Club Captain's Report

The 2025/2026 season has been another highly successful year for our club, and I am incredibly proud of the dedication and professionalism demonstrated by our members in delivering a high standard of lifesaving service to our community.

Throughout the season, our members contributed an outstanding 8,380.26 hours of patrol and water safety service, ensuring our beach remained a safe and welcoming environment for both club members and the many visitors who enjoyed our foreshore. This achievement reflects the commitment of our volunteer lifesavers, who generously dedicated their time and expertise across weekends, public holidays and peak holiday periods.

A significant feature of the season was the continued success of our Pink Patrol, Pride Patrol, and Blue Patrol initiatives. These patrols further strengthened our operational structure while promoting an inclusive, supportive and welcoming club culture. These patrols highlighted the diversity, unity and strong sense of community within our club.

One of the season's major highlights was the delivery of the Boxing Day Swim Classic.

Once again, the event brought together

members, competitors and the wider community for a well-supported day. The day was a testament to the strong teamwork across the Club, with volunteers contributing across planning, water safety, logistics and event management.

Training and member development remained a key priority throughout the season. Members successfully completed a range of essential awards, including Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and IRB qualifications. These awards are fundamental to maintaining our patrol capability and ensure that our members are well trained, confident and prepared to respond effectively in a wide variety of situations.

Our Senior Surf Sports Program also enjoyed a strong and competitive season, with members actively participating in training sessions, carnivals and team events. It has been encouraging to see continued engagement from our senior athletes. The program plays an important role in fostering teamwork, leadership and club spirit, while also providing pathways into lifesaving and higher levels of competition.

The strength of this program is vital to the future of our club and continues to grow each year.

Beyond our beach operations, the Club successfully hosted a Trivia Night, which proved to be a valuable fundraising initiative and excellent opportunity to bring members, families and the wider community together, as well as a

series of JSLP social events. These events played an important role in strengthening club culture, fostering connection and enhancing community engagement.

One of the most significant achievements of the season was the delivery of 1,296 preventative actions. These preventative actions highlight the proactive approach our members take to beach safety and demonstrate the effectiveness of our patrol operations. Through public education, hazard identification and early intervention, our members prevented numerous situations from escalating into more serious incidents.

Throughout the season, our patrol teams also responded to a range of rescues and first aid incidents. These responses showcased the skill, professionalism and training of our members, who continue to uphold the highest standards of surf lifesaving service.

It has been particularly pleasing to see strong participation from members across all aspects of club life. The willingness of members to support patrols, training programs, club activities and operational requirements has been instrumental in the success of the season.

I would like to sincerely thank all patrol members, patrol captains, trainers, assessors, and volunteers who contributed throughout the year, including those involved in the Pink Patrol, Pride Patrol and Blue Patrol initiatives. Vice Club Captain's Report

This season has been an incredibly busy season for lifesaving operations at Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club. The patrol season began on November 15 2025 and finished on April 19 2026, with 52 patrol days in that period. Point Leo beach hosted a 7-day patrol service from the 22 December 2025 to 7 February 2026 thanks to the combined effort of Point Leo patrollers and the Life Saving Victoria Lifeguard Service. It is therefore no surprise, that our members completed 4,309 patrol hours in this season.

In Point Leo SLSC's 71st patrol season, our members continued to provide an incredibly valuable community service. Our patrols supervised approximately 12,430 beach patrons and completed 1,296 preventative actions. The patrol teams completed 24 minor first aids, 1 rescue, attended 3 critical incidents, and provided major first aids to 3 people. Most significant amongst these occurred during the Boxing Day Swim Classic 1.2km swim requiring assistance from a wide range of club members with a vast range of skills and professions. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all those that assisted with this significant incident.

Emergency Call-out team

Another essential operational service Point Leo SLSC provided was an emergency call-out team. This team, formed from a collection of local members with advanced awards, responded to emergency call outs relayed to Lifesaving Victoria from the Victoria Police Rescue Coordination Centre. The emergency call out team responded to two incidents located in Cape Schanck and Merricks, providing valuable assistance to our emergency service colleagues. I would like to thank the members of the call out team and especially those that assisted in these two incidents.

Patrol Captains and Patrol Teams

I would like to thank all of this season's Patrol Captains, each of whom assisted in leading one of the six Point Leo patrol teams. All Patrol Captains have put in a significant amount of time and effort leading their respective teams. At the beginning of the season, many of our Patrol Captains completed their Silver Medallion Patrol Captain (SMPC) award, further contributing to their knowledge and expertise. Without our Patrol Captains and Vice Patrol Captains, Point Leo SLSC would not be able to provide the service we do. I would like to extend thanks to the following members:

Chief Instructor Report

2025/2026 was another highly successful season for our training program. Throughout the season our team dedicated time to deliver high-quality courses for our members. The training team has continued to encourage progress into different lifesaving pathways. It was particularly encouraging to see members continuing into advanced qualifications such as IRB awards, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) and the Silver Medallion Patrol Captains Award (SMPC). The dedication shown by trainers and candidates has resulted in excellent outcomes across all courses.

This season we had the following numbers of new award recipients:

- 50 Bronze Medallion
- 45 Surf Rescue Certificate
- 8 IRB Crew
- 4 IRB Drivers
- 11 First aid
- 13 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques / First Aid

This included a shift away from the traditional hard copy skills maintenance cards to a fully online system run on the Club's iPads. The positive attitude shown across the

Club highlighted the strong culture of teamwork and commitment to maintaining high standards.

A very special thank you must go out to all the instructors, assessors and water safety team who contributed throughout the season. The time, effort, patience and knowledge shared by this group played a huge role in the success of every course delivered. Their willingness to give up countless hours to train and support members did not go unnoticed and was appreciated by the Club and all candidates.

I would also like to acknowledge the enthusiasm and determination of all candidates. Completing these awards requires significant commitment, teamwork and resilience and every member who undertook training this season should be proud of their achievements.

As we look ahead to next season, we aim to continue building participation, supporting members and strengthening our lifesaving capabilities both on and off the beach.

Life Saving Operations

First Aid Report

The contributions that our first aid providers make to the Club could not have been more noticeable this season. In the 2025/2026 season our first aid qualified members responded to 3 major first aids and 24 minor first aids. The most notable amongst these was the sobering Boxing Day Swim death. This was the first recorded death on Point Leo beach involving lifesaving services since the beginning of Point Leo SLSC. With this tragic reminder of the importance of CPR and first aid skills, I encourage all members to obtain their CPR and First Aid Certificates.

I would also like to commend all members who obtained or renewed their First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) or CPR awards this season, as well as those that participated in skills maintenance training for Lifesaving CPR this season. Your participation in training enables us to provide critical first aid support to those in need.

A special congratulations must go to Angus Boyd-Bell and Oscar Skehan who attended the LSV First Aid State Championships and placed 2nd (under 17) and 3rd (Open) in an intense competition that required a large range of first aid knowledge and skills.

Finally, thank you to all those who assisted with first aid this season; without your contributions we would not be able to provide this essential service.

With that in mind, we ask that competitors and their parents take a moment to thank these members for giving up their time when you next see them. Without their effort and sacrifice some of these carnivals might not have gone ahead due to a shortage of water safety resources.

On the JSLP side of IRB, we were again fortunate to have Noah Connell and Joseph Connell helping with setup and pack up. Thank you too to Max Doak, Charlie MacPherson-Smith, Emma May-Konning, Cassie Merrigan and Cooper Lowden for crewing IRBs throughout the JSLP program.

As always, the WoodChucks patrol came through with most of the IRB drivers and crew for the Boxing Day Swim Classic. We were also fortunate to have Rhys Cole, Zali Cargill and Nat Clark operating LSV Rescue Watercraft (RWC), or jet skis, as a great complement to a strong IRB presence.

Patrol support has again proven difficult this season. Thank you to those IRB drivers and crew who answered the call from Nat when patrol numbers were looking thin.



IRB Trainers and Assessors

I am very grateful to Nat Clark, Brittany Morgenthaler and Zali Cargill for leading our IRB crew and driver training this season. These courses have topped up our crew and driver numbers, which has been a real help for patrol coverage. More courses will run over the off season and into the early part of next season. Every Bronze Medallion holder is encouraged to think about gaining their IRB qualifications, particularly if they would like to help out at carnivals or expect to be at carnivals supporting a family member or the Club next season.

JSLP parents are also encouraged to consider taking on IRB training. A great deal of attention goes towards providing officials and setup and pack up crews for carnivals. Those roles all matter, but water safety matters just as much. One advantage of IRB duty at a carnival is that it usually asks less of your time than being an official and you have more control over your time once your shift is complete.

Similar to the support for carnivals that has been noted above, a great number of the current IRB drivers and crew do not have any connection to the JSLP program or junior carnivals. It is incumbent upon JSLP families to be able to support all aspects of the JSLP program and carnival participation. The Club may have to review our JSLP program and participation in junior carnivals if we are unable to meet the appropriate level of water safety provided by

IRBs. I am more than happy to have a chat with any JSLP parents or family members who are interested in completing the necessary awards to be able assist with this. We will also run 'come and try' sessions in the IRBs during the skills maintenance period early next season for JSLP parents who hold their Bronze Medallion.

Facilities Report

Our clubhouse continues to be fit for purpose and has also experienced some major improvements this season. The seaward side has been concreted from the boardwalk to the outside showers, creating wheelchair access around the whole clubhouse, covering the gravel and stabilising the sand at the top of the beach track. This is the most significant improvement to clubhouse amenity in the last several years.

Beach Track

The track was bolstered with mulch on three occasions. This makes all the difference to ATV traction on wind-blown sand. Thank you to Andrew Welsh for his creative work on the pitchfork.

The sand berm blocking the 'Gulch' is building up nicely under the boardwalk bridge after several years absence. This prevents the 'Gulch' flowing in every solid rain, preserving the track.

Fridges

The kitchen, under-bar fridge and upright freezer were replaced this season. Thank you to Haydn Tierney for assisting with these purchases.

ATVs

Our Kawasaki mules are enduring well. The routine of annual rustproofing is significantly extending their life.

Showers

The replacement of taps in the amenities showers has commenced. When complete, this should prevent the showers jamming 'on' and wasting days of water.

Fire Protection

There were no fire alarms or false alarms this year. The system fault beeper continues to be a nuisance but the cost of eliminating it is prohibitive.

White Ants

Ant-eaten floorboards were discovered in the upstairs bar area. Andrew's Welsh and Gibson pulled out all the eaten boards – fortunately the termites had decamped. Sourcing replacement floorboards was problematic. Andrew Welsh eventually traced the right profile in a demolition yard and the repair was completed.

Courtyard Gates

Huge thanks must go to Nick Clarke, who fabricated and installed three new gates on the courtyard. The original timber-clad gates were coming apart and falling off the hinges. The new Colorbond gates are light weight and rock solid and much better at keeping out wind-blown sand.

Working Bee

There were 58 jobs listed for the pre-season Working Bee. 57 of these jobs were completed. This was the most successful Working Bee I have experienced since being in this role. Thank you to all who attended.

Shower window winders

All shower window winders were removed and replaced this season.

Surf Sports

Team Manager and Head Coach Report

The 2025/2026 season was another memorable one for all involved in Surf Sports.

Firstly, a sincere thank you to the Club, officials, water safety, age managers, coaches and volunteers who contributed to what has been an outstanding season for Point Leo Surf Sports. In particular, the Youth/Senior Carnival and Masters State Titles weekend hosted by Point Leo SLSC was a genuine whole-of-club effort, and the results reflected the strength of our culture both on and off the beach.

Point Leo secured the Masters State Championship title for the sixth consecutive year, amassing 751 points, more than 300 points clear of second place. Importantly, after leading strongly in the water events (~500 points), our competitors turned up in force for the beach program to secure the overall win. There were 19 team gold medals and many, many more silver and bronze medals. This depth of podium performance across water and beach disciplines highlighted the breadth of our Master's program, from surf and board to ski and beach events.

The Senior and Youth State Championships showcased the strength of our emerging talent and the progress of our Open competitors. Gold medallists included Oscar Laity (U15 Men's Beach Flags) and Max Alekna (U17 Men's Ski Race). Both Max and Oscar have been training over the past 3-4 years in a high-performance program.

These gold medals were supported by multiple podium finishes across Youth, U17, U19 and Open divisions, including strong performances in Taplin relays, ski relays, board relays and beach events. Notably:

- U17 Men's Taplin Relay – Bronze
- Youth Men's Cameron – Bronze
- U17 Women's Tube Race – Silver (Milla Clark)
- Open Men's Ski Relay – Bronze

Winter presents an excellent opportunity for 12-year-old Junior Surf Sports Program (JSSP) participants to transition into ski and kayak paddling as part of their long-term surf sports pathway. Most of the open men and women's ski finalists at Aussies include kayak paddlers due to the focus of this discipline on technique and water feel. Inclusive beginner ski and kayak sessions will occur throughout winter on Sundays and for the more established paddlers we are training Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings at Martha Cove. These programs have formed the foundation for the success in recent years of our ski section. For board/swim/iron paddlers the best winter program is squad swimming and as much free surfing as you can.

Finally, a huge thank you to all sponsors, particularly Vantage Fuels and Bowser Bean who made these results possible.

Surfboat Section Report

A season of "Expectations".

The 2025/2026 season began with genuine optimism and high expectations across the Point Leo Surfboat Section. With the arrival of three new crews and a renewed sense of momentum around the Club, the stage was set for one of our strongest seasons in recent years — and in many ways, the section delivered.

From the opening rounds of competition, the Open Women's Crew, Point Leo Abyss, stamped themselves as one of the premier crews on the local scene. The Point Leo Abyss crew consistently dominated local carnivals and set the benchmark in the Open Women competition, earning the crew Victorian State team representation at the Australian Surf Rowing League (ASRL) competition in February 2026. Their commitment, professionalism and competitive edge culminated in a well-deserved Victorian State Championship Gold Medal, a reward for an outstanding season.

The Point Leo Windies stepped confidently into the highly competitive Open Men's division and immediately proved they belonged. Their performances throughout the year demonstrated resilience and determination, highlighted by an impressive 4th place finish at the State Championships. Younger members of the crew Riley Williams and Liam Goss achieved U23 Victorian State Team selection at the ASRL competition in February 2026.

One of the defining moments of the season was the arrival of our new race boat, the 'Tamara Brawn'. More than just a new addition to the shed, the 'Tamara Brawn' created exciting opportunities for interstate competition and represented another important step forward for the section.

Both The Abyss and The Windies travelled interstate, making finals and earning prize money against elite competition — an achievement that showcased the growing strength and reputation of Point Leo SLSC on a broader stage.

The local carnival season itself presented plenty of challenges, with cancellations and venue changes disrupting momentum and crew preparation throughout the summer. Despite this, all our crews adapted admirably and continued to compete strongly whenever opportunities arose.

The Master Men's Crew, Point Leo Plato's, season could easily have unravelled following David Higginbotham's (sweep) knee injury, however Brett O'Loughlin (sweep) stepped in and helped steady the crew at a critical point in the year. Their perseverance and experience ultimately paid off in spectacular fashion, claiming Gold in the 220+ Years Masters and Silver in Reserve Men's Grade at the State Championships.

Late in the season, the long-awaited debut of the U23 Women's crew, the Point Leo Flyers, became another major highlight. Under the guidance of Anthony Davis, the crew entered competition for the first time and immediately showed exciting potential for the future. While inexperienced, their enthusiasm and development across the season suggest a very bright future ahead for the boat section.

Unfortunately, not every crew campaign reached the water this season. The DiCaprio's Open Men, along with the Masters Women's crews of the Pandora's and Leo with the Wind, were unable to establish consistent racing programs, due to availability and injury. While disappointing, their efforts and commitment behind the scenes remain appreciated by all and it was great to see they remained part of the broader club culture.

The State Championships ultimately provided a fitting conclusion to the season, with strong performances across multiple divisions reinforcing the depth and direction of the Point Leo program. Medal success, interstate representation, and emerging young talent combined to make 2026 a season the section can be proud of.

A sincere thank you goes to all members of the 200 Club for their ongoing support and donations. These contributions played a major role in the growth of the section. We encourage all donors to come down to training or a carnival and see your names proudly displayed on the 'Tamara Brawn'.

A special thanks must also go to Matey Guerow and Frank Veltman for the countless hours spent transporting boats interstate and assisting behind the scenes as training sweeps and support crew. To Sandra Williams and Paula Matthews for your work as excellent Team Managers, and to Tamara for your insights and guidance as the main carnival referee in Victoria and as Chief Referee at the Aussie Titles. To all, your effort and dedication often

goes unseen, but it is absolutely essential to the success of the Surfboat program, so thank-you.

Future Building Works

Following the successful internal renovation and extension of the clubhouse 7 years ago, made possible through the generous support of the Victorian State Government, Life Saving Victoria, and the Community Bank – Balnarring & District Bendigo Bank, the Club is now embarking on its most ambitious redevelopment project to date.

The previous refurbishment delivered important upgrades, including improved toilets and change rooms, a new downstairs kitchen, caretaker's accommodation and meeting facilities. These improvements have served the Club and wider community well; however, much of the building is no longer fit for purpose. Limited accessibility, no lift access, ageing infrastructure and ongoing issues such as termite damage have highlighted the need for comprehensive redevelopment.



Point Leo SLSC Clubhouse Future Vision Concept

The proposed redevelopment aims to ensure the facility remains a modern, accessible and sustainable community hub for the Western Port region of the Mornington Peninsula. Over the past 12 months, the Building Subcommittee has completed a detailed Functional Brief and

engaged COX Architecture to prepare the Future Vision concept plans. These Future Vision concept plans will form the basis of future planning and funding applications.

To maximise flexibility and align with potential funding opportunities, the redevelopment has been designed as a two-stage project:

- **Stage 1** – Estimated project value of **\$5 million**
- **Stage 2** – Completion of the redevelopment, bringing the total project value to approximately **\$15 million**

Both stages have been carefully designed to retain and integrate the facilities delivered through the 2019 refurbishment, including the caretaker's accommodation, meeting room and other amenities. While completion of both stages remains the Club's preferred outcome, the staged approach allows construction to commence should partial funding become available, while ensuring all future works align seamlessly with the overall vision.

Key objectives of the redevelopment include:

- Creating flexible, functional spaces with the ability to secure and isolate sections of the building during periods of low use, reducing operational costs

- Providing dedicated community spaces while enabling appropriate separation between public users and lifesaving operations
- Incorporating environmentally sustainable design principles and targeting high Green Star ratings to deliver a future-focused facility

Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP)

The 2025/2026 Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP), also known as 'Nippers', season has been another strong and rewarding program for Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club, with excellent participation, leadership development and community support evident throughout the summer.

Program Overview

This season we welcomed 501 Nippers, 9 Starfish Nippers and 1 "Kobe the therapy dog", reflecting the continued strength and inclusiveness of our junior program. The program was delivered across 9 sessions, one fewer than usual due to calendar constraints and a clash with the Cosy Corner/Fisherman's Beach carnival.

The program focused on developing skills, confidence and knowledge in a safe, supportive environment. Nippers learned aquatic survival skills, basic first aid, resuscitation and rescue techniques, while also practising lifesaving activities such as beach running, flags, board paddling and swimming in a fun and friendly setting. The JSLP also included a Club Championship Day, Carnival Day and surf education sessions, both on the beach and in the clubhouse with patrolling members. Overall, the program equips young people with the skills, confidence and knowledge to recognise and enjoy safe beach and aquatic environments.

Volunteer Contribution

The success of the JSLP is built on the commitment of our volunteers. This season the program was assisted by:

- 28 Age Managers and Assistant Age Managers
- 30 Activity Leaders
- A large number of parent volunteers supporting BBQ, First Aid, and Administration duties.

This collective effort ensured the program ran safely, efficiently and with a strong sense of community.

Cassie began her journey with Point Leo through the Nipper program in 2012 and has continued to demonstrate outstanding commitment to the Club ever since. This season Cassie stepped into the role of Vice President – Youth Development, overseeing the Lion's Den program and supporting youth members within the Club's key development age group. This area of the Club plays a vital role in building a strong pathway for the ongoing success and future sustainability of Point Leo SLSC. Youth engagement and retention continue to be one of the greatest challenges facing surf lifesaving nationally.

Cassie's leadership, enthusiasm and ability to connect with and involve younger members throughout the year has been exceptional. Through dedicated summer sessions and by integrating the many activities and opportunities available within the Club, Cassie helped deliver a Lion's Den program that was an overwhelming success.

The positive feedback received from Cadets, parents and the broader club community was outstanding. On behalf of Point Leo SLSC, I thank Cassie for her incredible contribution, dedication and leadership, and congratulate her on this well-deserved recognition and award.

Outstanding Achievement – Jason Johansson

This award recognises outstanding achievement(s) or contributions in any sector of club activity during the current season.

It is with immense pride and admiration that we congratulate Jason Johansson on an achievement that we believe is unprecedented in Surf Life Saving Australia.

Jason has become the first surf lifesaver ever to win a combination of Gold, Silver and Bronze medals across both Open and Masters competition while competing in every State and Territory of Australia, across almost every surf and beach sport discipline. This remarkable accomplishment represents not only sporting excellence, but a lifelong commitment to challenging oneself, embracing new opportunities and inspiring others to do the same.

What makes this achievement even more extraordinary is that it has taken nearly 40 years of dedication, perseverance and passion to accomplish. Jason's journey began at Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club in the 1980s, when he and fellow lifesavers discussed the idea of challenging themselves to compete across the nation, stepping outside their comfort zones and giving every event a go. Throughout his journey, Jason has embodied the values of our club. His achievements this season alone include:

- Gold Medal – Australian Champion, Male Beach Flags (55–59 years)
- Silver Medal – Men's Beach Relay 250+

Jason's contribution extends far beyond competition. His commitment to lifesaving service is equally impressive. He originally gained his Bronze Medallion at Point Leo in 1988 and rejoined Point Leo in 2013, serving as a competitive member and senior IRB Driver. Jason rejoined Point Leo in 2026 following his relocation from interstate and immediately demonstrated his dedication by completing more patrol hours for Point Leo during January, while also patrolling at Alexandra Headland QLD and Lakes Entrance therefore adding to an already significant history of service at clubs around Australia.

On behalf of all members of Point Leo Surf Life Saving Club, I congratulate Jason on his achievements, both in competition and lifesaving service, and look forward to seeing him continue to compete, patrol and inspire for many years to come.

Dick Catterick Award (Best Club Member) – Di Summers

This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding all-round contribution during the season. Presented in memory of the late Dick Catterick who was the clubhouse caretaker/supervisor in the 1970s and 1980s.

There is a well-known quote by American writer James Lane Allen: “Character is revealed when pressure is applied.” This sentiment perfectly captures this year's recipient of the Dick Catterick Memorial Award for Best Club Member, Di Summers.

Di is deeply involved in many aspects of the Club, as a parent of two JSLP participants she quickly immersed herself as an Age Manager and then joined the Junior Surf Lifesaving subcommittee. This committee was instrumental in supporting the huge growth of the JSLP at the time. She has contributed tirelessly as a Masters surf sports competitor, member of the Legends patrol group, activity leader for both Nippers and Starfish Nippers, swim assessments and is one of the Club's leading advocates and experts in child safety and its implementation.

While Di may appear quiet and understated, when challenges arise her strength of character truly shines. In times of crisis, she instinctively steps forward, taking on difficult responsibilities with determination and calm leadership. Her willingness to act and support others in the most serious situations is greatly admired by all who work alongside her.

This was especially evident during the recent summer period at Point Leo, where Di's care, guidance, support and compassion were outstanding.

Di is an integral part of the club community, always willing to assist and encourage members across all areas of club life. She is a highly respected and truly deserving recipient of this year's Best Club Member Award.

President's Award (Senior)– John Gallagher

This award recognises a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct.

John has been a valued member of the Club since 2013, initially becoming involved as a JSLP parent, before quickly immersing himself in the broader operations and community of the Club. Since joining the Club committee in 2017, John has consistently demonstrated a strong commitment to the ongoing success and governance of the organisation. Since 2020, he has held the critical executive position of Club Secretary, a role that is central to the effective operation and administration of the Club.

Bringing with him extensive business and corporate board experience, along with his professional background in law, John provided the Club with a level-headed, pragmatic and solutions-focused approach to governance and decision-making. His ability to navigate the often-complex structure of our committee, the State and local government regulations and the required protocols within the surf lifesaving movement has been invaluable to the committee and wider club operations.

The role of Secretary is frequently one of the most demanding and often thankless positions within any volunteer organisation. From managing the endless stream of correspondence and administrative requirements, to ensuring compliance obligations are met and supporting committee members across a wide range of club matters, John approached every task with professionalism, patience and his trademark easy-going nature. His reliability, structure and dedication provided enormous support to both the executive and general committee. Many of the Club committee members would agree that they could not effectively undertake their own roles without John's ongoing assistance and leadership behind the scenes.

Beyond his administrative contributions, John continues to lead by example as an active patrolling member of the legendary Woodchucks Patrol. Having contributed nearly 400 patrol hours throughout his lifesaving career, his commitment to serving both the Club and the broader community is evident. John's contribution extends far beyond the committee room,

embodying the true spirit of volunteerism, community service and surf lifesaving. It is an honor in my role as Club President to award John the President Award (Senior) for the 2025/2026 season.

President's Award (Junior) – Zali Cargill

This award recognises a Junior member (U15 – U25) who has made an outstanding contribution to the Point Leo SLSC and has demonstrated leadership in one or more club and Life Saving Victoria activities, competitive performance, fostering of team spirit and personal conduct and demeanour.

Since stepping into the role of Chief Instructor this season, Zali has made an exceptional contribution to the development, training, and progression of members within the Point Leo SLSC. Through her leadership and dedication, Zali has overseen numerous existing member requalification's while also mentoring and supporting a significant number of new members through the completion of their lifesaving awards and proficiencies.

Zali is highly respected throughout the Club for her positive attitude, professionalism and approachable nature when working with both members and the wider community. She consistently demonstrated a strong commitment to maintaining high training standards while fostering an inclusive and supportive learning environment for all members.

A standout quality of Zali's leadership was her willingness to continually embrace new opportunities and challenges, while generously sharing her extensive lifesaving knowledge, operational experience and practical skills with others. Her ability to mentor and inspire younger members has made a lasting impact on the Club and has helped strengthen the future capability of Point Leo SLSC.

Recently, Zali was recognised by Life Saving Victoria for her involvement in a rescue at Safety Beach, further highlighting her dedication, calm leadership under pressure and commitment to surf lifesaving both within and beyond the Club environment. This recognition reflected the outstanding character, skill and professionalism that Zali consistently demonstrated in all aspects of her service.

Zali's ongoing contribution to Point Leo SLSC exemplifies the values of surf lifesaving and the spirit of volunteerism that underpins our club, so it is with great honour that I present the President's Award (Junior) to Zali Cargill. I look forward to seeing her continue to play an important leadership role and provide outstanding service to Point Leo SLSC into the future.

Club Captain's Award – Chris Oldham

The Club Captain's award recognises a member who has demonstrated exceptional commitment to the Club across the season.

Chris has been the backbone of the Club this season, delivering exceptional leadership, unwavering commitment and outstanding service. Chris completed 66.19 patrol hours and has been the member the WoodChucks rely on most and the go to figure of support across every patrol in the Club. Few members carry the breadth of responsibility Chris does, holding key leadership roles simultaneously as IRB Captain, Director of the Boxing Day Swim Classic and Water Safety Coordinator for the Junior Surf Lifesaving Program (JSLP), each a demanding role, let alone for many consecutive years and all of them held together.

What sets Chris apart is that his impact has not stopped at the clubhouse door. He has carried that same standard of excellence to the state and national stage, representing Life Saving Victoria on the Surf Lifesaving Australia Safety Development Program Course, sitting

on the Officials Panel and contributing as an observer on the Life Saving Victoria Sports Executive. It is rare for a club member to achieve this level of state and national representation, and it reflects the quality of his judgement and the respect he has earned across the movement.

Perhaps the clearest measure of Chris' influence is his leadership of the comprehensive rewrite of the Life Saving Victoria Safety Manual, a body of work that will shape safety standards for the entire organisation, and his personal delivery of the training to ensure those standards are properly embedded. This is not incremental contribution, it is Chris single handedly driving statewide change while still showing up to patrols, surf sports, JSLP sessions and much more!

Junior Lifesaver of the Year (14-17) – Angus Boyd-Bell

The Junior Lifesaver of the Year was awarded to Angus Boyd-Bell for his major contributions to Lifesaving in the 2025/2026 season. Angus renewed his Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) and First Aid awards this season, leading to him being appointed as the ART operator for Patrol 1 Legends. In this role Angus made meaningful contributions to many minor first aids and a major incident on patrol. Furthering his first aid skills Angus competed in the LSV First Aid State Championships placing in the Under 17 and Open competitions. Completing 43.65 patrol hours this season, Angus is a well deserving recipient of this award.

Youth Lifesaver of the Year (18-21) – Cooper Lowden

The Youth Lifesaver of the Year was awarded to Cooper Lowden in recognition of notable contributions to many aspects of lifesaving operations at Point Leo SLSC in the 2025/2026 season.

At the beginning of the season Cooper was appointed as a Vice Patrol Captain for Patrol 4 'Endless Summer', becoming its Captain by the end of season. Throughout the season Cooper showed impressive leadership, especially during the Boxing Day Swim where he was the Patrol Captain. Completing 91.75 hours of patrol over the season, Cooper showed an impressive commitment to Lifesaving.

Cooper's contribution was not limited to patrols. Cooper completed his Training Officer Certificate this season and made significant contributions to the delivery of the Bronze, SRC and IRB courses in a trainee trainer role. It is for his multifaceted contribution to lifesaving operations at Point Leo SLSC that he is a deserving winner of this award.

Senior Patroller of the Year, Geoff Waters Perpetual Trophy – Amy Jones

Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is an entirely voluntary organisation which provides beach patrol and rescue services, first aid and lifesaving training at Point Leo Surf Beach and surrounds.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of preparation

Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is a not-for-profit entity. In the opinion of the Committee, Point Leo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc is not a reporting entity as its users may request the financial information they need. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared for distribution to members and for the purposes of fulfilling the reporting requirements under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

These special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2026 were approved and authorised for issue by the Members of the Committee of Management.

New and amended standards adopted by the Association

The Association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money value or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise stated.

In the application of the Association's accounting policies, the members of the committee are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Property, Plant and equipment

Property (buildings), plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life of the asset to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are stated in the Statement of Financial Position at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments.

(d) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been made as the Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(e) Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(f) Right of Use Asset

A right-of-use asset is recognised in relation to the concessionary lease of the land upon which the Association's Club House operates. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the remaining unexpired period of the lease or the useful life of the asset, whichever is shorter.

(g) Revenue and other income

Funding for Club activities comes from membership fees, donations and gifts/sponsorships from corporate benefactors. Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable after taking into account any available concessions.

Grant income

Grant revenue is recognised in profit or loss when the company satisfies the performance obligations stated within the funding agreements. If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before the company is eligible to retain the contribution, the grant will be recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until those conditions are satisfied.

Capital grants

Grant income received relating to the purchase of capital items is shown as unamortised capital grant and brought to account over the expected life of the asset in proportion to the related depreciation charge.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method using an appropriate interest rate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(h) Goods and services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(i) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(j) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(k) Impairment of assets

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

(l) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the Statement of Financial Position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when:

- it is either expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

(m) Comparative information

When required by Accounting Standards, comparatives have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

(n) Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the committee of management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other various factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The Committee of management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.
