Patrol was once again a huge success!



A few false starts saw the Winter Surf Series carnivals cancelled due to lack of competitors crazy enough to enter. This and the lack of COVID-19 left us with a normal season to look forward to: the State Endurance Championships, followed by three LSV-Led carnivals with three club-led carnivals in the mix, two of which were sponsored Summer of Surf competitions. We also had a growing group of athletes competing at the three Beach carnivals at the Melbourne clubs during spring.

The winter months were not lost altogether as we had a very successful Pool Lifesaving season. ## Head Coach's Report

It was amazing in 2022-23 to finally have a season free from COVID-19 restrictions. Thanks to Junior and Senior Team Managers (Tarena Murray and Tim Farrell) for their outstanding coordination of the carnival season enabling the fantastic results described in their annual reports.

Our season for some commenced in winter of 2022 where ski paddlers worked on technique, most members spent plenty of time in the surf and enthusiastic members put some serious time into the pool. As of October 2022, the Junior and Senior Surf Sports Program commenced with gusto with daily sessions catering for Nippers of all ages, Youth (U14-15), Seniors (U17-Open) and Masters. All disciplines were catered for including ski, board, iron and a distance run session. Swim and gym training was conducted independently by members with Flyers being a popular choice for squad swimming. We continue to look for coaches to conduct beach sprint and flags sessions which was a gap in our program.

It was pleasing to see the further development in confidence and skills of last year's Youth competitors with most of them joining into the Senior board and iron squads (ably coached by Bella Austin, Caleb Gray and Nick Clarke). The Junior Surf Sports Program sessions (coached by Chris Watt) on developing capabilities were also very well attended and over time members of this group progressed to the U11-13 squad (coached by Luke Skehan). Fantastic to see Justin Phillips take the initiative in running board/iron sessions for competitors living in Melbourne and we hope to expand this offering next season. Our ski paddlers in town also trained in the Mercantile Kayak Club squad and swimmers at the Melbourne Grammar squad. Darius Alekna also coached the endurance running program with good numbers attending. A final shout out to the Masters squad, many of whom trained with Seniors, with others participating in the sessions commencing in January and running three times a week until the State Titles. It was amazing to see the development in this group which led to Point Leo

comfortably winning the Masters State Championships for the third year in a row. The exploits of our Masters team at Aussies are described below. Many of these Masters are coming back to share their learned skills by coaching our younger members.

We have already completed a survey of surf sports participants and had our season review meeting. Our strategic plan linking with the club's overall strategy is in the final stages of development. Some of the initiatives being discussed include modifying the existing programs with:

- A mentoring program for competitors and a simple buddy system to assist with goal setting, training feedback and carnival support being developed;
- Addition of new coaches from the Masters ranks to support the existing coaching structure;
- A Sunday and Saturday session to support competitors with various commitments on the weekend;
- A stronger focus on endurance in late winter/early spring with the Endurance carnival as a key event;
- A Cup Day craft camp run locally to follow up on the Sunshine Coast board camp;
- Iron sessions to start after Cup Day with earlier season sessions working in the Martha Cove canals;
- With Aussies confirmed in surf for the next 10 years a strong focus on surf skills development (particularly Saturday session);
- Masters sessions on the weekend to support competitors (particularly females) attending Aussies for the first time;
- Development ski for the group of youth coming through U14-17 to develop skills in technique and surf; and
- Offering flat water kayak opportunities for those wanting to compete at state, national and potentially international level.

Thanks to all the people who helped to make this season a great success particularly water safety, IRB, officials and trailer drivers. As our Surf Sports program continues to grow we will need

more helpers and there will be opportunities for officials and IRB training over the off season. Also, many thanks to all the club representatives from the committee who have supported the Surf Sports program. Thanks to the coaches of the Junior and Senior Surf Sports Program (Chris Watt, Luke Skehan, Nick Clarke, Caleb Gray and Bella Austin) who put in countless hours. If you want to support your children in surf sports there's nothing better than getting your Bronze Medallion, joining the Masters training program and competition team and helping out with coaching and water safety; good for fitness, fun and role modelling!

- Female Senior Athlete of the Year 2023 - Bella Austin for again dominating States in individual and team events;
- Male Junior Athlete of the Year 2023 – Charlie Farrell for a solid Aussies performance in teams and individual and an amazing States resulting in second place in Men's Water rankings for U15. Charlie also finished ranked fourth in board at the interstate Summer of Surf Carnivals;
- Female Junior Athlete of the Year 2023 – Miranda Aumont for coming first in U15 2km run and first in U15 1km teams at States;
- Team of the Year 2023 – Frank Christian, Tim Farrell and Jon Ford for winning the 170+ Team Surf Race and third in 170+ Taplin at Aussies. An incredible result;
- The John Marshall Swim Competitor of the Year 2023 – Tim Farrell for coming second in the 50-54 years 2km swim, fourth in the 50-54 years Surf Race and sixth in the 50-54 years iron in addition to the team results at Aussies. A breakout year;
- Masters Award 2023 – Frank Christian for again dominating State Masters competition and winning gold in 65-69 2km swim (for the first time in his long competitive career) and second in the 65-69 surf race at Aussies;
- Board and Ski Competitor of the Year 2023 – Oscar Skehan for coming tenth in the

board final at Aussies and a strong season of carnival results over the year; and

- Beach Competitor of the Year 2023 – Abi Morgan for her State results of second in

U17 Beach Sprint and a strong season racing at most State carnivals

## Members & Club Life

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### Junior Surf Life Saving Program (JSLP)

The JSLP team consisted of Tarena Murray, Dean Pullar and Sharyn Clark with support from the junior subcommittee, which was new this year. The team worked hard, with a lot of collaboration behind the scenes in planning this year's JSLP. Without the restrictions of COVID-19 we were able to plan a program which incorporated components from the last few years that worked well, whilst also trying new ideas for the structure of the JSLP in 2022-23.

An initiative of Jane Starr was the introduction of the Starfish Nipper program. Starfish Nippers is a lifesaving skills program designed for young people 6 years and above with a disability, including physical and intellectual disabilities and learning difficulties. Starfish Nippers is a modified and structured Nipper program which promotes inclusion and diversity. It features modified Nipper beach and water activities such as games, running, beach flags, wading, swimming and boards as well as activities with the club's age group Nippers.

The JSLP program involved nine intensive sessions from late December 2022 to mid-January 2023. The program aims to focus on developing skills, confidence, and knowledge in a safe environment. Nippers learn about survival skills in an aquatic environment, basic first aid, resuscitation and rescues as well as practising the lifesaving disciplines of beach running, flags, board paddling and swimming in a fun and friendly environment. The JSLP also included a Club Championship Day and a Carnival Day. Surf Education was again embedded into the sessions with most groups also having the opportunity to meet the lifeguards and have a Q&A with them. Each age group had their own beach area; however, water areas were shared to accommodate having specialist water area activity leaders as well as sufficient equipment.

The JSLP aims to encourage our younger members to stay involved with our Nipper program once they have become "Youth members". It was great to see some of these kids take on leadership opportunities to work with our more experienced activity leaders. We hope to grow this mentor program in the future and keep all our members connected (old, young, competitors, patrollers etc.) as well as allowing our Nippers to meet some of our past Nippers!

The JSLP season started off with a gorgeous sunny and warm day, and in fact we were blessed with great weather and conditions for the entire program. It was wonderful to see so many orange caps and smiling nippers on the beach (all 467 of them), with family and friends able to watch on and support them. In its first year the Starfish Nipper program started with three amazing recruits. Jane Starr embraced this initiative with all her enthusiasm, and all involved thoroughly enjoyed the experience. I am excited to see this program grow and flourish in the future. We had 47 new U7 Nippers on the beach this year. With the help of the AGMs, Junior Club Captains and activity leaders, the U7s enthusiastically embraced beach flags, poison ball, octopus, wading, duck diving, board paddling and quickly gained all the skills, confidence, and knowledge a Nipper needs to be safe on the beach and in an aquatic environment.

The U14 program was extended to a two-hour session this year. Largely lead by Darius Alekna and supported by the AGMs, with the focus being on stretching their boundaries, increasing surf awareness, and exposing them to what else happens in a lifesaving club. The U14 cohort worked as a large group of boys and girls together. They got to experience surfing at Second Reef, briefed on crewing an IRB, tried ski paddling and surf boat rowing, and paddling the SUPsquatch. A great achievement was every U14 Nipper completed “the triangle” 1km swim – proving what they can all achieve physically and mentally. They also got to complete lots of mixed gender races. As part of the U14 Nipper program, they had the opportunity to attend SRC camp. Once achieving their Surf Rescue Certificate, they were able to complete their first patrol all together. Without COVID-19 restrictions, the Pizza and Movie night was back on the agenda. A great night for all at the Club.

### **JSLP Volunteers**

A huge thank you to all our Age Group Managers (AGMs) and Assistant Age Group Managers (AAGMs) and Activity Leaders (ALs) this season. A special mention to Cath McCraith in her

fourteenth year as an Activity Leader – you are a superstar and invaluable to our program! The JSLP are very fortunate to have so many dedicated and experienced volunteers. I greatly appreciate all your hard work and flexibility during the JSLP and the willingness to do anything I ask (especially at the last minute).

The AGMs and AAGMs put a huge amount of time and energy into managing and supporting our Nippers and their families. Not to mention making each session fun, encouraging even the most hesitant Nipper, and celebrating the big and small wins with kind words or with a “Nipper of the Day” award.

fitting that the first year of operation of the Gary Tierney Foundation had been bold, aspirational,

and successful beyond expectation. I felt it was “fitting” because the man in whose name this foundation has been established was a person of vision and action. Gary Tierney made things happen.

I am pleased to report that again this past year, the Foundation has maintained this momentum, enhancing the visibility of the Foundation and growing its impact for the benefit of the Club, its members, and the surf lifesaving movement. This year saw the largest number of Fellowships ever being awarded, ongoing financial support to recent Fellows, and special grants to assist younger team members attending competitive and developmental activities as well as Aussies in Perth.

Each of the Foundation Fellows is awarded an annual payment for three years to assist them with their lifesaving activities (covering costs of travel, equipment, or other financial needs). ‘Aussies’ grants help with the cost of travel and accommodation for younger competitors. Details of the recipients of special purpose grants are not publicly disclosed for privacy reasons, but an overall accounting of payments from the Fund is listed below.

## **Gary Tierney Foundation 2022 Fellows**

The Board was excited to award Fellowships during the year to four outstanding young Club members, each of whom contributes to lifesaving in different ways. In addition to their leadership roles and projects, collectively they have recorded over 1,000 patrol hours and almost 270 hours on water safety.

### **Bridget Barnes**

Bridget joined the Club as a Nipper in 2007, and is now Club Vice-Captain, highly respected for her active and inclusive role in the Club, supporting and helping members. She is an excellent trainer, well organized, prepared to engage with all groups and great supporter of social causes and environmental issues. Bridget also competes with the Plovers boat crew (see the Boat Section report for details of the crew’s great competitive season.)

### **Ella Swaney**

Ella has been with the Club since 2011 and is highly regarded by all Active members for her mentoring role, particularly with young female members. Ella has been a Patrol Captain, a Club trainer, a joint Club First Aid Officer, and is currently Vice-President Communication. Much like Bridget who she works very closely with, Ella is highly organized, particularly in the area of planning for the future. Ella volunteered on behalf of LSV during the pandemic, learning how to drive an ambulance in order to support the State’s paramedics at that very difficult time.

### **Myles Irwin**

Myles joined the Club in 2013, and quickly became active patrolling, in the ensuing ten years clocking up around 400 patrol hours, often filling in for members who are unable to make it to the beach. ### Financials

The Foundation aims to provide grants and bursaries drawing on donations and income generated from investments, while maintaining the Fund's capital (corpus). Again, this year it has been able to achieve a largely break-even result, while seeing some small improvement in the Fund's overall balance due to unrealized capital gains the long-term investments.

Income over the year was \$14,735 from donations and bank interest. Outgoings amounting to \$14,650 comprising \$10,800 in Fellowship Grants, and \$3,850 in Special Purpose Grants or subsidies to younger Club competitors attending the SLSA National Championships in Perth.

The Foundation's long-term investment in the Surf Life Saving Rescue Fund was valued at \$100,707 (2022 \$96,978), an increase of \$3729 over the year. This increase reflects fluctuating, but overall positive returns in an ongoing dynamic global investment market. The Advisory Board continues to monitor this investment closely. The bulk of the Foundations funds, \$156,201, is invested with the Bendigo Bank in cash and term deposits at prevailing market rates of interest.

As at 30 April 2023 the overall Foundation Fund balance stood at \$256,908 (2022 \$253,093), an increase of \$3,815.

### The Future

The Advisory Board will continue to provide financial support to allow younger members of Point Leo SLSC to fulfil their potential in surf lifesaving. The Foundation will provide grants or funding as Fellowship Grants or as Single Purpose Grants. Since its inception, the Fund has disbursed approximately \$85,000 in grants while growing its capital base, giving the Board

confidence that its work will continue for many years.

After a break in social activities and active fundraising in recent years, the Advisory Board is planning some additional activities over the coming season that will contribute to the vibrancy of the Club and the value of the Foundation.

### Gary Tierney Foundation Governance

The Foundation’s finances are audited annually as part of the Club’s statutory audit and maintains a separate bank account to ensure that donations to the Foundation are quarantined and only used in accordance with and as specified by the Foundation’s Governance Charter.

### Point Leo Swim Classic

This season saw a return to almost pre-COVID pandemic numbers for our Boxing Day Swim.

All up we had 504 registrations across all events, with a big surge of interest coming in the week before the event. We had to close registrations on the day to make sure we didn’t push the upper limits of our safety and risk organisation. The breakdown of registrations for the event were as follows:

## President's Awards

### Dick Catterick Award – (Best Club Member) – John Gallagher

*This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding all-round contribution during the season. Presented in memory of the late Dick Catterick who was the Clubhouse caretaker/supervisor in the 1970s and 1980s.*

John Gallagher joined the club in 2013 as a parent of nippers and has since become increasingly involved in making invaluable contributions to Point Leo SLSC across several areas of the club. John has been a member of the committee since the 2018/2019 season and took on the role of Secretary in 2020/2021. He was nominated involuntarily for the role of secretary and really had little opportunity or time to consider the decision. But in true John style, he undertook the challenge, and we as a club are all the better for it! John devotes much time to being secretary and continues to develop in his role providing his skill and expertise to both the Committee and the Executive Committee.

John, with his legal background was instrumental in preparing the current constitution and continues to provide constitutional and other legal advice to the committee. John is committed to good governance and ensures the committee adhere to good practise. John is also a member of the ongoing building sub-committee and has been an excellent sounding board in the ongoing process of the works, especially given the hills and mountains during the pandemic.

John is insightful and provides considered and compassionate perspectives to club issues. He operates in a calm, confident and consistently positive manner. He is always supportive of others.

Many committee members, I included, turn to John for his support and measured advice. John is a truly genuine person with a real affection for our club and our community's vibrant and diverse life.

### **President's Award (Senior) – Tarena Murray**

*This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more Club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct.*

I congratulate another legend Tarena Murray on being the recipient of the President's Award. A bit of background on Tarena, she joined the club as a very young nipper whilst camping at Point Leo as a with her family.

Tarena was a strong advocate for females within the lifesaving movement. During the 80s and early 90s, she was a member of one of the first women only RnR teams in the state and country.

Whilst always retaining her membership, she has become more involved again in recent years as her children are now young nippers. She jumped back in the boat as a member of our Female Masters Crew and continued to support the Bobba's, as one of the volunteers at the Bobba's brunch earlier this year!

Our Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP) had over 460 nippers this season. This is a massive and intense program and requires significant organisational and management skills and whilst we have strong volunteer support from parents to support this program, parents are reluctant to take on the major roles of Nipper Coordinator, Nipper Representative and Junior Team Manager.

Tarena Murray volunteered as Nipper Representative again this season and has been in this role for several years through the challenging years of COVID-19. She has done an exemplary job in this role, overcoming many issues. This season, as well as performing the duties of her role, she also undertook most of the tasks of the Nipper Coordinator. The JSLP was only possible due to the many hours dedicated by Tarena to ensure that the program went smoothly.

Last season and this season, no one volunteered for Team Manager, a role that is necessary if we are going to have a competition team represent Point Leo SLSC at Junior Carnivals. Tarena, wanting to support Junior Competition and realising the implications of not having a Team Manager, agreed to also to take on the role of Junior Team Manager. Tarena has done an incredible job in this role, reinvigorating interest in competition demonstrated by the strong numbers attending carnivals, particularly local carnivals.

Tarena has dedicated an enormous amount of time, energy and focus to our Junior Programs. She has assisted in creating a positive and collaborative environment amongst the Junior program subcommittee. She does it all with confidence, warmth, and a sense of humour. I imagine at times she was stressed but she certainly did not show it! She always remained calm and handled the tasks at hand effectively and efficiently. Thank you, Tarena, for all that you have done for our Junior Programs. You truly embody the spirit of Point Leo SLSC.

### **President's Award (Junior) – India and Riley Mair**

*This award recognises a Junior member (U15 – U19) who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more Club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct and demeanour.*

It is with great pleasure, that this year the award goes to two very remarkable young people, India and Riley Mair. It is rare to award two people an award, but it was impossible to split the twins and their incredible contribution to Point Leo SLSC. India and Riley's involvement with surf lifesaving began as young Nippers. Observing older kids who assisted them, they were determined to give back to the Junior Program by doing water safety, encouraging, supporting, and helping the next group of young surf lifesavers as others had done for them. And they have done that and more.

India and Riley attained their Surf Rescue certificates in 2019 and achieved their Bronze Medallion in 2021 which was a very challenging time to undertake this course as it was during COVID-19 restrictions.

India and Riley have also been an incredible support to the Junior

Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP). Throughout the JSLP season, India and Riley have been a valuable member of the water safety team; demonstrating effective leadership with the young SRC and Bronze Medallion members.

India and Riley are both consistently looking to develop their skills and have attained their IRB crew award and ARTC. India also has her Silver Medallion Patrol Captain Award. Unfortunately, Riley could not attend at the time but is looking to upskill next season. They are strong communicators and excellent role models for the younger patrollers.

They have both dedicated so much time and energy to our club and do so with quiet confidence and with a delightful demeanour being warm, friendly, and unassuming. I look forward to watching India and Riley develop as leaders and as club members in the future.

## Major Award Recipients

### Club Captain's Award – Chris Oldham

*This award recognises a member whose contribution to club operations demonstrably enhances the development of lifesaving at the Point Leo SLSC or whose commitment to patrol operations, training and education, youth and leadership development or the Junior Lifesaving Program has excelled.*

Chris achieved his Bronze Medallion in the pre-COVID-19 era of 2018, with additional qualifications following quickly in the years to come. Since then, over a mere 5 seasons, Chris has volunteered a total of 201.9 patrol hours, and 84.5 water safety hours.

What sets Chris apart, is not only his individual achievements, but his commitment to working as part of a team. Chris has been particularly helpful as a sounding board for both club and life matters.

Chris' dedication and care for the club goes beyond his patrolling and water safety hours. He has recently become the club's IRB coordinator, and is integral to the Nipper program from this perspective. Chris not only contributed immensely in the coordination of water safety for the junior surf lifesaving program, but also ensured that members were welcomed and invited into the boats, and were well cared for in this area of our club. Furthermore, Chris' involvement as an official since 2019 has been crucial in the smooth running of carnivals and other competitions.

The Boxing Day Swim Classic was an incredible success last year, and Chris's leadership of the event was phenomenal to observe. There was something so calming about standing with Chris watching those huge shore breaks rolling in, as he would count the seconds between the waves and give a little nod each time his prediction of whether the IRB would make it safely through or not. Of course, not a single IRB flipped or was damaged under the guidance of Chris, which I think is a huge testament to his leadership and mentorship.

Chris' contributions extended even further, as he currently holds the position of Safety and Risk Officer on the Aquatic Sport Executive Committee. He is continuing to look for more, and is on his way to becoming one of our club's trainers and assessors.

Chris' dedication, passion and unwavering commitment to our club and community makes him a most deserving recipient of the Club Captain's award. His achievements inspire us all, and serve as a shining example of the difference just one person can make.

## Outstanding Achievement – Starfish Nipper Program

*This award recognises outstanding achievement(s) or contributions in any sector of club activity during the current season.*

Starfish Nippers is a modified and structured Junior program for all abilities that runs alongside a club's Junior program and focuses on beach and water awareness and safety.

Giselle was able to radio back to the patrol captain, Bella, to have other patrollers meet them around at Crunchies where they carefully returned the patient and his equipment to shore. The patient was incredibly grateful for Giselle and Zoe's skilful rescue.

**Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies**

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

**Basis of preparation**

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is a not-for-profit entity. In the opinion of the Committee, Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc is not a reporting entity as its users may request the financial information they need. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared for distribution to members and for the purposes of fulfilling the reporting requirements under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

These special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2023 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management.

**New and amended standards adopted by the Association**

The Association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

**Basis of preparation**

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the Association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

**(a) Property, Plant and equipment**

Property (buildings), plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

**(b) Inventories**

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

**(c) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

**(d) Income tax**

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

**(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables**

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**(f) Right of Use Asset**

A right-of-use asset is recognised in relation to the concessionary lease of the land upon which the Association's Club House operates. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the remaining unexpired period of the lease or the useful life of the asset, whichever is shorter.

**(g) Revenue and other income**

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors. Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

**Grant income**

Grant revenue is recognised in profit or loss when the company satisfies the performance obligations stated within the funding agreements. If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before the company is eligible to retain the contribution, the grant will be recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until those conditions are satisfied.

**Capital grants**

Grant income received relating to the purchase of capital items is shown as unamortised capital grant and brought to account over the expected life of the asset in proportion to the related depreciation charge.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**(h) Goods and services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

**(i) Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

**(j) Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

**(k) Impairment of assets**

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

**(l) Current and non-current classification**

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

**(m) Comparative information**

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

**(n) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions**

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.


